



ABOUT COLORADO STATE

- · Colorado State enters the tournament with a 29-2 record, which would be the program's best-ever winning percentage if the season ended today.
- The Rams earned a trip to the NCAA tournament for a 20th-straight season by winning the Mountain West for the sixth year in a row. CSU is the only team in the nation to boast six-consecutive conference championships.
- At Moby Arena, CSU is 14-1 on the year, with its lone loss coming to then-No. 4 Wisconsin. Since, CSU has won 10-straight home matches, and dating back to 2011, owns the fifth-best home winning percentage in the country.
- CSU is led by Mountain West Player of the Year Deedra Foss. The senior setter ranks No. 3 nationally with 11.74 assists per set, while guiding the Rams to a .281 attack percentage, which ranks 10th.
- CSU is the only team in the nation to rank in the top 25 for kills, assists, hitting percentage, blocks and opponent hitting.
- Leading the offensive charge is senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds, a member of the All-Mountain West team. Reynolds is averaging 3.11 kills per set.
- · Along with Reynolds, the Rams have three other players who average at least 2.46 kills per set, including junior Adrianna Culbert and senior Kelsey Snider, who were also named to the All-Mountain West squad.
- Defensively, the Rams' strength is their floor defense, led by junior libero Jaime Colaizzi, who earned All-MW Honorable Mention honors. She along with Culbert rank in the top 10 in the conference for digs. Colaizzi's 4.27 digs-per-set average is on pace to finish third in CSU single-season history.
- Junior defensive specialist Kaitlind Bestgen provides the Rams with one of the nation's best serves. She finished second in the MW with 0.35 aces per set.
- Paired with its great floor defense, CSU averaged 2.75 blocks per set during the regular season, helping the Rams hold opponets to .137 hitting, which ranks third nationally.
- · CSU has been ranked in every poll this year, including 12-straight weeks in the top 10. The Rams' have been ranked as high as No. 6, the program's best national ranking in more than a decade.
- Head Coach Tom Hilbert is in his 18th season with the program. The Rams have advanced to the NCAA tournament each season under his guidance, and have won 12 MW regular-season titles since the league formed 16 years ago.

FOLLOWING THE ACTION

Fans can stream all three matches this weekend free of charge through the Mountain West Network. Broadcaster Thad Anderson will provide the play-by-play, with former Rams Lindsey Blahauvietz (Kerr) and Kelly Radcliff (Kerr) adding color commentary on Friday and Saturday, respectively. Anderson has called volleyball matches this season for ESPN, the SEC Network and the Pac-12 Networks. Blahauvietz played for the Rams from 2001-03, while her

SCOUTING DENVER

- · Denver earned The Summit League's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament after winning its conference tournament over IUPUI. The Pioneers also won the league's regular-season title
- The Pioneers enter the tournament with a school-record 27 wins. Overall, DU is 27-6 on the year and has won nine of its last 10 contests.
- DU enters the postseason on a six-match win streak. Following back-to-back losses in September to CSU and Nebraska, the Pioneers rattled off 13 victories in a row.
- DU is led by a pair of sophomore outside hitters in Nola Basey and Moni Corrujedo. Basey leads the team with 3.51 kills per set, while Corrujedo chips in with 3.47 a set.
- As a team, the Pioneers produce one of the best offenses in the country. DU ranks in the top 25 nationally for kills (22nd), assists (25th) and hitting percentage (21st).
- On defense, DU is led at the net by redshirt senior middle hitter Erica Denney, who transferred from Penn State. In 100 sets, Denny has led the team with 0.99 blocks per set.
- Along with Denney, the Pioneers have two other players -- junior middle blocker Sarah Schmid and sophomore middle blocker Ruth Okoye -- who are averaging at least 0.80 blocks per set.
- In the back row, senior libber Kate Acker led The Summit League with 4.47 digs per set.
- In addition to a league-best .267 hitting percentage, the Pioneers held opponents to .178 hitting, also tops in their conference.
- Friday will be the program's first-ever NCAA tournament match.
- DU is coached by Jesse Mahoney, who spent seven seasons on the Rams sidelines as Head Coach Tom Hilbert's top assistant. Additionally, one of Mahoney's current assistants is former CSU libero Katelin Batten (2006-09). Batten is the Rams' career digs leader. CSU associate head coach Brook Coulter spent four years (2007-10) as an assistant at DU.

SERIES VS. THE PIONEERS

CSU holds a commanding 17-2 advantage in the series against DU. After a sweep at home earlier this year, the Rams are now winners of 51 of the 60 all-time sets over the Pioneers. In fact, DU has never won a set at Moby Arena, with all 10 contests resulting in sweeps for the Rams. The Pioneers did beat CSU in 2011 in Denver, however.

In their matchup earlier this year, the Rams showcased a balanced offensive attack, led by a then career-best performance from freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna, who finished with 15 kills on .393 hitting. The Rams hit at a .319 clip while limiting the Pioneers to .130 hitting and 16 errors. Denver, however, played that match without Penn State transfer Erica Denney.

- Over the past three meetings with DU, CSU has hit a combined .355, including .412 in 2013 in Denver. During that match, four current Rams totaled double figures for kills.
- In two career matches against DU, Adrianna Culbert has two double-doubles, averaging 4.71 kills on .500 hitting, plus 3.71 digs. In 2013, Culbert had 23 kills on .512 hitting.
- Over the past three meetings with DU, CSU has hit a combined .355, including .412 in 2013 in Denver
- In four matches against DU, setter Deedra Foss is averaging 12.00 assists per set. She is also posting 0.93 blocks and 0.36 service aces.

SCOUTING COLORADO

- · No. 19 Colorado enters the NCAA tournament as an at-large selection from the Pac-12 conference, finishing tied for fourth in the league's standings.
- The Buffs posted a 19-13 mark in the regular season, giving them the most wins the school has had since 2003.
- CU is led by a potential All-American in senior outside hitter Taylor Simpson. The dynamic outside hitter has moved her way up the school's record book with 4.56 kills per set this season while hitting at a .290 clip. Simpson's 4.56 kills per set rank No. 11 nationally.
- Simpson set the single-season school record this year with 538 total kills.
- Junior outside hitter Alexis Austin compliments Simpson with 3.20 kills per set to provide the Buffs with a dangerous one-two punch. The two were named to the All-Pac-12 team on Tuesday.
- CU sometimes utilizes two setters, with junior Nicole Edelman leading the team with 7.63 assists per set. Freshman setter Gabby Simpson has tallied 4.84 assists per set in 122 sets, while also adding 1.46 kills per set.
- · As a team, CU finished the regular season ranked No. 17 nationally for total kills and No. 24 for total assists.
- On defense, CU's back row is anchored by junior libero Cierra Simpson, who racked up 3.98 digs per set during the regular season. All three Simpsons are related.
- At the net, freshman middle blocker Anna Pfefferle finished eighth in the Pac-12 with 1.08 blocks per set.
- The Buffs have beaten a program-record-tying five nationally ranked teams in 2014 (5-9), including handing No. 2 Washington its first loss of the season on Nov 13.
- CU was 12-4 on its home court, but went 7-10 away from Boulder.
- CU is back in the postseason for the second-straight season. In 2013, the Buffs beat Iowa State before falling at No. 10 Minnesota in five sets. This is CU's 18th trip to the NCAA tournament in its history.

SERIES VS. THE BUFFALOES

CSU holds a 22-11 advantage over Colorado, including six-straight victories. The Rams are 14-4 against the Buffs at Moby Arena, and have not lost to CU at home since 1995. Included in CSU's nine-match home win streak over the Buffs are three NCAA tournament matches. CSU and CU met in the first round of the 2005 tourney - a 3-1 CSU victory - and in the second round in both 2000 and 2001. Ranked in the top 10 both years, CSU beat CU in four sets in 2000, and in five sets a year later, in one of the most memorable matches in program history. Trailing the final set 13-9, CSU went on a 7-1 run to win the set, 16-14, and advance to the Sweet 16 for a third-straight season.

Head Coach Tom Hilbert is 12-2 against the Rams' in-state rival, but the two teams have not met since 2010. During that match, no Rams recorded double figures, but CSU limited CU to .128 hitting in a 3-0 sweep.

SCOUTING NORTHERN COLORADO

- Northern Colorado earned the automatic bid from the Big Sky Conference after winning the conference tournament over Idaho State. The Bears entered the tournament as the No. 3 seed, but didn't drop a set in three matches.
- The Bears enter the NCAA tournament with a 22-10 record and have won 12 of their last 14 contests.
- Junior outside hitter Kendra Cunningham provides a dangerous option for UNC, averaging a team-most 3.16 kills per set.
- Senior middle blocker Andrea Spaustat compliments Cunningham on offense with 2.67 kills per set, while senior middle blocker Brianna Strong adds 2.65 kills a frame. In total, UNC has five different players averaging at least two kills per set
- Sophomore setter Ashley Guthrie is at the forefront of UNC's dynamic attack with 10.66 assists per set.
- UNC finished first in the Big Sky, and ranks No. 37 nationally, with 13.86 kills per set.
- At the net, Spaustat and Strong combine for 2.0 blocks per set. In the back row, junior libero Meagan Garcia posted a team-best 3.91 digs per set.
- Head Coach Lyndsey Oates was named the 2014 Big Sky Coach of the Year. Additionally, Spaustat, Strong, Cunningham and Guthrie were named to the All-Big Sky team.
- UNC is a perfect 5-0 on neutral courts this season.
- The Bears will play in the NCAA tournament for the fourth time in program history, with all four appearances coming in the past six years. CSU and UNC have been in the same sub-regional two prior times, but have never faced each other in the postseason.

SERIES VS. THE BEARS

CSU leads the all-time series vs. Northern Colorado, 19-6, including 14-straight victories. UNC's last victory in the series came in 1982, when the Bears won a 3-1 decision in Greeley. Overall, the Rams are 10-2 at Moby Arena against the Bears.

CSU swept UNC in Greelev earlier this year. led by an 11-kill effort from senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider. Defensively, the Rams were dominant with 13 total blocks. In the match, UNC was held to just .055 hitting and was forced into 24 attack errors.

- · Junior Jaime Colaizzi has made three starts against UNC, earning her first-ever start at libero against the Bears (Nov. 13, 2012). That night, she totaled 14 digs in CSU's four-set win.
- Junior Adrianna Culbert has two double-doubles against UNC, and earlier this fall, totaled a team-most 15 digs against the Bears.
- Senior Deedra Foss has 140 career assists against the Bears (10.77 per set), also tallying a pair of double-doubles.
- Over its past four matches against UNC, CSU is hitting below its average (.235). However, the Rams have limited the Bears to a .041 clip.

HOME COOKING

Since the start of the 2011 season, CSU has been nearly unbeatable on its home court, going 54-4. Only Florida State, Western Kentucky, Penn State and North Carolina have better home records during that span.

Including 2014 (14-1), CSU has gone 20-straight seasons with at least 10 home wins. A pair of wins

this weekend would mark the 12th time the Rams have lost one or fewer home matches in a season.

MOBY MADNESS

A large part of CSU's homecourt dominance is the large crowds the Rams draw. CSU has averaged 2,901 fans per match in 2014, 12th-best in the NCAA and second in CSU history. CSU drew an average crowd of 3,283 in 2013.

CSU has been ranked in the top 25 for average annual attendance each season since the NCAA began calculating attendance figures

in 1986, including the top-10 seven times and No. 1 in 1988.

RECORD-BREAKING CROWD

A program and Mountain West record crowd of 7,018 watched No. 13 CSU take on No. 4 Wisconsin on Sept. 6. The attendance was not only a school best, but just four programs across the nation had larger single-match crowds in 2014. The figure surpassed CSU's previous high of 6,750, set on Sept. 2, 2011 vs. No. 5 Nebraska.

In total, four of CSU's top-five single-match crowds have occurred during the past five seasons. CSU is 7-3 in home matches with at least 5,000 fans in attendance.

| STREAKING AT HOME

The Rams have had tremendous success at Moby Arena, winning nearly 90 percent of their home matches under Head Coach Tom Hilbert. Since 1997, Hilbert's first season in Fort Collins, CSU is 254-30 (.894) at home.

From Sept. 27, 2012 through Nov. 15, 2013, CSU

won 21 consecutive home matches. The streak was tied for the second-longest in program history and was the third-longest active streak in the NCAA at the time. Entering the postseason, CSU has won 10 in a row.

MOUNTAIN WEST DOMINATION

The Rams have dominated the Mountain West since its inception in 1999, going 204-32. Going back to the end of the 2010 season, CSU has won 35 of its past 36 home matches against conference competition, and 60 of 61 against current members of the MW.

TAKING DOWN THE BEST

With large crowds come big wins. At home since 1987, the Rams have defeated nine teams ranked in the top 10, plus more than a dozen additional wins against ranked opponents.

During Hilbert's tenure, CSU has hosted 38 nationally ranked teams, coming away with victories in 25 of those contests, including seven of the last 10 dating back to 2007. CSU's most recent win over a ranked foe at Moby Arena was on Sept. 7, 2012, when the Rams upset No. 12 Pepperdine in straight sets.

Moby Arena has been selected as an NCAA tournament host for the 12th time. Included in that figure is 2008, when CSU was a Regional Finals host. Being selected to play in front of its home crowd is important to CSU; the Rams are 13-2 in NCAA tournament matches at Moby Arena, advancing to the Regional Semifinal (Sweet 16) in nine out of 10 instances.

NOTES

20 YEARS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

For the 20th-straight season, the Colorado State volleyball team will be playing in the postseason. The Rams have earned 26 NCAA tournament berths, including every year since 1995. Just 10 schools have been to more NCAA tournaments than the Rams, and their streak of 20-consecutive appearances in the seventh-longest active streak in the country.

SUCCESS IN THE TOURNAMENT

Not only do the Rams make it a habit of playing in the postseason, but they also win when they get there.

- · 26 overall NCAA tournament appearances
- · 20-consecutive berths
- 17-8 record in the first round, including winning five straight from 2007-11
- 12-5 record in the first round under Head Coach Tom Hilbert
- Nine trips to the Sweet 16, most recently in 2009
- 22-25 all-time record in the NCAA tournament

HOME-COURT DOMINANCE

CSU has one of the most-effective home-court environments in the country, as evidenced by its 254-30 (.894) home record under Hilbert. The Rams went 14-1 at Moby Arena this season, and since the start of the 2011 season, have the fifth-best home winning percentage in the country.

POSTSEASON AT MOBY

The NCAA tournament is coming to Moby Arena for the first time since 2009.

The Rams' selection show watch party erupted when CSU appeared as a host site, and for good reason: CSU is 13-2 at Moby Arena in the NCAA tournament.

The Rams have advanced to the Regional Semifinal (Sweet 16) nine times, with seven of them coming via Fort Collins. In 2009, CSU beat Middle Tennessee in the opening round, before upsetting No. 6 Washington to advance to the second weekend.

A WIN FRIDAY WOULD . . .

- Advance CSU to the second round of the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2011. The Rams are 12-5
 in first-round matches under Hilbert, but have lost in the opening round each of the past two years. CSU has
 never lost three-straight tournament matches.
- CSU would then face the winner Friday's match between Colorado and Northern Colorado. The Rams' secondround match would take place Saturday at 4:30 p.m. CSU beat Northern Colorado in September in Greeley, Colo., but hasn't played Colorado since 2010.
- · Improve the Rams' NCAA tournament record to 23-25 all-time, including 20-17 under Hilbert.
- Improve to 17-2 all-time against Denver, including a perfect 11-0 at Moby Arena.
- Remain perfect at Moby Arena under Hilbert against Colorado's four other Division I programs. Hilbert enters the tournament 45-0.
- Be CSU's 30th win of the season, just the fourth time ever and first since 2003 that CSU has reached 30 or more victories in a season.
- Guarantee at least a tie for CSU's second-best winning percentage in program history. A win Friday would mean CSU can finish no worse than 30-3 (.909).

A WIN SATURDAY WOULD . . .

- Advance CSU to the Regional Semifinal for the 10th time in program history, and first since 2009. CSU's Sweet 16 matchup would take place in Minneapolis, Minn., on Friday, Dec. 12.
- Be CSU's 31st win of the season, second-most ever. The 2000 team won a program-record 32 matches.

- Improve the Rams' NCAA tournament record to 24-25 all-time, including 21-17 under Hilbert.
- Remain perfect at Moby Arena under Hilbert against Colorado's four other Division I programs. Hilbert enters the tournament 45-0.
- Be CSU's 16th home win of the season, which would be third-most in program history. The Rams would finish the season 16-1 (.941) at Moby Arena, their sixth-best home winning percentage.
- [If Colorado wins] Improve CSU's record to 23-11 all-time against the Buffs, including 4-0 in the tournament. CSU owns NCAA tournament wins over Colorado in 2000, 2001 and 2005.
- [If Colorado wins] Be CSU's third win over a ranked opponent this season, the most since 2008.
- [If Northern Colorado wins] Improve CSU's record to 19-6 against Northern Colorado, including its 14th in a row.

OUR STATE

Head Coach Tom Hilbert is 101-20 (.835) against the Centennial State, including 4-0 in 2014.

The veteran coach is especially good at home, though, never losing a home match to a team from the state of Colorado (45-0).

The Rams' last home loss to a Colorado foe came in 1995, to the Buffaloes. All-time at Moby Arena, CSU is 55-5 (.917) against its in-state rivals – Air Force, Colorado, Denver and Northern Colorado.

The Rams most-recently defeated Air Force on Nov. 13, improving to 43-1 all-time in the series. After dropping the initial contest, CSU has rattled off 43-straight wins – including 21 in a row in straight sets. The streak is believed to be the nation's third-longest active win streak against one team.

COLORADO ON THE RISE

For the first time ever, four teams from the state of Colorado are in the NCAA tournament, setting up an all-Colorado sub-regional at Moby Arena.

"This whole thing is great for volleyball in the state of Colorado. This will draw a lot of people in from Denver, a lot of the club players and high school players and coaches. This will be a great weekend. What's good about it too, is that CSU knows how to do it right. We'll be selling tickets right away. Our people know how to do these events right. It'll be first class, and we'll make some money for the NCAA."

SIX-PEAT

For the sixth year in a row, the CSU Rams are Mountain West champions. CSU won its first 11 conference matches and led the league wire to wire en route to the conference title. In the league's 16-year history, CSU has won 12 of the regular-season champion-ships, but had never won six prior to this year. In fact, CSU is the only team in the nation to have won its conference title each of the past six years. Hawai'i had won five in a row entering the 2014 season but finished second in the Big West standings.



FIVE GOLDEN RINGS

The CSU volleyball team has experienced an unprecedented amount of success over the past two decades. In fact, every player who have played four years under Head Coach Tom Hilbert has won at least two conference championships, with all but three winning three or more. The 2014 senior class became three of just five Rams to finish their careers with five regular-season conference championship rings. Michelle Smith became (2009-13) and Katie Jo Shirley-Cahoon (2000-04) are the other two five-time winners.

AMONG THE BEST

With its Oct. 30 win at San Diego State, CSU became the first team in the country to reach 23 victories on the season, and currently at 29-2, is tied for the third-most wins in the NCAA. Additionally, the Rams' .935 winning percentage is tied with Washington for the second-best in the nation, trailing only Stanford (29-1; .967).

Regardless of what happens during the postseason, CSU is guaranteed at least its thirdbest winning percentage in school history.

SUSTAINED SUCCESS

With 20-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament, CSU has established a winning tradition matched by few programs across the country. However, CSU is currently experiencing one of its best periods, winning 57 of 61 matches since the start of the 2013 season (.934) – the best winning percentage in the NCAA during that time period. Previously, the team's best two-year mark was in 1999 and 2000, when the Rams went a combined 62-8 (.886) and went to back-to-back NCAA Sweet 16's. In 2013, CSU finished with a 28-2 mark, the best winning percentage and fewest losses in program history.

ALL WE DO IS WIN

Since 2009, CSU holds an .841 winning percentage, going 153-29. The winning percentage is the fourth-highest in the NCAA during that span, trailing only Penn State, Hawai'i and Texas.

A NEW STREAK

CSU swept Fresno State on Nov. 13, earning victory No. 1 in what the team hopes is another long winning streak. After victories over the final three weeks of the season, CSU will enter the postseason on a six-match winning streak. CSU and DU are two of 20 teams in the tournament who are riding a six-match win streak or more.

The Rams began the season with five-straight sweeps before dropping their first match – to then-No. 4 Wisconsin on Sept. 6. From there, CSU rattled off 18-straight victories to improve to 23-1. It marked the fifth time CSU has won at least 20 matches before losing twice. The 18-match win streak was the fifth-longest in program history and was the fourth-longest active win streak in the NCAA at the time.

RAMS RACK UP ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS

For the sixth-consecutive season, a CSU student-athlete was named the Mountain West Women's Volleyball Player of the Year. Joining Player of the Year Deedra Foss on the allconference team, junior Adrianna Culbert and senior Kelsey Snider earned their second selections, while senior Marlee Reynolds and junior Jaime Colaizzi were picked for the first time. Culbert, Reynolds and Snider were named to the 18-player All-MW team, while Colaizzi was one of six players recognized as Honorable Mention.

In addition to Player of the Year, Foss was the conference's designated setter for the second-straight season. The five selections are the most represented by the Rams since 2009. CSU and UNLV had the most selections in the MW.

In the league's 16-year history, a CSU player has earned the top honor 11 times: Angela Knopf (2000, 2001), Melissa Courtney (2003, 2004), Mekana Barnes(2007), Danielle Minch (2009, 2010), Katelyn Steffan (2011), Dana Cranston (2012), Samantha Peters (2013) and Foss (2014). Foss is the 14th player in CSU history to earn all-conference honors three times throughout her career. Additionally, she was the 2011 MW New-comer of the Year, making her just the fifth player to earn recognition each year of her career.

COLORADO STATE VOLLEYBALL



Deedra Foss | Senior | Setter | McKenna, Wash.

Averaging 12.11 assists per set, Foss was far and away the top setter in the conference, also helping CSU to a conferenceleading .273 hitting percentage. Overall, Foss is averaging 11.74 assists per set (third in the NCAA) and CSU is hitting .281 (ninth). In addition to her assists average and team hitting percentage, Foss averaged 0.85 blocks per set, which led all MW setters. She also averaged 0.64 kills, 2.15 digs and 0.21 aces per set. Foss will finish her career ranked in the top

five in CSU and Mountain West history for assists, including first during the 25-point scoring era. Her 11.22 career assists-per-set average ranks second among active setters in the NCAA with at least 4,500 assists.



Adrianna Culbert | Junior | Opposite Hitter | Delton, Mich.

As one of the most versatile players in the MW, Culbert hit .348 during conference play, the highest among all pin hitters. She also ranked in the top 10 for digs (3.23 per set), the top for a non-defensive specialist. She is the only player in the MW to rank in the top 10 for hitting and digs; she also ranked 17th for kills per set (2.69). In October, she was named the MW Player of the Week and the espnW National Player of the Week.



Marlee Reynolds | Senior | Outside Hitter | Dalhart, Texas As CSU's leading hitter, Reynolds ranked fifth in the MW for kills (3.21 per set), eighth for points (3.58). Her .243 hitting percentage ranked first among all outside hitters, and her 0.69 blocks per set were also first among outside hitters. She was the only outside hitter to average at least 3.00 kills, 0.50 blocks and hit above .200. She had a career-high 21 kills vs. UNLV in October, and earlier in the season, was named the

MW Player of the Week after helping CSU to the Residence Inn Invitational title, including a win at No. 18 Arizona State.



Kelsey Snider | Senior | Middle Blocker | Westminster, Colo. In her second season at middle blocker, Snider led all middle blockers with 2.90 kills and 3.78 points per set. Her .347 hitting percentage ranked fourth, and her 18 service aces were tied for first for her position. She was the only player in the MW to rank in the top 10 in the MW for points (third), hitting (fifth), kills (T-10th), blocks (10th) and service aces (T-4th). She earned MW Player of the Week honors in September after helping CSU to a 4-0 week, including a win vs. No. 9 BYU.



Jaime Colaizzi | Junior | Libero | Windsor, Colo.

In her second season at libero, Colaizzi averaged 4.03 digs per set during conference play, including double figures in 16 of 18 matches. The junior had 14 service aces and just 11 receiving errors – tops among MW liberos. For the season, she is averaging 4.27 digs per set, which would rank third in CSU single-season history.

GOOD ALL AROUND

Once again, the Rams are proving to be one of the top offensive and defensive teams in the nation. CSU is the only team in the nation to rank in the top 25 for hitting percentage, kills, assists, opponent hitting percentage and blocks.

ranks 10th nationally for hitting percentage (.281) while limiting opponents to .137 efficiency (third). The Rams also rank 13th for kills (14.28 per set), 14th for assists (13.33) and 22nd for blocks (2.75). CSU is the only team in the nation to rank in the top 25 for all five statistical categories.

STEADY AT NO. 9

CSU remained steady in the AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll for the fourth-straight week, finishing the regular season at No. 9. Monday marked the 28th-consecutive poll in which CSU has been ranked – tied for the third-longest in program history – and 12th in a row in the top 10. CSU has been ranked as high as No. 6 this season, its highest national ranking since Oct. 29, 2001.

All-time, CSU has been ranked in 265 of 477 polls – 14th in the NCAA – and holds 75 appearances in the top 10 – 18th. For the first time since 2000 and 2001, CSU has been

ranked in the top 10 in back-to-back seasons. The Rams spent five weeks in the top 10 last year, peaking at No. 9. CSU has been ranked No. 6 or better four times (1987, 2000, 2001 and 2014). The Rams' highest-ever ranking was No. 3 in 2000.

FAST START

CSU is 29-2 on the season, but has also won the first set in 29 of 31 matches on the year, including 23 in a row. The last time CSU lost the opening set of a match was to No. 9 BYU on Sept. 12. Despite dropping the first frame, CSU went on to win the match, 3-1.

COMING THROUGH CLUTCH

Through 31 regular-season matches, CSU won 88 of 103 sets, leading to a 29-2 record. While the Rams have been good all around, they have been best when it matters most.

CSU has won nearly 80 percent of its matches decided by five points or fewer (37-10). CSU has also proved that no opponent lead is insurmountable, overcoming deficits of six, seven and nine, and against Nevada, fighting off three set points.

Altogether, CSU has dropped just 15 sets all season. Six of the set losses were by two points, and Arizona State, UNLV and New Mexico are the only teams to beat CSU by more than five points.

20 WINS ONCE AGAIN

A victory Oct. 17 at Air Force gave the Rams their 20th win of the season. CSU has now reached that figure each of the past 20 seasons since 1995. Nebraska (40), Penn State (38), Florida (24) and Hawai'i (21) are the only teams to have longer streaks than CSU.

In 18 seasons under Head Coach Tom Hilbert, CSU has averaged 25.56 wins per season. CSU's 29 wins in 2014 are tied for the fourth-most in CSU history – and the second-most during the regular season.

ROAD WARRIORS

While the Rams are nearly unbeatable at home, they have also found success away from home. In fact, CSU went more than two years without losing a true road match, a streak which led the nation.

After losing to San Diego State on Oct. 25, 2012, CSU won 27-straight true road contests through Oct. 30, 2012. The team's previous best road winning streak was 12 matches. Overall, the Rams have won 29 of their past 30 true road matches.

CLEAN SWEEPS

CSU won 24-consecutive sets from Oct. 4-30, the Rams' longest streak in three seasons and tied for their third-best ever. During the span, CSU swept seven matches in a row (tied for fourth), and on the season has won 22 contests in straight sets. The 22 sweeps ranks third in program history, one shy of second place (2001) and two away from tying the school record (2000).

MULTIPLE NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

On Nov. 25, setter Deedra Foss became the seventh player in CSU history to be named the Sports Imports/AVCA National Player of the Week.


"This is really such an honor," Foss said. "There are so many great volleyball players around the country, so to be mentioned is really special. I obviously couldn't have received this without my teammates. It's exciting and I'm very honored."

The senior from McKenna, Wash., helped the ninth-ranked Rams to a pair of victories, sweeping San José State at home before beating Nevada in straight sets on the road. The victories clinched CSU's sixth-consecutive Mountain West title. In two matches, Foss recorded 13.33 assists, 1.17 blocks and 1.00 kills per set on .500 hitting - all above her season averages. Foss' assists-per-set average was 1.69 per set higher than her season average, which leads the MW and currently ranks third nationally (11.75 per set).

Earlier in the fall, junior opposite hitter Adrianna Culbert earned a similar honor by

espnW. During the week of Oct. 6-12, she averaged 3.00 kills per set on .567 hitting, in addition to 3.83 digs, 1.00 blocks, 1.33 assists and a service ace. She had a team-most 15 digs against a Wyoming squad which ranked ninth in the NCAA for hitting efficiency, and against Fresno State, had a match-best 10 kills on .625 hitting, recording zero errors.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Behind the leadership of a stellar senior class, the Colorado State volleyball team has continued its proud tradition while elevating the Rams to a new level. The three seniors - Deedra Foss, Marlee Reynolds and Kelsey Snider – will play their final match(es) at Moby Arena this weekend.

During their time in the Green and Gold, they have established themselves among the program's all-time greats, becoming three of just a handful of players to win a conference championship in each season.

A look at the numbers:

- 128-23 overall record (.848).
- 78-9 record against Mountain West opponents (.897).
- 68-6 record at Moby Arena (.919).
- Five Mountain West regular-season championships, three of five players in program history to accomplish that feat. The seniors also won the 2011 MW tournament title.
- Five trips to the NCAA tournament, extending CSU's streak to 20-straight seasons in the postseason.
- 57 weeks ranked in the top 25 of the AVCA Division I Coaches poll, including 16 in the top 10.
- · Part of four of the top five crowds in Moby Arena history.
- · Set the best two-year winning percentage in program history.
- Part of the 2013 team which started the season 27-0 en route to a programrecord .933 winning percentage.



COLAIZZI REACHES 1,000 DIGS

Still just a junior, Jaime Colaizzi is setting herself up to go down as one of the program's top liberos. The Windsor, Colo., native on Nov. 13 became the 11th Ram to record 1,000 career digs. Colaizzi, an All-Mountain West Honorable Mention, now sits at 1,066, which ranks eighth in program history. She

is on pace to finish her career in second. Her 4.27 digs-per-set average this season would rank third in CSU single-season annals, while her 3.51 average for her career is second-best.

SETTING THE WAY

Deedra Foss, the 2014 Mountain West Player of the Year, ranks fifth in CSU and MW history for career assists (4,714), including first during the 25-point scoring era. The senior leads the league with 11.74 assists per set, a figure which ranks third nationally. During conference play, her 12.11 assists-per-set average is more than a half of an



assist higher than the next-best setter.

Nationally, Foss has the second-highest career assists-per-set average among all active senior setters in the NCAA.

Foss, a 2013 AVCA All-Pacific North Region and All-America Honorable Mention selection, is again putting up numbers worthy of a select-straight selection. She is one of two setters nationally to rank in the top 10 for assists and lead a offense that ranks in the top 10 for hitting. Among setters in the Pacific North Region (half of the Big Sky, Big West, Mountain West, Pac-12 and West Coast), Foss ranks first for blocking.

The 2011 MW Newcomer of the Year and 2012 All-MW selection is on pace to become the only setter in program history to average at least 10.60 assists, 2.00 digs and 0.75 blocks per set four times.

PRODUCTION FROM THE LEFT SIDE

Marlee Reynolds leads CSU and ranks fifth in the MW with 3.11 kills per set. Followed just behind her is freshman Jasmine Hanna (3.03; sixth). Both have a 20-kill performance vs. UNLV this season, two of just six Rams since 2010 to record 20 kills in a match. The duo averages 6.14 kills per set, the best combo in the MW. CSU and San Jose State are the only two schools with multiple players ranked in the top 10 in the MW for kills; additionally, Kelsey Snider ranks 11th.

During conference play, the two are the only outside hitters in the MW to average at least 2.90 kills and 0.48 blocks per set, while hitting above .200.

POLETTO'S MARK

After missing a month of the season with an ankle injury, true freshman Alexandra Poletto earned a start against New Mexico on Nov. 15 totaling 11 kills on .421 hitting and a team-most six blocks – both figures were one shy of career highs. Since then, she has started CSU's past three matches, and in five career starts, Poletto is averaging 2.76 kills per set on .506 hitting, plus a team-most 1.35 blocks.

On the season, Poletto has 78 kills (1.77 per set) on .441 hitting and 49 blocks (1.11 per set). Her blocking average is on pace to be the fifth-best in CSU freshman history, and her hitting percentage would be a record, but she does not meet the minimum requirement of 200 kills.

THE SWISS ARMY KNIFE

Earlier this season, junior opposite hitter Adrianna Culbert was referred to as the Swiss Army Knife of volleyball. The description is accurate considering she does it all for the Rams. As a versatile six-rotation player, Culbert ranks second on the team for hitting, digs and assists, fourth for kills, and fifth for blocks. She is the only player in the MW to rank in the top 10 for both hitting and digs, and leads all non-defensive specialists with 3.18 per set.

RELYING ON REYNOLDS

Senior Marlee Reynolds is one of the top outside hitters in the MW, ranking third for her position in kills (3.21 per set during MW play) and first for hitting (.243) and blocking (0.69). She led the Rams for kills 13 times during the regular season. On Oct. 2 vs. UNLV, Reynolds had a career-most 20 kills on .500 hitting, committing just one error (20-1-38)

Through the season's first 10 matches, Reynolds was hitting just .196, but following a

six-match period in which she averaged 3.64 kills per set on .341 hitting and was named the Residence Inn Invitational MVP, she turned her season around. Reynolds is the only player in the MW to rank in the top 20 for kills (fifth), points (eighth) and hitting (18th).

HANNA HEATING UP

Outside hitter Jasmine Hanna has made an immediate impact on the program, recording 18 double-figure kills matches and leading the team in that category eight times. Nothing compares to her match at UNLV (Nov. 1), however, in which she recorded 23 kills on .350 hitting. The figure was a career high (her previ-

ous high was 16 vs. No. 9 BYU), but also the most by a CSU true freshman since Tess Rogers (23) in 2002.

During conference play, she ranked fourth, fifth and sixth among all outside hitters in hitting percentage (.207), blocks (0.48) and kills (2.90), respectively. Her 3.03 kills-per-set average overall is on pace to rank third in CSU freshman history.

BOTH SIDES OF THE NET

Senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider is one of the top players in the Mountain West, being the only player to rank in the top 10 during MW play for points (third), hitting (fifth), kills (tied for 10th), blocks (10th) and service aces (tied for fourth). Her season hitting percentage of .374 is on pace to be ninth-best in CSU single-season history.

Among middle blockers in the MW, Snider ranks first for kills, points, digs and aces, and fourth for hitting.

BESTGEN SERVING NAILS

Defensive specialist Kaitlind Bestgen tied for the conference lead with 24 service aces, averaging 0.39 per set. The Fort Collins, Colo., native has 10 multi-ace matches this season, including nine aces in her past five matches. Overall, Bestgen is averaging 0.35 aces per set, the best average by a Ram since Bri Frech averaged 0.40 in 2004.

COUNTING ON COLAIZZI

Junior libero Jaime Colaizzi is averaging 4.27 digs per set, a figure which would rank third in CSU single-season history. During a five-match stretch (Sept. 6-19), Colaizzi averaged 5.05 digs per set, including three performances over 20 and a career-high-tying 25 at No. 18 Arizona State.

She's had 10 or more digs in 26 matches this season, including 12 in a row midway through the year. For her career, Colaizzi has 14 matches with at least 20 digs, second-most among the program's liberos.

DEFENDING THE ATTACK I

CSU held Fresno State to .000 hitting on Oct. 11, the first time since Oct. 5, 2011 that a CSU opponent has failed to hit at a positive clip. In Set 2, the Bulldogs hit -.172 and were limited to just seven points. It was the first time since Nov. 17, 2012 at Boise State that the Rams held an opponent to single digits. In that frame, CSU was a perfect 7-for-7 in siding out, meaning the Bulldogs didn't score in a single point off its own serve. If the match were played prior to rally scoring, CSU would have won the set, 18-0.

DEFENDING THE ATTACK II

Low opponent hitting percentages are nothing new to the Rams, though. Ten times this season, CSU has held its opponent's hitting percentage under .100, including six times during an 11-match span late in the season. On the year, opponents are hitting just .137 against the Rams, which ranks third in the NCAA.

Wisconsin's .312 hitting percentage on Sept. 6 marked the first time a CSU opponent has hit above .300 since BYU hit .353 on Sept. 1, 2012. CSU has been out-hit just four times this season.

GOTTA DIG 'EM ALL

Head Coach Tom Hilbert has said repeatedly that his team's floor defense is the best it has ever been. Wisconsin head coach Kelly Sheffield also praised the Rams, calling them a 'really, really solid team' and 'one of the best defensive teams in the nation.' With three veteran defensive specialists on the court – plus right-side hitter and six-rotation passer Adrianna Culbert – CSU has a strong defensive unit that has played a large part in CSU's 29-2 season.

"This is as good at floor defense as we've ever been since I've coached here, without a doubt in my mind," Hilbert said.

CSU's 14.70 digs-per-set average would rank ninth in CSU history, and would be the team's highest since sets were reduced from 30 to 25 points in 2008. CSU is 26-0 this season when out-digging its opponents.

BALANCED ATTACK

While the Rams lead the Mountain West and rank 13th nationally with 14.28 kills per set, no individual ranks among the top 150 ranked by the NCAA. CSU runs a balanced offensive attack, which includes three players averaging at least 2.96 kills per set, plus another at 2.41.

Eight different players are averaging at least 1.16 kills per set for the Rams, and five have led the team for kills in a match at least once.

BLOCK PARTY

Over the years, CSU has consistently been one of the top blocking teams in the nation, ranking in the top 25 nine times in the past 10 seasons, including five top-10 finishes. With 2.75 blocks per set in 2014, CSU ranks 22nd nationally.

Despite playing just nine matches longer than three sets, CSU has recorded double figures for blocks 13 times, including a season-most 13.5 at San Diego State on Oct. 30. CSU has out-blocked its opponent in 22 matches this season.

EFFICIENT ATTACKING

CSU has hit above .300 in 15 matches and is averaging a .281 hitting percentage – good for 10th nationally. The hitting percentage would rank as the seventh-highest in CSU history.

Three players – Kelsey Snider (third), Adrianna Culbert (ninth), Acacia Andrews (19th) rank in the top 20 in the Mountain West for hitting percentage. Freshman Alexandra Poletto is hitting .441, but does not meet the minimum attacks requirement.

MOUNTAIN WEST DOMINATION

CSU has won 43 of its past 45 Mountain West matches, and overall, the Rams have won more than 86 percent of their MW contests all-time (215-33, .867 winning percentage), far greater than any current or former opponent. With the team's win at Fresno State on Oct. 6, CSU now owns a winning record against each MW opponent.

The Rams reached the halfway point of its conference season on Oct. 23 vs. Boise State, marking the seventh time they have finished the first half of MW play unbeaten.

ELITE TWENTY

Since the Mountain West formed in 1999, the Rams have won 12 regular-season championships in addition to five tournament crowns in nine tries. The figure is more than all other MW teams — past and current — combined.

The Rams also won two HCAC championships in the 1980s, plus the WAC Mountain Division title in 1998, giving them 20 overall conference championships to their credit, more than any other sport at CSU. They have won either the regular-season or conference tournament title – or both – all but two years since 1998 (2005 and 2008).

A QUARTET OF PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

Between Sept. 15 and Oct. 13, four different Rams were named the Mountain West Women's Volleyball Player of the Week. On just two other occasions – Utah in 2006 and CSU in 2007 – has one team earned four honors during a five-week period, and never has it occurred with four separate players. CSU earned its fifth weekly honor of the season on Nov. 24, when Deedra Foss earned her second accolade of the season.

Nov. 24: Foss picked up her fourth-career honor, becoming one of five four-time recipients in CSU history. In two matches, the senior recorded 13.33 assists, 1.17 blocks and 1.00 kills per set, helping CSU win its sixth-straight Mountain West title.

Oct. 13: Junior opposite hitter Adrianna Culbert did it all in victories over Wyoming and

Fresno State, averaging 3.00 kills per set on .567 hitting, in addition to 3.83 digs, 1.00 blocks, 1.33 assists and a service ace. She had a team-most 15 digs against a Wyoming squad which ranked ninth in the NCAA for hitting efficiency, and against Fresno State, had a match-best 10 kills on .625 hitting, recording zero errors.

Oct. 6: Setter Deedra Foss picked up her third career honor after helping CSU to a pair of conference victories against UNLV and San Diego State. She averaged 13.00 assists per set – more than 1.50 above her average – in addition to 2.14 digs and 0.57 blocks per set. CSU's offense hit .362 in the two matches. Foss and Culbert are two of just 10 CSU players to earn three or more MW player of the week honors.

Sept. 22: Marlee Reynolds earned her first career honor after helping CSU to a win over No. 18 Arizona State and the Residence Inn Invitational championship. In three matches, Reynolds averaged 2.91 kills per set on .373 hitting, in addition to six blocks. In the Rams' win over the Sun Devils, the senior had 13 kills on .385 efficiency and against North Carolina Central she hit .562. Reynolds was named the tournament MVP.

Sept. 15: Kelsey Snider, a senior middle blocker, helped CSU to a 4-0 week, including a win over No. 9 BYU in Las Cruces, N.M. In the four matches, she averaged 3.38 kills per set on .383 hitting, also chipping in with three service aces and eight total blocks. She accounted for CSU's final four points during Set 3 of CSU's win over No. 9 BYU, tallying three kills and a solo block to put the Rams up 2-1 in the match. It was CSU's first win against a top-10 opponent away from Moby Arena since 2006.

SET-5 MOMENTUM

CSU made just two attack errors over the first two sets against No. 18 Arizona State on Sept. 19, but the Sun Devils made a lineup change in Set 3 that propelled them to victories in the third and fourth sets to tie the match. Seemingly lacking momentum, CSU took over in Set 5. Senior Kelsey Snider recorded a kill, and then with junior Adrianna Culbert serving, the Rams took the next eight points to jump out to a 9-0 lead. The Rams would go on to win the set, 15-5, and the match, 3-2.

"Never in my career have I seen something like that," Hilbert said. "Nine-point runs are rare, but you certainly don't see that to start a 15-point Set 5."

CSU's only other five-set match of the season also featured a long point run. Leading 5-4 at San Diego State (Oct. 30), CSU recorded the next eight points to take a 13-4 lead. Both five-set matches this season have resulted in 15-5 set victories for the Rams.

ALUMNI WEEKEND

Spanning four centuries, CSU welcomed back 44 former players and staff members for Alumni Weekend (Oct. 24-25). The legends were honored on the court following Set 2 against Utah State.

"It's just awesome knowing all the stories," junior Adrianna Culbert said. "Listening to them reminisce about the time that they were here and how special they found Moby to be. Just to know that you're going through it right now, and that you're a part of something special that so many people come back to because they loved being a part of it is amazing."



Added Hilbert: "This is a place where players have great experiences. You could look at teams that have multiple national championships and they don't have great experiences, because there's more to the experience than how far you advance in an NCAA tournament. That has to do with support, comradery, culture of the team, the fan support . . . those things are huge, and

I think we do a lot of things right. I think it attracts people to come back because they want to come back and feel it again."

FREQUENT FLYERS

CSU's match at Wyoming on Oct. 7 was the Rams' ninth away from Moby Arena in 11 matches. Before returning home on Oct. 2, CSU closed September with three-straight road trips. Despite the time away from home, the Rams had plenty of success, going 8-0, including two victories over nationally ranked opponents.

COLORADO STATE VOLLEYBALL

"I'm extremely proud of my team," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said after his team's win at Boise State on Sept. 27. "Given the circumstances, they went through something incredibly difficult and handled it like a team with a great amount of maturity."

The road trip was tied for the longest under Hilbert. In 2003, CSU also played eight matches in a row away from Moby Arena, going 6-2. Ironically, both times the road trip began on Sept. 12 and concluded on Sept. 27.

800 AND COUNTING

Oct. 4 marked Head Coach Tom Hilbert's 800th career match. The veteran coach holds a 634-180 career record. His winning percentage of .779 ranks 15th in women's volleyball history, and he's one of 10 coaches ever to hold that winning percentage while winning at least 600 matches.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Lasting parts of three seasons, CSU won 16-consecutive regular-season non-conference matches before falling to No. 4 Wisconsin on Sept. 6. Previously, the Rams' most-recent regular-season non-conference loss came Sept. 15, 2012 to No. 2 UCLA. Beginning in 2012, the streak included a 10-0 mark in 2013, and extended into the first two weeks of the 2014 season.

The Rams concluded non-conference play 12-1, defeating two top-20 teams in addition to two teams receiving top-25 votes at the time.

PLAYING THE BEST

In order to prepare the Rams for what they're hoping is a deeper run in the NCAA tournament, Head Coach Tom Hilbert and the Rams strengthened their non-conference schedule.

"This is one of the tougher schedules that we've ever had," Hilbert said before the season began. "All of our preseason teams are very good and challenging, and I think five or six of them are better than every team we played last year. We could be a .500 team in non-conference and be better than last year."

The schedule remained as good as advertised, but the Rams rose to the challenge, going 12-1 and defeating several top teams. After beating two teams – UC Santa Barbara and Marquette – who were receiving top-25 votes in the opening weekend, CSU suffered its first defeat, Sept. 6 vs. No. 4 Wisconsin. The Rams bounced back, though, upsetting No. 9 BYU on a neutral court and defeating No. 18 Arizona State in Tempe, Ariz. Additionally, conference foes New Mexico and Wyoming have received top-25 votes this season.

Six of CSU's 13 non-conference opponents earned invitations to this year's NCAA tournament: Arizona State (W, 3-2), BYU (W, 3-1), Denver (W, 3-0), Marquette (W, 3-0), Northern Colorado (W, 3-0) and Wisconsin (L, 3-0). Four opponents won their conference championship: BYU (West Coast), Denver (The Summit League), Northern Colorado (Big Sky) and Wisconsin (Big Ten).



DOMINANT IN THE DESERT

With three wins in the Residence Inn Invitational in Tempe, Ariz. (Sept. 19-20), the Rams won yet another tournament championship. CSU took down No. 18 Arizona State on Sept. 19 for their first win on a nationally ranked opponent's home court since 2007. The Rams followed up that win

with a pair of victories the next day, defeating Pepperdine and North Carolina Central in straight sets. Against the Waves, CSU showed its composure by coming from behind in sets 2 and 3, and against North Carolina Central, Head Coach Tom Hilbert was able to rest some of his starters and give some reserves valuable playing experience, including backup setter Crystal Young earning her first career start.

Senior Marlee Reynolds averaged 2.91 kills per set on .373 hitting to earn tournament MVP honors, while freshman Jasmine Hanna and junior Jaime Colaizzi were named to the all-tournament team.

"Our resiliency and our competitiveness has been really great," Hilbert said. "We've

gotten past some pretty adverse situations and have hung with some good teams. I'm pretty excited about where we're at."

FRESH STARTS

Four Rams made their collegiate debuts during the Rams Volleyball Classic (Aug. 30-31), including all three true freshmen and redshirt freshman Jaliyah Bolden.

"I love our entire freshman class, to be honest," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "We've had good freshman classes before, but these girls are all game-ready players. They're not developmental types where we have to get them going before they play in matches. They know the game of volleyball. We've got a lot of options and a lot of depth."

In fact, a true freshman led CSU in kills in five-straight matches from Sept. 5-12. Against Florida A&M (Sept. 5), Sanja Cizmic and Alexandra Poletto each earned starts, combining for 23 kills on .700 hitting. A night later, against No. 4 Wisconsin (Sept. 6), Jasmine Hanna had 13 kills, the first of four-straight contests she led CSU in that category. Over that four-match stretch, Hanna combined for 57 kills, an average of 4.38 per set.

Hanna has started 29 matches this season, and over the past four, both Hanna and Poletto have been in the starting lineup. The three true freshmen account for more than 43 percent of CSU's kills-per-set average.

A GRINDING MONTH

Head Coach Tom Hilbert called his team's trip to Las Cruces, N.M., and El Paso, Texas (Sept. 12-13), the most grinding weekend he's ever been part of in 26 years as a head coach. The weekend began Thursday with the team departing Moby Arena at 4:30 a.m. Their travel day consisted of a layover in Las Vegas, Nev., and a drive from El Paso, Texas, to Las Cruces, N.M., all before practicing. The following day, CSU played two matches – both against 2013 NCAA tournament teams – and following a night of rest, the team woke up early Saturday to drive to El Paso, play UTEP and return home – again with a layover in Las Vegas.

A grinding weekend, without a doubt, but CSU's entire first month of the season was exhausting. The Rams played 10 matches in a 15-day period to open the season, and three times placed three matches within a 26-hour period. The Rams' 13 non-conference matches were played over four weeks. Meanwhile, their 18 conference contests were spread out over 10 weeks.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

Playing two matches in one day, CSU upset ninth-ranked BYU on Sept. 12, followed by a win over host New Mexico State in front of a national-TV audience. Against the Aggies, all three sets were decided by two points, and against the Cougars, two were. In total, all seven sets that day were within five points.

The Rams fought off five set points in the two matches, including in a crucial fourth set vs. BYU when CSU claimed back-to-back points after trailing 24-22 to propel the Rams to a 28-26 victory.

"One of our keys to the weekend was to keep it close and win at the end," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "We played cleaner at the end of sets all weekend, and in result, we went 3-0."

From Sept. 9-20, the Rams won at least one two-point set in each of the six matches following CSU's 3-0 loss to No. 4 Wisconsin (Sept. 6). All sets in that match were decided by five points or fewer, including a two-pointer in Set 2.

'A COURAGEOUS WIN'

CSU's win over No. 9 BYU on Sept. 12 was historic on many levels. It was the team's first top-10 win since 2011, and its first away from Moby Arena since 2006 – when CSU beat No. 9 Utah in the 2006 Mountain West tournament finals. All-time, it was Head Coach Tom Hilbert's 11th win over a top-10 opponent.

"I'm extremely pleased with my team," Hilbert said at the time. "I'm sure a lot of teams look at us and wonder what the deal is. We're not the biggest or most athletic, but these players are fighters. We're winning because of guts and heart."

RECORD-BREAKING CROWD

Large crowds are nothing new to the CSU volleyball program. The Rams have ranked in the top 25 for attendance every season since the NCAA began tracking the category in 1986, including No. 7 in 2013.

COLORADO STATE VOLLEYBALL

On Sept. 6, the program went to new heights, however, drawing 7,018 fans for its match against No. 4 Wisconsin. The figure surpassed the previous CSU and Mountain West record of 6,750 – set in 2011. Just four schools have surpassed the 7,000-fan plateau in 2014 (Washington, Nebraska, Hawai'i and Purdue).

"That kind of atmosphere for college volleyball is awesome," Hilbert said. "It makes me extremely proud to be a coach of Colorado State. We have this kind of turnout, and it genuinely helps us."

On the season, CSU is averaging 2,901 fans per match, which ranks 12th nationally and is on pace to be the second-highest in program history.



SHOWCASING TALENT

Head Coach Tom Hilbert believes that fans of CSU volleyball deserve to see some of the best competition in the NCAA. That's why he continuously brings in some of the top teams to play at Moby Arena. Since 2012, CSU and Hawai'i are the only teams in the NCAA to host two teams which played in the prior season's national title match. The Rams hosted UCLA in 2012 – the defending champions – and Wisconsin in 2014 – the reigning runner-up.

"Our fans are very dedicated and very knowledgeable," Hilbert said. "I like bringing in big-name opponents to challenge our team, but those matches also create a great environment to showcase and grow the game of volleyball. It's a way to reward our fans for their commitment."

AVOIDING THE SWEEP

CSU's loss to No. 4 Wisconsin on Sept. 6 marked the first time in 87 regular-season matches that the Rams were on the losing end of a sweep. Prior to the loss, CSU's mostrecent regular-season 3-0 defeat came Aug. 29, 2011, at No. 17 Oklahoma, and its last at home was on the same date in 2009 vs. Oregon State. During the streak, CSU was on the winning end of 55 sweeps.

NEAR-PERFECT PERFORMANCE

Making her first career start, freshman Alexandra Poletto was terrific on Sept. 5, recording 12 kills and three blocks in a three-set win over Florida A&M. The Toronto, Ontario, native connected on her first 10 swings, and 12 of 14 overall, to record an .857 hitting percentage on the night.

The figure was a CSU freshman record, and the second-highest overall in program history. Only Soraya Santos has been more precise, hitting .882 (15-0-17) in a match at New Mexico in 2001.

STARTING STRONG

The Rams started their 2014 campaign strong, winning their first five matches of the season. It marked the fifth year in a row that CSU won at least its first three matches, and the 5-0 start was tied for the sixth-best in program history. Not only did the Rams



win their first five matches, but each came in straight sets. The 15-set winning streak to begin the season was the second-longest in program history, and the best since 1986.

TOP OF THE TOURNAMENT

With victories over VCU, UC Santa Barbara and Marquette, CSU was crowned Rams Volleyball Classic champions on Aug. 31. It marked the seventh home tournament in a row that CSU has won.

CSU followed the Rams Volleyball Classic championship up with first-place finishes in the UTEP/New Mexico State Invitational (Sept. 12-13) and Residence Inn Invitational (Sept. 19-20). Aside from a 0-3 showing at the 2012 Shocker Volleyball Classic in Wichita, Kan., CSU has been dominant in regular-season tournaments. Since 2009, the Rams are 36-5 (.878), winning 12 tournaments in 14 tries. At home under Head Coach Tom Hilbert – since 1997 – CSU is 72-13 (.847) in regular-season tourneys.



HILBERT IN HOME OPENERS

Head Coach Tom Hilbert improved to 14-4 in CSU home openers on Aug. 30, sweeping VCU to begin the season. The Rams have won their home opener in seven of the past eight seasons, with the past three coming in straight sets.

INTERNATIONAL FLAIR

Seniors Marlee Revnolds and Kelsey Snider were selected to be part of the inaugural Mountain West Global Challenge All-Star Volleyball Team, and the duo competed in Italy and Croatia during a 12-day European excursion over the summer. The all-star team took third place in the 2014 European Global Challenge, with Snider being named to the all-tournament team. It was Snider's secondconsecutive summer competing overseas. In 2013, she was on the BIP/Global Challenge team in China.

In June, associate head coach Brook Coulter served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Girls' Youth National Team. The GYNT is the highest level of programming for players born in 1998 or 1999. The squad represented the United States at the biennial NORCECA Women's U18 Continental Championship in Costa Rica, earning a silver medal.

Additionally, two of the Rams' newcomers this season hail from outside of the U.S. Both have extensive international experience, with Sanja Cizmic (Split, Croatia) winning the 2013-14 HRV National Cup and competing in the 2014 European Cup, and Alexandra Poletto (Toronto, Ontario) earning multiple beach gold medals. She spent part of the summer in Portugal at the U19 World Championships.

MOUNTAIN WEST NETWORK

Fans can stream all three

matches this weekend free of charge through the Mountain West Network. Now in its second season, the MWN – which won a 2013 Emmy Award through the Heartland chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for its technical achievement – has again broadcast the majority of CSU's matches.

The MWN allows CSU volleyball fans to live stream every home match and all conference road matches from their computer, smart phone or handheld device. The service is free of charge, and for home contests, the stream is a high-quality broadcast featuring multiple camera angles and instant replay. Additionally, all MWN streams are immediately archived, and can be re-viewed online at any time. For all streams and video content, please visit www.CSURams.com/videos.

During the 2013-14 academic year, the MWN produced more than 1,500 live broadcasts and 1,100 on-demand videos, reaching 15.1 million unique viewers in 135 countries.

them, along with a cake and balloons, prior to the match; competed in the high jump on CSU's track & field squad during the 2013 spring.

ADDING DEPTH

Hilbert signed two Colorado prep stars to National Letters of Intent in November. Kirstie Hillyer and Jessica Jackson will join the Rams' roster next fall.

"I'm very excited that Kirstie and Jessica have chosen to continue their volleyball careers at Colorado State," Hilbert said. "They're both great athletes, tremendous people and players who will fit in with our program and represent this university well."

Hillyer, a 2014-15 Under Armour Honorable Mention All-American, comes to CSU from Bayfield High School. She recently concluded her prep career, where she helped the Wolverines to four Intermountain League championships. Bayfield never lost a league match, going 32-0 including four trips to the 3A state tournament. In addition to her Honorable Mention All-America selection, which was announced earlier this month, Hillyer was recently named the 2014 Intermountain League Player of the Year. She was a four-time first-team all-league selection and two-time all-state honoree. Hillyer earned four varsity letters in volleyball and was her team's captain as a senior and MVP as a junior.

Jackson was also a four-time all-league and two-time all-state selection. Jackson helped Thomas Jefferson High School to three Denver Prep League titles (2012-14) and a berth in the 2013 4A state tournament – her school's first in three decades. Jackson leaves Thomas Jefferson as her school's all-time kills leader (1,435). In addition to four varsity letters in volleyball, she lettered twice in track. Off the court, she is a four-year academic honor roll student and participates with Unified Sports Program, which helps disabled students compete in sports. She played club for the Colorado Volleyball Association, and was born in Tachikawa, Japan.

RAM FOR LIFE

The winningest coach in Colorado State athletics history will remain a Ram for life. Head Coach Tom Hilbert – who has led the CSU volleyball program since 1997 – signed a new contract in August, keeping him in Fort Collins through the 2018 season. His base salary of \$200,000 puts him among the five highest-paid public-university coaches in the sport of volleyball.

"Colorado State has always answered the bell, and I really appreciate that," Hilbert said. "I want to continue coaching here as long as they'll have me. This really means that Colorado State is my final resting place."



Hilbert also added that the stability will help in elevating the program to a new level.

"Our department is making a statement about how important volleyball is at Colorado State. This is a great program. Kids come here and they look around and they go, 'Wow, volleyball matters at this school. Colorado State is someplace special.' That is what you want to be able to sell. If you're at Colorado State, that's how you're going to beat a bigger school on a recruit. We can show them that it's better here from a support standpoint, because it is."

COLORADO STATE VOLLEYBALL



THIS IS CSU VOLLEYBALL

The Colorado State volleyball program began in 1976, and since has been synonymous with winning and success, averaging more than 21 victories per season and posting an all-time record of 832-386 (.683 winning percentage). The Rams have won 20 conference titles, which is more than any other sport at CSU. The program's success is seen on a national level, and can be broken down into three main categories:

NCAA TOURNAMENTS

The Rams have competed in 26 NCAA tournaments, including 20 straight dating back to 1995. Just 10 Division I programs have earned more overall tournament berths, and the Rams' stretch of 19 consecutive appearances is the seventh-longest active streak in the country.

TOP-25 RANKINGS

CSU has appeared in the final top-25 poll in 16 of 32 seasons since the AVCA began ranking teams in 1982, including five of the past six. Overall, CSU has been ranked in 265 of the 477 all-time weekly polls, which is the 14th-most in the NCAA. The Rams' highest-ever ranking was No. 3, in 2000, and their highest final ranking was No. 6, in 1987. CSU has been ranked in the top 10 a total of 75 weeks – 18th-most in the NCAA – and is one of 24 teams to ever be ranked in the top three.

ALL-AMERICANS

With three All-America selections in the past three seasons, the Rams have had 11 players earn a total of 13 AVCA All-America awards in their history. Just 16 teams across the nation have more All-Americans than CSU. In addition to CSU's 13 selections, the program has also earned 24 AVCA or Volleyball Magazine Honorable Mention selections, plus 44 AVCA All-Region nods entering 2014. **1983** First Round | San Diego, Calif. 

CSU VOLLEYBALL MEDIA POLICIES & INFORMATION

WELCOME! The Colorado State athletic media relations office genuinely appreciates your coverage of CSU volleyball, and looks forward to each and every time it can welcome you to Fort Collins. Members of the office, including youleyball contact Nic Hallisey, director Paul Kirk, assistant directors Danielle Marshall and Danny Mattie, media relations assistant Stuart Buchanan, as well as the team of student-assistants, are available to assist with your coverage. The office is happy to help you however it can. We encourage you to familiarize yourself with the policies relevant to your coverage of the volleyball program, as outlined on this page and the next.

Please feel free to contact Nic Hallisey via phone or email with questions regarding the media policy.

GENERAL POLICIES

- All interviews with any member of the volleyball program, including Head Coach Tom Hilbert, the coaching staff and student-athletes must be coordinated through Nic Hallisey in the athletic media relations office.
- Members of the media are strictly prohibited from approaching any coach, staff member or student-athlete by any means – including text messages, email, phone calls (cell, office or home) or social media, such as Facebook and Twitter – without first approaching the athletic media relations office.
- Regarding unique subject matter, such as human-interest angles, members of the media are welcome to approach the media relations office at least 24 hours in advance with requests to interview any member of the program.

INTERVIEW GUIDELINES

- Interviews, either in person or via telephone, with members of Colorado State's volleyball coaching staff and student-athletes must be coordinated through assistant director of media relations Nic Hallisey.
- Media are asked not to request an individual's personal contact information, including email and cell number, but rather to contact Nic Hallisey.
- Student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews at the conclusion of daily practice sessions. Student-athlete interviews will not conflict with classes, meetings, medical treatment or practice times.
- Interviews are not permitted in the locker room or training room. Interviews will not be granted on match days until following the contest.
 Telephone interviews should be requested at least 24 hours in advance
- and coordinated through Nic Hallisey. All interviews will be processed on an availability basis involving the requested interviewe.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Single-match credentials must be requested through Nic Hallisey in writing at least three days in advance of a match. Approved requests will be mailed or can be picked up in the media relations office or at the match. On days of matches, credentials can be obtained just outside the west side of the Moby Arena court. Media members are asked to enter through the McGraw Athletic Center doors (just east of the Moby Arena parking lot) and follow the ramp on the right down to the court. At the bottom of the ramp, a table will be set up with credentials.

PARKING

- Media parking is available at Moby Arena. Please contact the CSU media relations office to request a Moby Arena parking pass.
- Access to the parking lot will require an "A" permit from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays during the academic year. A limited number of single-day passes are available through the media relations office. Annual permits can be purchased through the Office of Parking Management website: www.colostate.edu/depts/parking.

PRACTICE GUIDELINES

- All Colorado State volleyball practices are open to the media and public, unless otherwise noted.
- During the season, practice will generally run from 12:30-3 p.m. during the week, except on match and travel days. Please note, practice times are subject to change on short or no notice. At times, practice will end early, so please plan to arrive early. Practice will usually take place in Moby Arena, but contact Nic Hallisey for the most updated schedule.
- All interviews must take place after the conclusion of practice. If this is

an issue, contact Nic Hallisey, and the media relations staff will try and accommodate your schedule.

 Media should remain on the sidelines, standing a safe distance from the boundary to prevent collisions. Members of the general public attending practice are asked to sit in Moby Arena upper seating.

GAMEDAY

- Near the end of each home match, the media relations staff will ask those on hand representing the media whom they wish to speak with. Approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of each match, Head Coach Tom Hilbert and the selected student-athletes will be brought to the Coors Auditorium, located in the McGraw Athletic Center, and will be available for questions.
- No student-athlete or coach can appear on a live postgame television or radio interview without permission obtained prior to the match from Nic Hallisey.

GAMEDAY SERVICES

- In-game services include live online statistics and box scores following each set. Notes, transcribed quotes and statistics will be available following the conclusion of the match.
- The media room, which is located just west of the court at the bottom of the ramp connecting Moby Arena and the McGraw Athletic Center, will be open at least two hours prior to the start of a match, and will provide undated notes on both teams, statistics and other information.
- Moby Arena offers complimentary wireless Internet access. Check the media room for access information.

ROAD MATCHES

- We appreciate your coverage, and if you would like to cover the Rams in person during a road match, please notify Nic Hallisey at least seven days in advance to provide ample time to request a credential from the opposing team.
- If you would like to talk to Head Coach Tom Hilbert after the conclusion
 of a road match via telephone, please notify Nic Hallisey prior to the start
 of the match. After the match, a member of the media relations staff will
 call you so you can talk with Coach Hilbert. Student-athletes will try to be
 made available, as well, if requested.

REPORTING OF INJURIES

 At all times throughout the year, Head Coach Tom Hilbert will serve as the sole source for injury information. All questions related to injuries should be directed to Hilbert, and not to any other member of the program, including athletic trainers, doctors, the injured student-athlete or her teammates.

- From the south (Denver): Take Interstate 25 north into Fort Collins. Exit I-25 (exit 268) and head west on Prospect Road. Turn right onto Shields. Moby Arena will be ahead and to your right. Enter the parking lot at the corner of Shields and Elizabeth streets.
- From the north (Cheyenne): Take Interstate 25 south into Fort Collins. Exit I-25 (exit 268) and head west on Prospect Road. Turn right onto Shields. Moby Arena will be ahead and to your right. Enter the parking lot from the corner of Shields and Elizabeth streets.

CSU sweeps VCU in season opener

Reynolds leads Rams with 13 kills; 4 players make debut

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – No. 18 Colorado State kicked off the 2014 volleyball season with a bang, sweeping VCU – 25-18, 25-16, 25-12 – Saturday afternoon at Moby Arena.

The win improved the Rams' record under Head Coach Tom Hilbert to 14-4 in home openers.

Senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds was the star on offense, recording a match-most 13 kills on .407 hitting.

"The beautiful thing about her is that she doesn't give stuff away," Hilbert said. "That's maturity, and that's what we need. I'll take this any day from her."

In the Rams' past three home openers, Reynolds has produced 33 kills on .483 hitting (33-5-58).

"I felt like I started in a rhythm," the senior said. "I felt really good. Deej (Foss) was feeding me balls and our defense was plaving well and our serve-receive was plaving well."

Five others players had at least four kills in the win, including true freshman Jasmine Hanna.

Hanna, a native of Queen Creek, Ariz., started the final two sets and was one of four Rams to make their collegiate debuts. True freshmen Sanja Cizmic started the match, while Alexandra Poletto and redshirt freshman Jaliyah Bolden also saw time on the court.

"Jasmine Hanna coming in and hitting .333 on the left was big," Hilbert said. "Jasmine's composure and her management was good. We're slowly figuring out who's going to play where, and I thought it was a good start.

The Rams (1-0, 0-0 MW) were firing on all cylinders, hitting .304 compared to VCU's .062 hitting percentage. In the second set, CSU held VCU (0-1, 0-0 A10) to -.080 hitting. CSU also out-blocked VCU, 9.0-4.0, while also leading in digs, kills and service aces.

Four of CSU's six aces came from junior Kaitlind Bestgen. She had three in the first set alone, and was part of two 7-0 CSU runs - the first breaking a 14-14 tie and the second giving the Rams a 9-2 advantage after being knotted up at 2-2.

"One of our main goals was to win the serving-passing battle, and we for sure did," Hilbert said. "If we can get half the production that we got out of Kaitlind today throughout the year, that'll be really good.

The Rams return to the court tonight at 7:30 to face UC Santa Barbara. The Gauchos were slept earlier in the day by Marquette

"It was a good effort by us, and good point-scoring for sure," Hilbert said on the win. I think we're going to play a better team tonight in Santa Barbara, and an even better team tomorrow in Marguette. It'll be a good weekend test for us.

Rams defeat Gauchos in straight sets Snider registers 13 kills, 0 errors in win

FORT COLLINS, Colo. — More than 2,700 fans packed Moby Arena on Saturday night as the No. 18 Colorado State volleyball team defeated UC Santa Barbara (receiving votes) in straight sets - 25-23, 25-18, 25-16. The win was the Rams' second of the day, putting them in line for the Rams Volleyball Classic championship match Sunday vs. Marquette

The Rams (2-0, 0-0 MW) and Gauchos (0-2, 0-0 Big West) were locked in a back-and-forth affair early on, with the opening set featuring 12 ties and five lead changes. With the score knotted at 20-20, CSU secured consecutive points to take its first multi-point lead of the match

Kelsey Snider shut the door several plays later, giving the Rams the Set-1 advantage after a 25-23 victory.

"That's your typical deal where it's your first weekend," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "We watched them play earlier, and Marquette disrupted them so much with jump serving that they weren't able to do some things offensively, but they did against us. They were much better than I thought they would be in terms of the fast stuff, and they got a lot by us.

Snider recorded six of her match-most 13 kills in the opening frame. On the night, she hit .722 with zero errors, the second-best hitting efficiency of her career.

"Tom said we had an athletic advantage, so I knew if I just went fast and high that I would beat them."

Snider not only attacked well, but she also blocked. The senior from Westminster, Colo., had five blocks, leading the Rams who had 13 total stuffs on the night.

"Tonight, they (UCSB) were more in system than they were this afternoon," Hilbert said. "That put more pressure on Luke (Murray, assistant coach) on making certain calls and options, and he did a nice job with it.'

Seven different Rams had multiple blocks in the win, as CSU out-blocked UCSB. 13.0-4.0.

After a tight first set, the Rams cruised through the next two. The two teams were tied at 1-1 in Set 2, but it would be the last time the Gauchos would break even. CSU jumped out to a 7-1 early lead in the third set, and led by as many as nine

Junior libero Jaime Colaizzi had 15 digs, the 30th double-digit dig match of her career. Freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna earned her first collegiate start, finishing the night with six kills and three blocks

All-time under Hilbert, CSU is 71-13 in regular-season home tournaments. The Rams look to win their seventh consecutive home tourney on Sunday with a win over Marquette.

"I think Marquette's good," Hilbert said. "I think that the match tomorrow will be really difficult. They play sound in every area and they are more athletic than both the teams we played today.'

Rams earn road win at Northern Colorado CSU wins 12th-straight set to begin season, longest since 1986

GREELEY, Colo. - Different venue, same result. The 13th-ranked Colorado State volleyball team traveled to Northern Colorado Wednesday for its first road match of the season. The Rams swept the Bears to improve to 4-0 (25-17, 25-13, 25-21).

CSU (4-0, 0-0 MW) has now won all 12 sets this season, the best set winning streak to start a season since 1986. The Rams have also won 18-straight true road matches, a streak which began in October 2012, and includes two wins at Northern Colorado

"I thought it was a great serving effort by us, a great passing game, we played great defensively and we had great blocking," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "I'd like to see some other things get better, but we played well enough to get a win against a pretty good team."

The Rams held the Bears (2-2, 0-0 Big Sky) to .055 hitting - the lowest for a CSU opponent this season - and recorded a season-high-tying 13 blocks. UNC's top attacker, Andrea Spaustat, who entered the match averaging 3.75 kills per set, was limited to three kills and -.263 hitting. Through four matches, CSU's defense is averaging 3.67 blocks per set while limiting opponents to .088 efficiency.

Three players - Adrianna Culbert (15), Jaime Colaizzi (10) and Cassidy Denny (10) - tallied double digits for digs. while senior Kelsey Snider had a team-most six blocks. The middle blocker also had a match-most 11 kills on .409 hitting.

"I actually think we played defensively better today than we even did this weekend," Hilbert said. "Really, I thought we did a good job, especially on some of those hard-hit balls. Jaime made a really critical dig at the end of the third set that kept us in it. I thought some of that was better than what we saw at home. Kelsey (Snider) continues to be better and better and better, and she's extremely composed. You start to not notice her, and the reason is her three rotations go, 'Boom, boom, boom.' She gets a kill, and then we're running around trying to score in those other rotations.

UNC led the opening set early, 4-3, before CSU took over with a 7-1 run to double up the score. The Bears would get within three – as late as 19-16 – but CSU closed on a 6-1 run to win the set. Carrying over the momentum, CSU took the first five points of Set 2, and led 8-1 when UNC burned its first timeout. The Rams took a double-digit lead at 16-6, and led by at least 10 for the remainder of the set.

"I think we started off a lot better (in Set 2) than we did in the first and third sets," Snider said. "Once you get on a little run, we gain the momentum right off the bat, and it's hard to gain that back.

The third set, however, was a little different. While the Rams maintained a lead from the third point on, they could not put down kills as easily, hitting just .149. CSU led by as many as nine points, but just two points away from a sweep – at 23-17 – UNC scored four-straight points to bring the score to 24-21. Freshman Jasmine Hanna was able to finish the match off, though, laying down her eighth kill of the match and sixth of the set.

The Rams will continue their busy stretch of six matches in season's first eight days with home contests against Florida A&M (Friday, 7 p.m.) and No. 4 Wisconsin (Saturday, 7 p.m.). The Rattlers won the 2013 Mid Eastern Athletic Conference championship, while the Badgers were the 2013 NCAA runner-up.

Rams rock Rattlers to remain undefeated Poletto hits .857 in 1st career start, 2nd-highest in school history

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – With a big match looming, the 13th-ranked Colorado State volleyball team made sure not to look past Florida A&M, sweeping the Rattlers Friday night at Moby Arena (25-13, 25-16, 25-11). The victory improves CSU's mark to 5-0 on the season – tied for the sixth-best start in program history – and extends the Rams' set winning streak to begin the season to 15 sets – second-best and most since 1986.

"I thought we played cleanly," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "We should win this match, but I thought Florida A&M had some good kids who swung hard and forced us to really close our blocks. We played a few different scenarios and got to rest some people."

The story of the night, however, was the play of the freshmen. Sanja Cizmic and Alexandra Poletto combined for 23 kills on .700 hitting. Poletto, making her first career start, connected on her first 10 swings and finished the night with 12 kills and zero errors. Her .857 hitting percentage was the second-best in CSU history, and the highest since 2001. It also marks the best-ever percentage by a CSU freshman.

"It was a good experience," Poletto said. "It has been challenging coming off the bench in the past few matches, halfway through the second set. You put a lot of pressure on yourself to try and play really well in that situation. Being able to start right off the bat and play automatically is a lot easier."

As a team, CSU hit a season-best .469, while limiting Florida A&M (0-4, 0-0 MEAC) to .051. It marks the third time in five matches that CSU has limited its opponent to under .100 hitting. On the year, the Rams' defense is holding teams to .081 hitting, while CSU's offense is hitting .321. In addition to Poletto's 12 kills, Cizmic hit in double figures for the first time, tallying 11 kills on .562 hitting. It was the first time this season that multiple Rams have tallied double figures for kills.

"This is a great freshman class," Hilbert said. "We've had good freshman classes before, but these girls are all game ready. They know the game of volleyball. These two (Poletto and Cizmic) are very skilled and can play the position. We've got a lot of options and a lot of depth."

Seniors Marlee Reynolds and Kelsey Snider had nine kills apiece, followed by Adrianna Culbert's seven. Snider also led the Rams with five blocks – she's led the team in blocks all five matches this season and is averaging 1.61 per set on the season – as the Rams out-blocked the Rattlers, 9.0 to 6.0. CSU never trailed in the first or third sets. In the second set, Hilbert called timeout teading by just one, 10-9. Following the timeout, Culbert and the Rams wort on a 5-0 run to build a cushion, eventually extending their lead to nine points. CSU hit a season-high. 556 in the set.

The Rams now will focus on one of the biggest matches in program history, facing the fourth-ranked Wisconsin Badgers Saturday at 7 p.m. in a White Out. Wisconsin improved to 3-0 on the season Friday with a 3-1 decision at Northern Colorado.

"We'll turn it up," Hilbert said. "Wisconsin is going to play a much faster tempo than what we saw tonight. If it shocks them and they can't play (with Wisconsin) then I would be shocked, because I think they can. Am I saying that we're better than Wisconsin? It depends on the match, the night and the situation. We will come out and compete well tomorrow night. It's about playing one point at a time and seeing where that takes you."

No. 4 Wisconsin deals No. 13 CSU 1st loss of season Record-breaking crowd of 7,018 on hand for top-15 showdown

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – Playing in front of a record-breaking crowd of 7,018 fans, No. 13 Colorado State was handed its first defeat of the season, falling to No. 4 Wisconsin 3-0 Saturday night at Moby Arena (25-21, 25-23, 25-20). Prior to the loss, CSU (5-1, 0-0 MW) had won its first 15 sets of the season. Wisconsin, the defending national runner-up, remains undefeated (5-0, 0-0 B1G). It was CSU's first 3-0 loss in 87 regular-season matches, dating back to Aug. 29, 2011, and its first at Moby Arena since Aug. 29, 2009.

Despite being swept, however, CSU was within striking distance, never trailing by more than five points past the midway point of the first set.

"I'm walking away from this thinking we played OK," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "We're not as good as Wisconsin. Were these sets we could have won? Certainly one- or two-point swings somewhere could've done it, but it didn't happen. They're too good, and we need to learn from it and we have to get better."

The CSU and Mountain West-record surpasses the previous high of 6,750, set on Sept. 2, 2011 vs. No. 5 Nebraska.

"That was fantastic," Hilbert commented on the crowd. "That kind of atmosphere for college volleyball is awesome. It makes me extremely proud to be a coach of this place. We have this kind of turnout, and it genuinely helps us."

Playing in its first top-15 showdown at Moby Arena since 2011, the Rams came out flat, dropping eight of the first 10 points. CSU called timeout to regroup, however, and was able to work back to a tie at 16-16. CSU would hang close, but Wisconsin was able to pull away to win the opening frame, 25-21, behind .469 hitting. Set 2 was a classic, featuring 13 ties, including every point from 13-13 to 23-23. Following a Wisconsin attack error to push the score to 23-23, CSU had the chance to serve to set up Set Point, but Wisconsin's Courtney Thomas recorded a kill, and the Badgers won the set on the next point to enter the intermission up 2-0. Tied at 7-7 in the final frame, CSU hung close for several more points, but Wisconsin's depth proved to be too much. The Badgers had three players in double figures for kills, and as a team hit .312 – the highest by a CSU opponent since BVU on Sept. 1, 2012.

Freshman Jasmine Hanna led the Rams with 13 kills, a career high and tied for the most by a Rams attacker this season.

"Jasmine had a nice game," Hilbert said. "I think she's growing up as a player, and hitting .200 against Wisconsin is pretty good. I'll take that performance from a freshman any year that I've been here."

Junior Jaime Colaizzi had a season-most 19 digs – many of them diving plays on hard-hit attacks to extend rallies – but the Badgers were just as good, preventing the Rams from finding the floor, as well. Wisconsin's Taylor Morey had 26 digs and the Badgers out-blocked CSU, 7.0 to 3.0.

"We took some risks blocking, and I thought we took good risks blocking," Hilbert said. "We left their outside hitters alone a couple of times and were able to dig them one on one, but as the match wore on we weren't able to get any more blocks."

Even with the loss, Hilbert holds a 25-13 record at Moby Arena against ranked teams, winning seven of the past 10 matches. The Rams will again have a quick turnaround, facing in-state rival Denver Tuesday night at Moby Arena.

Rams push past Pioneers

Hanna finishes with career-most 15 kills, Colaizzi records season-best 22 digs

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - No. 14 Colorado State got back on track Tuesday with a 3-0 win (26-24, 25-17, 25-11) over the Denver Pioneers. Freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna led all players with a career-high 15 kills, while junior libero Jaime Colaizzi had a season-most 22 digs.

"It was good to get for us to get a win." Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "I thought that Jasmine was great. I was walking up here thinking about how I was thinking of redshirting her, and she's been one of the most impactful players on our team so far.'

With four players recording nine kills or more, CSU's offense hit above .300 for the fourth time this season (.319), increasing its season average to .298. Junior Adrianna Culbert posted her first double-double of the season with 10 kills and 12 digs. In addition to out-hitting DU (.319 to .130), the Rams were also very effective at the serving game (4 service aces to 1) and out-dug the Pioneers, 61-38. That allowed CSU to tally 52 kills - compared to DU's 31 despite having the same number of giveaway points.

"It's good to keep consistency with my defense, because that's something that, in the past, I've been wanting to work on," Colaizzi said. "It's huge for me, and I can say that I'm proud of my defensive game lately.

The 22 digs marked Colaizzi's ninth career 20-plus dig match. Following the libero. Culbert had 12 digs, while junior Kaitlind Bestgen had 10. Offensively, Hanna has averaged 4.67 kills per set over the past two matches, leading the Rams (6-1, 0-0 MW) in kills twice in a row. Her 15 kills were the most by a Rams player this season.

"Tom always tells me that he thinks I'm maturing as a player, and I feel it too. I feel like I'm becoming a smarter player as each match goes on, and even working through the sets.

CSU jumped out to a 1-0 set lead following a tight first frame that saw 11 ties and eight lead changes. Following a back-and-forth opening stretch, CSU began to pull away with an 8-1 run that resulted in both DU (5-2, 0-0 The Summit League) timeouts. However, CSU's six-point lead would not remain intact, as DU charged back to take four of five points late in the set and tie the score at 24-24. Senior Marlee Reynolds tallied a kill to put the Rams back on top, and one play later, setter Deedra Foss ended it with a kill of her own. Foss finished the match with a season-most 43 assists. The Rams did not trail in either the second or third sets to win the match in straight sets, jumping out to 7-3 and 8-2 leads, respectively. Hilbert is now 42-0 all-time against Colorado's four other Division I programs at Moby Arena.

"Before the second game, we all decided to look to each other when we're struggling and try to make a good come-back," Colaizzi said. "We did a good job bouncing back. We made a lot fewer errors, and I think we did really well."

CSU now turns its focus to its first out-of-state road trip of the season, traveling to Las Cruces, N.M., to face No. 9 BYU and New Mexico State Friday, and El Paso, Texas, to take on UTEP Saturday.

"I consider this a good win, because Denver's a good team," Hilbert said. "I'm pleased to get through this in three sets, and now we have to focus on a three-weekend-in-a-row road swing where we play some great teams. I know my team is tired, but it's a big test of time for us.'

CSU upsets No. 9 BYU Rams earn first top-10 win away from Moby Arena since 2006

LAS CRUCES, N.M. – In search of a marquee victory early on in the season, No. 14 Colorado State (7-1) got just that with an impressive four-set victory over No. 9 BYU (5-2) Friday morning on a neutral court. The win marks CSU's 11th win over a top-10 opponent under Head Coach Tom Hilbert, and is the first away from home since Nov. 25, 2006, when the Rams knocked off No. 9 Utah in the Mountain West tournament.

"Coming off Wisconsin, where I don't necessarily think we played to our potential, we stayed calm and composed," senior Kelsey Snider said. "This is a really good win. Just the way we competed, we know we can hold our own.

For the third match in a row, freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna led the Rams with 16 kills, marking the fourth-straight match that a true freshman has led the team in that category. Hanna was particularly effective early, while Snider (13 kills) and senior outside hitter Mariee Reynolds (12 kills) helped guide CSU late in the match. Along with those three players, Culbert also reached double digits with 10 kills and 14 digs, her second-consecutive double double. This was the first time this season that CSU has had four players reach double digits for kills. While CSU was out-blocked, 14-6, by a very lengthy BVU squad which leads the nation in blocking, the Rams tested the Cougars' patience with impressive back-line play that extended rallies into second and third swings. CSU out-dug BYU, 60-49, led by junior libero Jaime Colaizzi's 16.

"If you look at the stats, you'll see that we really out-dug them," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "I think that really frustrated their attackers and led to some errors.

Those errors were hard to come by in the first set when BYU hit .438 (17-3-32). The Cougars used an 8-2 run to propel them into an early 12-5 lead in the opening set, but the Rams remained persistent in their defensive effort. CSU tightened up the set, getting as close as two points, before BYU took the opener, 25-23. Using the momentum gained by the inspiring play at the end of the first set, CSU came out locked in Set 2. The set began and finished in see-saw fashion with 11 tie scores and five lead changes, as CSU's defense started to limit BYU's potent offensive attack. The Cougars were held to just .179 hitting, unable to get easy kills past CSU's defense. Colaizzi racked up nine digs alone in the set as CSU won it, 25-23, and went into the locker room all squared away 1-1. Coming out of the intermission in the seniors began to put their imprint into the focker found an squared way 1-1. Coming out of the intermission the seniors began to put their imprint on the match. CSU trailed early in the set but used a 10-2 run to take a comfortable lead. The Rams led by as many as six points in the frame, but things started to tighten up late in the crucial third set. With CSU leading 21-19, Snider put things in her own hands, accounting for the next four points via three kills and a block to guide the Rams to a 25-20 win in the set and a 2-1 lead in the match.

"We were certainly the more mature team at the end of those sets," Hilbert said. "We had people stepping up, and I think BYU had people kind of getting scared. They had way more giveaways then we did. We test people's patience riaht now.

CSU could sense that the upset-win was within its grasp, but it would not come easy in a set that featured eight ties and two lead changes. The Rams jumped out to an early 4-1 lead in the fourth est, but BYU came right back to take a lead of its own at 11-10. From that point, the Cougars maintained the lead and had the Rams trailing 24-22 and looking to head into a decisive fifth set. Again, the seniors made their mark. Snider tallied a kill to stave off the first set point, and Reynolds followed it up with a kill of her own to stave off a second and tie the score at 24-24. Reynolds added another kill just after to put CSU ahead, as the Rams took the final set, 28-26. Reynolds finished the set with five kills and zero errors on 11 attacks.

"Jasmine was really good early on." Hilbert said. "Marlee was really good late. It was one of Marlee's best matches Acacia Andrews (nine kills) really grew up and learned a lot as a volleyball player. It was good for everybody.

Rams grind out sweep over New Mexico State Each set decided by 2 points; Rams win 19th-straight true road match

LAS CRUCES, N.M. - Coming off a signature win earlier in the day, the 14th-ranked Colorado State volleyball team was tested by a feisty New Mexico State squad, but showed its grit in a tight three-set sweep (26-24, 28-26, 25-23) Friday night at the Pan American Center.

"I feel lucky to just win," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "I think we were outplayed. We just hung in there and won the sets at the end by being better at the end. The tanks are empty. We were taking swings and not getting kills.

For the second time of the day, and fourth match in a row, freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna led the Rams (8-1, 0-0 MW) for kills, with 13. Hanna was joined by senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds, who also posted 13 kills, while senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider (nine) and junior right-side hitter Adrianna Culbert (eight) rounded things up offensively for CSU. Senior setter Deedra Foss earned praise from her head coach after dishing out 39 assists

"One of the big difference makers today was Deedra," Hilbert said. "She's just so much better than everybody else on the court. She's making good decisions, she's taking apart their block and she's doing it so much you think it's old hat. She is very good.'

The opening action of the match set the tone for what was to follow. Set 1 featured 14 ties and four lead changes. The two teams alternated points all the way from 2-2 to 10-10 in the opening set before New Mexico State (3-4. 0-0 WAC) opened up a four-point lead. The Rams showed their determination, however, and closed the gap before winning the set, 26-24, after back-to-back kills from Snider and Hanna. In the first set, the Rams hit .394 while New Mexico State also hit at an impressive clip of .389. That trend would not continue, however, as defenses from both teams picked things up and continuously extended rallies. After the high hitting percentages in the first set, CSU was held to .218 hitting for the match while the Aggies hit .252.

The Rams led by as many as six points in the second set, at 17-11, before the Aggies climbed back into it. Set 2 featured 10 ties and four lead changes total, but led by the impressive defense from CSU's backline and some timely kills, the Rams toughed out a 28-26 set win to take a 2-0 lead into the intermission.

Coming out of the break, CSU looked primed to take control of the match, taking an early 10-5 lead in the final frame. Once again, New Mexico State showed that it would not go easy, eventually tying the set at 16-16. The two teams battled back and forth over the next several points in a set that featured 11 ties and three lead changes, but once again, CSU showcased its resilience and quality of play late in the set to win it, 25-23.

"We always work on drills we call end game, and for us to stay competing and stay composed is exciting," Snider said. "This was very good. We kept really composed and kept playing the way we know how."

In total, the match saw 35 ties and 11 lead changes, but the Rams were at their best late in the set to earn the sweep. It was much of the same in 2011, the last time the two teams met in Las Cruces, with all four sets being decided by two points in CSU's 3-1 win. The Rams will conclude the weekend Sunday with their third match in a 25-hour period. CSU will travel to El Paso, Texas, to face the UTEP Miners at 12 p.m. MT. CSU has won 20-straight true road wins dating back to 2012.

CSU sweeps UTEP to cap off perfect weekend Rams have won 21-straight true road contests since 2012

EL PASO, Texas - The No. 14 Colorado State Rams completed a successful weekend away from home with a sweep of the UTEP Miners Saturday afternoon at Memorial Gym (25-13, 25-18, 25-23).

Senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider led the way for the Rams (9-1, 0-0 MW) offensively with 13 kills on .500 hitting (13-2-22). Snider was followed by fellow middle blocker Acacia Andrews, who tallied seven kills, while outside hitters Jasmine Hanna and Marlee Reynolds each had six.

The story of the day, however, was CSU's defense. Led by Snider's team-leading five blocks, the Rams racked up a total of 11 blocks and limited the Miners (1-7, 0-0 Conference USA) to just .083 hitting for the match. CSU was particularly effective in limiting UTEP's Talia Jones, who came into the match leading the team with 3.00 kills per set. Jones mustered just two kills and was forced into five attack errors.

While the Rams were impressive at the net, they were perhaps even more impressive in the back row. As a team, CSU out-dug UTEP 54-43 and were led by a season-high-tying performance from Jaime Colaizzi, with 22. It marked the 10th time that Colaizzi has registered 20-plus digs in a match, moving her into third place in CSU history.

Along with Colaizzi, freshman outside hitter Sania Cizmic racked up a career-high 10 digs in her third career start.

Dating back to Oct. 27, 2012, CSU has now won 21-straight true road matches. Against UTEP, CSU has won 13-straight in the series, including 40 sets in a row.

CSU jumped out to a 15-6 lead in the opening frame, never trailing past the 3-2 mark. The Rams used a 5-0 run in Set 2 to take a 10-5 lead, and while UTEP closed within two - as late as 16-14 - they were able to close on a 9-4 run to win the set

The third frame was the tightest, but like it was in victories Friday over No. 9 BYU and New Mexico State, CSU was at its best late in the set to stave off a Miners rally

The Rams next travel to Tempe, Ariz., for the Residence Inn Challenge. CSU opens up the tournament at No. 15 Arizona State on Friday at 8 p.m. MT.

No. 8 Rams take down No. 18 Sun Devils CSU begins Set 5 on 9-0 run to claim 2nd win over ranked opponent

CSO begins Set 5 on 9-0 run to claim zhu win over rankeu opponent

TEMPE, Ariz. – The eighth-ranked Colorado State volleyball team improved to 10-1 Friday night with a five-set win over No. 18 Arizona State (25-23, 25-20, 18-25, 17-25, 15-5). The win was CSU's second over a nationally ranked team in eight days, and the Rams' first on a ranked opponent's home court since 2007. Overall, CSU has won 21-straight true road matches dating back to 2012. CSU was previously 0-10 against Arizona State.

"We play volleyball well, and when we are in rhythm we are very effective," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "Arizona State has two players who are more athletic than anybody on our team, but we're just playing the game really well and it showed tonight."

After taking a 2-0 match lead, ASU (8-2, 0-0 Pac-12) stormed back to win sets 3 and 4 and force a decisive fifth set. That's when CSU took over, claiming the first nine points of the set and winning 15-5. Senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider got the scoring started with a kill, setting up nine-consecutive serves for junior opposite hitter Adrianna Culbert. During the run, Snider had three kills, while freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna had two. Senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds had a huge solo block to finalize the set and match.

"We switched sides at 8-0," Hilbert said. "That's never happened to me in my career. That's something else."

CSU hit a combined .439 in its three set wins, and was paced by senior setter Deedra Foss' 52 assists. On defense, junior libero Jaime Colaizzi tied a career high with 25 digs – one of four players with nine or more digs – and four players had two or more blocks. Hanna, who grew up 30 minutes from Tempe and was playing in front of a large contingent of family and friends, led CSU with three stuffs on the night. Four Rams were in double figures for kills, led by Hanna and Snider (14 apiece) and followed by Reynolds (13) and Culbert (10).

"Marlee was really good," Hilbert said of Reynolds, who committed just three errors on 26 swings. "This was a break-through match for her, I thought."

Leading 10-9 in Set 1, CSU used a 5-1 run to take control of the opening set. All five points came off of kills, coming from four different players. ASU called timeout, and coming out of the break, the Rams setended the run to 7-1 with back-to-back ASU errors. The Sun Devils, though, worked their way back into the set, getting within one at 22-21. CSU called timeout and brought it to set point following a kill from Snider and one from Foss – in which she almost had the point on a dump before finishing it with a joust. ASU would again threaten, bringing the score to 24-22, before a service error ended the frame. Over the past four matches, CSU has won seven sets decided by two points. The Rams took a 2-0 lead into the intermission after a late push in Set 2. Despite trailing 18-17, CSU used a 7-0 run to set up set point at 24-18. During the run to close the frame, Hanna and sophomore middle blocker Acacia Andrews each had two kills and the duo totaled three solo blocks. The first of Andrews' blocks came after an amazing onehanded diving stab by Colaizzi to extend the rally, giving CSU a 20-18 lead and forcing an ASU timeout after Andrews finished it with a roof. The set featured 10 ties, but none after 18-18.

ASU took an early 6-3 lead in Set 3 and carried the momentum to a set victory. The Rams kept within two or three pointfor the majority of the set, but could never equalize, and a late 7-2 push by ASU brought the final score to 25-18. The Rams led Set 4 13-11 after a Kaitlind Bestgen ace, but a 6-1 run would doom the visitors. The Sun Devils out-hit the Rams .333 to .099 during the third and fourth sets after CSU hit .565 and .406 in sets 1 and 2, respectively, not making an error until its 37th swing of the match.

Rams ride Waves to 3-set win CSU improves to 11-1; will play for tournament title Saturday night

TEMPE, Ariz. – Following a win over a nationally ranked Arizona State Friday night, No. 8 Colorado State was back in the gym 11 hours later to take on Pepperdine. The Rams rolled past the Waves in three sets (25-13, 25-23, 25-20) to mprove to 11-1 on the season.

CSU out-hit Pepperdine, .333 to .122, and out-blocked the Waves, 12.0 to 2.0, but the biggest difference was the Rams' ability to come from behind in sets 2 and 3.

"We played well," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "I was really happy with the competitiveness, especially coming from behind in the second and third sets."

Senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds had nine kills and six other CSU players had at least two, including freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna, who had eight kills on .444 efficiency. Six Rams players had a solo block in the win, led by four total stuffs from freshman Alexandra Poletto.

"Alexandra played only about 30 percent of the match, so for her to get the blocks she did is really good," Hilbert said. "She also hit 1.000 (2-0-2)."

The two teams alternated points to begin the match before CSU took its first multi-point lead at 5-3. From there, the Rams would use a pair of 4-0 runs to take control of the set – the second bringing the score to 16-7. For the secondstraight match, CSU did not make an attack error in the opening frame, recording 14 kills and zero errors on 31 swings (.452). The Rams' first swinging mistake came midway through Set 2, on the team's 40th attack of the day.

CSU staked out to an 8-2 lead, forcing a Pepperdine timeout early in Set 2, but the Waves (5-6, 0-0 WCC) responded with 14 of 19 points – including a 5-0 run – to take a three-point lead. Trailing 18-15, CSU claimed four straight, capped with a Cassidy Denny ace, to regain the lead for good, 19-18.

Pepperdine jumped out to a 13-7 lead in Set 3 – hitting .462 at the time – but the Rams showed their tenacity, fighting back to bring the score to 13-11, and following a pair of Waves points, used a 7-1 run to take an 18-16 advantage, its first lead since 1-0.

Clinging to a 21-20 lead, CSU closed the set on a 4-0 run to win the match. After beginning the set strong offensively, Pepperdine hit .060 in the frame thanks in large part to seven CSU blocks.

"We out-blocked them 12 to 2, and were very low error in attacking," Hilbert said. "The sets were pretty close because we weren't killing balls, but we controlled most of the match because we were playing very cleanly."

With the sweep, CSU improved to 7-6 all-time against Pepperdine. The two teams have played eight times in the past 11 seasons, with CSU winning the last three contests.

CSU will play for the Residence Inn Invitational championship tonight at 6 p.m. MT vs. North Carolina Central. The Eagles are winless entering their afternoon contest vs. No. 18 Arizona State. The match will be CSU's final nonconference match of the season.

CSU defeats NCCU to win Residence Inn Invitational

Reynolds named tournament MVP; CSU finishes non-conference play 12-1

TEMPE, Ariz. - The No. 8 Colorado State volleyball team won the Residence Inn Invitational championship Saturday night following a sweep over North Carolina Central (25-15, 25-20, 25-12) at Wells Fargo Arena.

The Rams went 3-0 on the weekend - including wins over No. 18 Arizona State and Pepperdine - to finish the nonconference portion of their season 12-1.

"Our resiliency and our competitiveness has been really great," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "We've gotten past some pretty adverse situations and have hung with some good teams. I'm pretty excited about where we're at.'

Senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds was named the tournament MVP while freshman middle blocker lasmine Hanna and junior libero Jaime Colaizzi were named to the all-tournament team. CSU has now won 26-straight regular-season matches away from Moby Arena, a streak which dates back to Oct. 27, 2012.

Setter Crystal Young, a transfer from Blinn College, made her first CSU start, totaling 33 assists, three blocks and two kills. Freshmen Sanja Cizmic and Alexandra Poletto also made spot starts, allowing some regulars to rest.

"It was good to see a lineup out there that we haven't done before," Hilbert said. "We saw some new things, and I thought our setting accuracy was great and she (Young) made good decisions.

Cizmic finished with five kills on .571 hitting, three service aces and three blocks, while Poletto had five kills on .500 hitting and two blocks

CSU hit a season-best .493, while out-blocking NCCU, 8.0 to 1.0. Hanna had 12 kills on .500 hitting while Reynolds was also in double figures for kills (10 kills, .562 efficiency). Senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider added eight kills on .583 hitting in addition to three blocks and two aces.

The Rams had a season-high eight service aces, including three from junior Kaitlind Bestgen. The defensive specialist also had a team-most nine digs.

Trailing 5-4 in Set 1, CSU used a 7-1 run to take an 11-6 lead. The two teams were tied at 15-15 in Set 2 before CSU strung together four-straight points - including two blocks and a kill from Cizmic - to take control of the set. The Rams scored the first seven points of Set 3 and never trailed.

"I'm really impressed with our balance on offense and how cleanly we play," Hilbert said. "That allows us to compete in every set.'

CSU will now turn its attention to Mountain West play, where the Rams will look to win their sixth-consecutive conference title. CSU travels to Utah State on Thursday followed by a match at Boise State Saturday. The Aggies were nicked to finish third in the MW, behind CSU and New Mexico.

"Our goal, as always, is to win the Mountain West," Hilbert said. "That's our way into the NCAA tournament."

Rams begin conference play with victory over Utah State Andrews has career night in 4-set road win

LOGAN, Utah - The No. 7 Colorado State volleyball team opened up its conference-title defense with a win Thursday, defeating Utah State, 3-1, at the Wayne Estes Center (25-22, 25-20, 23-25, 25-18). The win improves CSU's record to 14-2 all-time in Mountain West openers, and extends the Rams' true road winning streak to 22, dating back to Oct. 27, 2012. Sophomore middle blocker Acacia Andrews had a career night, totaling a personal-best nine blocks, in addition to a season-high-tying nine kills.

"Acacia had a career blocking night," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "She made the difference, certainly in the second set and again in the fourth. She was exceptionally good at blocking, and the reason we won.

The first three sets were tight throughout, but CSU was able to pull away late in sets 1 and 2 to take a 2-0 lead in the

"We started the match flat offensively," Hilbert said. "But we only missed three serves and hit six unforced errors in four sets. That allows us to hang in there and win at the end.

CSU (13-1, 1-0 MW) led 21-19 late in Set 1, but Utah State (4-7, 0-1 MW) scored two in a row to tie the game and force a Rams timeout. Coming out of the break, the Aggies got the first point to take its first lead since 4-3. That's when the Rams took over - proving again they're at their best late in sets - scoring the final four points to win 25-22. Set 2 featured 14 ties but never after 18-18. The Rams trailed 13-10, but worked back to take a 15-14 lead. Trailing by one moments later, 18-17, they used a 6-0 run to take control of the match. During the team's 8-2 run to end the set, Andrews and junior Adrianna Culbert combined for three blocks. In the set, Andrews had four stuffs, while freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna had five kills and CSU out-hit the Aggies, .355 to .114. The Aggies jumped out to an 8-4 lead in Set 3, and looked poised to win easy before CSU fought off six set points, bringing the score to 24-23 before the Aggies closed it out with a kill. But CSU left no doubt in Set 4, taking a 6-2 lead early and never trailing, holding Utah State to .020 hitting and winning, 25-18.

Senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds led CSU with 14 kills, followed by Hanna with 13, Andrews and Kelsey Snider with nine, and Culbert with eight. Culbert also tied career highs for digs (17) and blocks (seven). Despite being outblocked, CSU tied a season high with 13.0 blocks.

"Even though we got blocked a lot, the rest of our game we did a nice job with," Hilbert said. "They're well coached in blocking, and they were prepared.

Four players were in double figures for digs, including junior setter Deedra Foss, who had a double-double with 49 assists and 10 digs.

With the win, CSU improved to 20-14 all-time against Utah State, winning 18-straight in the series. The Rams close their eight-match road trip Saturday afternoon against Boise State. CSU is 8-0 all-time against the Broncos, never dropping a set. The match can be streamed through the Mountain West Network.

"It's a road win, and you've got to love those," Hilbert said. "It wasn't the prettiest one, but I'll take it. Now we move on to Boise State.

No. 7 Rams take down Broncos

CSU concludes longest road trip since 2003 undefeated

BOISE, Idaho - No. 7 Colorado State capped its eight-match road trip with a 3-0 win Saturday afternoon at Boise State (25-19, 25-17, 25-22). The victory improved the Rams' season mark to 14-1 and 2-0 in Mountain West play, while snapping Boise State's six-match winning streak (8-6, 1-1 MW).

"I'm always happy when we get through road stretches with two wins," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "It's much harder than people think. I thought Boise State was on its A game and has a great future

CSU has never lost a set to Boise State, holding a 9-0 match and 27-0 set record all-time. The Rams cruised through the first two sets, using an 8-0 run in Set 1 and 6-1 run in Set 2 to take a 2-0 lead entering intermission. Boise State hung tougher in the third set, however, even holding a two-point lead as late as 15-13. The Rams, though, fought back to take an 18-16 advantage, and regained the lead for good at 20-19.

"That last set, they made very few mistakes and they stayed right with us," Hilbert said of Boise State. "We won it in the end because of our experience. It was a great, great match, and a great and clean effort by our entire team.

CSU's final four points came from Marlee Reynolds kills. The senior outside hitter finished with a team-most 13 kills, doing so on .310 efficiency.

"Marlee came up big at the end of that set," Hilbert said. "She was very aggressive, and when we were in a tight set she stepped it up. She had some important kills and was blocking very well."

As a team, the Rams hit .340, with all attackers hitting above .300. Freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna had 10 kills on .364 hitting, followed by senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider (8, .333), sophomore middle blocker Acacia Andrews (6, .417) and junior right-side attacker Adrianna Culbert (3, .375). Culbert and junior defensive specialist Jaime Colaizzi had 11 digs apiece, while the Rams out-blocked the Broncos, 12.5 to 5.0. A match after setting a personal best with nine blocks, Andrews had a team-most six. Four other players had four or more stuffs, including senior setter Deedra Foss who had 37 assists and four blocks.

"Deedra doesn't get enough credit," Hilbert said. "She moves the ball around well, she looks for the right matchups and she does a very nice job."

The Rams have now won 23-straight true road matches dating back to Oct. 27, 2012. Since its lone loss of the season - Sept. 6 to No. 4 Wisconsin - the Rams have won nine matches in a row. They will next return to Fort Collins for their first home match since Sept. 9. CSU has played its last eight matches away from home, its longest stretch since 2003. That year, the Rams also played eight in a row away from Moby Arena, and ironically, both times the road trip began on Sept. 12 and concluded on Sept. 27

"I come away from this trip going, 'We just went on the road and won every match we played for three weekends in a row.' That is really, really good, I'm a perfectionist, but if you look at the body of work in our last three weekends it's pretty special. We have wins over two nationally ranked teams and two conference road wins against solid competition, and haven't been at home in three weekends.'

No. 7 CSU downs UNLV in conference home opener Reynolds records career-most 21 kills on .500 efficiency

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – Playing in front of its home fans for the first time in nearly a month, the seventh-ranked Colorado State volleyball team defeated UNLV Thursday night in four sets (25-15, 23-25, 25-16, 25-14). The victory extends the Rams' winning streak to 10 matches, and improves their record to 15-1, 3-0 MW. Senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds had a career night, tallying a personal-best 21 kills and doing so on .500 hitting. Of her 40 swings, she committed just one error. Four other players had seven or more kills, helping CSU hit .354 compared to UNLV's .103. The Rebels (13-4, 1-1 MW) entered the match holding opponents to .130 hitting on the season.

"Marlee Reynolds played great," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "She was on fire so much that we switched our lineup to Row 5 so she could start in the left-front for sets 3 and 4. We got a win against a good conference team; hats off to my team, because we did what we needed to do, and we didn't make a whole lot of mistakes

It was the senior's second double-double in the past three matches. Despite ranking fourth in the NCAA for blocking, CSU out-blocked UNLV, 11 to 9, and out-dug the conference-leading Rebels, 67-49. Five Rams had three blocks, while five players had nine or more digs.

"I think our blocking intimidated them a little bit," Reynolds said. "Their outside hitters kept wailing the ball out of bounds, and that means your block is doing well if this hitter is trying to hit completely around it.

Setter Deedra Foss paced the CSU offense with 49 assists, but also added a season-most 12 digs in addition to backto-back service aces late in the fourth set. I

"Things that we did great were that we served the ball really well - it doesn't show up in aces, but it shows up in what we were able to do offensively - and we were good at siding out," Hilbert said.

Leading 20-12 in Set 1, freshman middle blocker Alexandra Poletto checked into the match for the first time. She contributed toward each of CSU's final five points - tallying three kills and two blocks - to help the Rams take Set 1, 25-15. The set was tight early, but a 4-0 run turned a 7-7 tie into an 11-7 Rams advantage. Three of the points came on UNLV attack errors. The Rebels had 10 compared to CSU's one, as the Rams out-hit the Rebels, .464 to .050. UNLV would rebound in Set 2, however, jumping out to an early 6-1 lead and forcing a CSU timeout. The Rams would chip away, getting to 19-16 with an Adrianna Culbert kill, but UNLV took the next two points to pad its lead. Still, though, the Rams wouldn't go away. Trailing, 23-19, CSU scored four of the next five points to fight off a pair of set points, but UNLV secured the set victory with a Katlin Winters kill. UNLV hit .342 in Set 2 compared to .025 combined in the other three sets

The final two frames were all CSU. The Rams jumped out to a 10-5 lead in Set 3 and 14-5 advantage in Set 4 – behind six consecutive serves from Jaime Colaizzi - and didn't trail in either.

Reynolds' 21 kills surpassed her previous high of 19, set on Sept. 7, 2013 at Pepperdine. She has been extremely effective as of late, averaging 3.64 kills per set on .341 hitting over the past six matches

"I just got out there and I immediately felt comfortable," Reynolds said. "I felt confident and good internally."

Rams sweep Aztecs to extend win streak to 11 Snider posts 13 kills on .591 efficiency in Orange Out win

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - Wearing orange jerseys in honor of its past, the No. 7 Colorado State volleyball team continued its proud winning tradition with a 3-0 victory over San Diego State Saturday night in front of 4,370 fans at Moby Arena (25-22, 25-21, 25-16). The win is CSU's 11th-straight, and improves the Rams' mark to 16-1, 4-0 MW.

"I thought we played great," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "I was upset with a few individual plays, especially in Set 2 and in crunch time, but I thought we were good, and defensively we played well.

Senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider paced the Rams' offense with a team-most 13 kills on .591 hitting. Teammates Jasmine Hanna (12; .417) and Adrianna Culbert (10; .350) were also in double figures for kills, while Culbert (10) and junior libero Jaime Colaizzi (14) were in double digits for digs. Senior setter Deedra Foss had 42 assists and three blocks, while sophomore middle blocker Acacia Andrews had a team-most four stuffs.

"We had some people step up really big for us," Hilbert said. "I think when you have a setter as good as Deedra, it creates a lot of separation and good things happen. Dri hit the ball really well today. She got blocked early, and I was scared that would affect her, but it didn't. She came through and hit .350."

CSU jumped out to wins in the first and second sets, but neither would come easy. Despite leading by scores of 4-0 and 10-5, San Diego State (5-8, 1-2 MW) rallied back to tie the score at 15-15. That prompted four points in a row by the home team – all on Aztecs errors – forcing a timeout. San Diego State would hang close, but CSU would take three of the final five points to win the set. Set 2 featured eight ties and three lead changes. Trailing 10-7, CSU tied the score at 10-10 on a Culbert-Snider block, and several points later took a 15-14 lead, which the Rams would keep for the remainder of the set. But holding to a 2-0 lead, the Rams didn't need a reminder about what happened last year against the Aztecs. With a perfect 27-0 record in the final week of the regular season, San Diego State came back from two sets down to hand CSU its first loss of the year and snap the Rams' 21-match home winning streak.

"We didn't want to let them think they even had a chance, so we just came out that third set and crushed them," Foss said.

Jumping out to a 4-0 lead in the third set behind the serving and attacking of Culbert, CSU never trailed. The Rams hit .528 in the frame, tallying 20 kills and just one error on 36 swings. Hanna had seven of those kills. She was perfect, tallving seven kills on seven attacks.

"That third set was probably as good a transition game as we've had," Hilbert said. "We had 20 kills, which means we're digging balls and converting them.

CSU is now 5-0 in Orange Out matches – a tradition which pays tribute to the school's original name of Colorado A&M and colors of pumpkin and alfalfa.

"Every time we have these combos with football it's always great for us," Hilbert said. "We had 4,300 people here, and I think they had a great time. It's a great way to celebrate our history as Colorado A&M Aggies, and I want to thank the fans for making this a great place to play. At the end of game, I took Snider and Marlee out, brought them over and told them to take this all in. As seniors, this is going to be it, and this is a great environment and great place to play.

Rams sweep Cowgirls for 12th-straight win CSU overcomes 9-point deficit, earns NCAA-most 17th victory

LARAMIE, Wyo. – The No. 7 Colorado State volleyball team came away from the first installment of the Border War victorious, sweeping rival Wyoming in front of a rowdy UniWyo Sports Complex crowd (25-16, 25-21, 25-23). The win is CSU's 12th in a row overall, and extends the Rams' nation-leading road winning streak to 24 matches dating back to Oct. 27, 2012. The Rams now lead the NCAA with 17 victories on the season (17-1, 5-0 MW). CSU improved to 58-19 all-time against Wyoming (13-5, 2-3 MW), including 34-2 under Head Coach Tom Hilbert.

"This was as gutsy and as mentally tough as I've seen us play in a number of ways," Hilbert said. "There were so many different elements to this match, and we played so mature. It is raucous in this place; it's full and it's loud. These kids are great, though. We compete, at times, so well that I am blown away.

Entering the match, CSU and Wyoming ranked No. 1 and 2, respectively, in the Mountain West for hitting, with both percentages ranking in the top-10 nationally. The Rams out-hit the Cowgirls, 343 to 167, however, led by a season-most 15 kills from senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider. Snider's 15 kills came on just 21 swings (.571 hitting), while Hanna had 14 on .393 efficiency. Foss posted her fifth double-double in eight career matches against Wyoming, recording 41 assists and 11 digs.

"Snider had three errors, and they were all stuff blocks," Hilbert said. "When she didn't get blocked she was very efficient and getting kills almost every time. Jasmine (Hanna) was on (Courtney) Chacon, and Deedra (Foss) was using that matchup all night. I thought we were very alert and really honed in on what we knew the game plan was. Deedra's set choices were excellent

Junior opposite hitter Adrianna Culbert was one of three players in double digits for digs, pacing CSU's back row with 15, in addition to eight kills and three blocks. CSU out-hit Wyoming .367 to .000 in the opening frame, securing nine of 10 points to take a commanding lead after a 7-7 tie. Despite fighting off three set points, the Cowgirls couldn't overcome the deficit the Rams had built. Things tightened up even more in Set 2. CSU trailed by a season-most nine points, allowing Wyoming to jump out to a 12-3 lead, but the Rams never gave in.

"We had called our second timeout, and we were passing terribly," Hilbert said. "It wasn't anything I said, because I told my team, "We just need to settle down as passers; we're probably going to lose this set, but we need to get some momentum and feeling back.' Next thing you know, we're tied at 15-15

After tying the score by using a 12-3 run of its own, the two teams would again be tied at 17-17, 18-18 and 19-19. Each time after CSU tied the score, a service error gave the Cowgirls the lead once again. That changed at 20-20. After a Marlee Reynolds kill to tie the score, Acacia Andrews finished a long rally - seeing impressive plays from both sides - with a kill straight into the ground. That gave CSU its first lead of the set, 21-20, and despite the Cowgirls tying the score at 21-21 on the next point, the Rams closed on a 4-0 run to win the set, 25-21

"I think it shows how competitive we are," Snider said. "We don't like to be down, and we're going to do whatever we can to not let it happen

During the 4-0 run to end the frame. Hanna had two kills and a block and Snider had a kill and a block. CSU led for ust five points all set, despite winning by four. The Rams out-hit the Cowgirls in the frame, .300 to .091, even though Wyoming was leading in the category, .545 to -.071 through the set's first 15 points. CSU jumped out to an early lead in the final frame, but Wyoming chipped away to tie the score at 13-13 and 14-14. CSU went on a 6-3 run to take a 20-17 lead, and despite keeping it within a few points for the remainder of the set, CSU maintained control, winning, 25-23

Rams bounce Bulldogs for 13th-straight win CSU holds Fresno State to .000 hitting in victory

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – No. 7 Colorado State became the first volleyball team in the country to 18 victories, defeat-ing Fresno State in straight sets Saturday afternoon at Moby Arena (25-15, 25-7, 25-17). The victory is CSU's 13th in a row – tied for the sixth-longest winning streak in school history – and improves the Rams' record to 18-1, 6-0 MW. CSU never trailed in the match, jumping out to leads of at least 3-0 in each set. The Rams held the Bulldoss (6-14, 1-5 MW) to negative hitting in the first two sets, and to .000 efficiency for the match. It was the lowest percentage by a CSU opponent since Wyoming hit -.028 on Oct. 5, 2012. On the flip side, CSU – which leads the Mountain West and ranks fourth nationally for hitting - hit at a .429 clip, tallying 38 kills and just five errors. Ten came from junior opposite hitter Adrianna Culbert, who also added eight digs, three blocks and a service ace. Her 10 kills came on .625 efficiency.

"Dri played great and really asserted herself as an attacker." Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "Overall, we played a fantastic match against a team that's young.'

Senior Kelsey Snider had seven kills (.538 hitting) and setter Deedra Foss had five (.833) - in addition to 26 assists and five despite playing just part of Set 3. Freshman outside hitter Sanja Cizmic had five kills and a block in one set of action. The story was the defense, however. In addition to out-digging Fresno State, 35 to 27, CSU also won the blocking game with 11.5 total stuffs compared to Fresno State's one. Eight players had at least one block, with Snider leading the way with a season-most seven. CSU had 6.5 blocks in the first set alone.

"This Fresno State team is young," Hilbert said. "They hit a lot of unforced errors, and a lot of that was because we blocked exceptionally well today. We didn't just block, but we stuffed balls, and that intimidates people and causes them to do things they don't want to do.

CSU jumped out to a 13-5 lead in the opening set, winning easily, 25-15. In the second set, the Rams hit .591 compared to Fresno State's -. 172, holding the Bulldogs to just four kills. CSU held a team to single digits for the first time since last November.

"That second set was pretty rare." Hilbert said. "It was a 100 percent sideout rate; they didn't score any serving points

Libero Jaime Colaizzi was part of two serving runs in the set, totaling two aces to go along with her 10 digs for the

"We stayed really dialed in and aware of everything that was coming at us," Colaizzi said. "We didn't have to work as hard on defense because the blocking was great.

The early leads allowed Hilbert to play some reserves, including starts in sets 2 and 3 for redshirt freshman Jaliyah Bolden (one kill, two blocks), a third-set start for Cizmic and action in the third frame by junior setter Crystal Young (four assists)

"I'm proud of our team for getting through this, doing it right and doing it with class," Hilbert said. "Now we move on '

No. 6 Rams sweep 2nd-place Lobos Culbert tallies 12 kills in tight 3-set match

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – No. 6 Colorado State won its 14th-straight match with a three-set sweep over second-place New Mexico Thursday night at the Johnson Center (25-17, 25-23, 25-22). The win streak is the fourth-longest in the NCAA, while CSU's 25-match road winning streak leads the nation. Junior opposite hitter Adrianna Culbert, the reigning espnW National Player of the Week, had 12 kills on .409 hitting, also adding nine digs. Senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds led all players with 13 kills.

"I'm just proud of my players, because I think we competed really, really well at critical times," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "This was as well as Dri has ever played. She's great when she's moving around and really into it. She was flying around, getting kills, digging balls and doing all the things we wanted her to do. I was super pleased."

In the three-set win, senior setter Deedra Foss had a double-double with 38 assists and 10 digs, junior libero Jaime Colaizzi had 15 digs and junior defensive specialist Kaitlind Bestgen had three service aces. New Mexico (11-8, 4-3 MW) entered the match holding opponents to .138 hitting – eighth in the nation – but CSU (19-1, 7-0 MW) hit .208. The Lobos hit .066, with Mountain West Preseason Player of the Year being limited to nine kills on .080 efficiency.

"We did a good job against Chantale." Hilbert said. "I thought she was put in some precarious situations and made some more errors than you would think. We were also digging her pretty well. Our defense played great all night.

The Rams took a 6-2 lead behind the serving of Bestgen, which turned to 13-7 midway through the first set, forcing New Mexico's second timeout. At that point, the Lobos had just two kills and were being out-hit, .333 to -.087. They would get to within three, 17-14, but the Rams would close on an 8-3 run to win Set 1, 25-17. The match would tighten up after the first frame, with sets 2 and 3 being decided by five total points. New Mexico jumped out to a 6-1 lead in the second set and led by as many as six, 11-5, but CSU chipped away to tie the score (16-16), take its first lead (17-16) and go up by four (20-16) using a 7-0 run. The Lobos would it the score at 20-20 before sophomore middle blocker Acacia Andrews gave the Rams the lead for good with a kill. New Mexico stayed close, but CSU remained one step ahead, winning the set, 25-23, on Culbert's 10th kill of the match. The run again came behind the serving of Bestgen, who had back-to-back aces. Of the seven points, Andrews had the only kill. The first four points came on New Mexico attack errors. The Lobos had nine in the set, hitting just .067, and 24 for the match. The final frame saw 14 ties and four lead changes. A 4-0 run gave the Rams a 16-12 lead – including their first multi-point advantage - but New Mexico responded with four-straight of its own to tie the score at 16-16. The set was tied at the next three points, as well, but back-to-back Lobos errors gave CSU a 21-19 lead. Moments later, leading 23-22, the Rams closed the match with kills from Reynolds and freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna

"It was a great, competitive effort by our team to win tight sets at the end." Hilbert said, "You saw a lot of people making great plays. Our team has incredible composure.

CSU has now won 14-straight sets, one shy of tying its season high. The loss is just New Mexico's second of the season on its home court (7-2), the other coming to No. 2 Texas.

"This is a team (New Mexico) who's going to win a lot of its matches at home," Hilbert said. "You get a road win here and it sets you apart from people. We're staying consistent, and I'm super happy about it."

Rams fly past Falcons

CSU reaches 20 victories for 20th-straight season

USAFA, Colo. - No. 6 Colorado State set the tone early Friday night, jumping out to a 14-1 lead early and rallying late for a three-set win over Air Force (25-17, 25-19, 25-23). The win is CSU's 15th in a row overall, and 26th-straight road win – which leads the nation. The Rams (20-1, 8-0 MW) have now reached 20 victories on the season for the 20th year in a row. Against the Falcons (9-13, 3-5 MW), CSU has won 42-straight matches in the series, including 20 in a row in straight sets.

"I thought we played very well for about half of this match, and then we were just sort of playing along with Air Force," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "But we did enough to get the win, which I'm happy about

Leading 3-1 in the opening frame, freshman outside hitter lasmine Hanna recorded a kill to begin an 11-0 run – the longest of the season. CSU did not trail in the first two sets to take a 2-0 match lead. While CSU cruised to wins in the opening two sets, the third showed how gutsy this team can be. Trailing 20-18, CSU took three of the next four points to tie the score at 21-21 on a Hanna kill. Air Force jumped back on top on the next point before a Marlee Reynolds kill and a long Air Force attack gave CSU its first lead since 13-12.

"I think Air Force is pretty good," Hilbert said. "They got in a rhythm as the match went on. They out-hit us in the third game, but it came down to service errors and aces. We passed the ball better than they did and we out-blocked them

Another error set up match point, and two points later, Reynolds secured the sweep with her 11th kill. The third set featured 15 ties and six lead changes. On the night, three players – Hanna, Reynolds and senior middle blocker Kelsey Snider – had 11 kills, while senior setter Deedra Foss had a double-double with 33 assists and 10 digs, in addition to three kills and a season-most five blocks.

"Jasmine ended up having a really good match, she just needed to settle down," Hilbert said. "Snider was steady the whole time.

Five of Hanna's kills came in the final set. On defense, five players had at least eight digs, and CSU out-blocked Air Force, 8.0 to 5.0, led by six from Snider.

The Rams jumped out to a 14-1 lead in Set 1 behind the serving of junior defensive specialist Kaitlind Bestgen. She finished with two service aces, the second night in a row and sixth time this season that she has had multiple aces in a match. Air Force ended up out-scoring CSU for the remainder of the set (16-11), but the early advantage was too much to overcome. Three early blocks put the Rams in front, 5-2, in Set 2, and CSU led by as many as eight, at 17-9. The Falcons, however, strung together six points in a row to cut the Rams' lead to just two, 17-15. From there, CSU would take over, securing kills from Acacia Andrews and Adrianna Culbert to force an Air Force timeout. CSU would continue its scoring after the break, taking the next two points, and eventually winning the set, 25-19

CSU has now won 17-straight sets - a season best. The Bams will have the rest of the weekend off before turning their attention to Boise State (Thursday; Social Media Night) and Utah State (Saturday; Pink Out). Tickets can be purchased here

No. 6 CSU sweeps Boise State Rams have won 20-straight sets, 16 matches in a row

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – No. 6 Colorado State volleyball swept Boise State Thursday night at Moby Arena (25-18, 30-28, 25-15), winning its 16th-straight match and 20th set in a row. Senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds led the Rams' offense with 14 kills on .423 hitting. Three other players were in double figures for kills, while CSU (21-1, 9-0 MW) totaled a season-most nine team aces. The win not only extends CSU's season streaks, but also improves the Rams to 10-0 all-time against Boise State (12-9, 5-4 MW), winning all 30 sets.

"We were serving tougher, being more aggressive and creating some opportunities," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "We're winning games because we're defending well and converting digs into kills."

Led by Reynolds, CSU totaled 51 kills – including 19 each in sets 1 and 2. Senior setter Deedra Foss had 40 assists, helping the Rams hit .319 for the night. Junior opposite hitter Adrianna Culbert had a double-double for the fifth time this season, finishing with 12 digs and 10 kills on .562 efficiency. She also had a team-high-tying four blocks

"I'm definitely seeing the court better," Reynolds said about her fourth-straight match in double figures for kills. "I'm a little more comfortable with hitting different shots. Our legs are feeling a lot fresher, so I'm feeling really springy, and I'm able to get up and hit over the blocker and hit it high off their hands."

In addition to Foss' 40 assists, the senior added nine dios and two service aces. CSU as a team had nine aces, including three from junior Kaitlind Bestgen, and two each from Kelsey Snider (wo also had 10 kills) and Jaime Colaizzi (who added 10 digs). The nine aces were the most by a Rams team since Sept. 6, 2013 vs. Virginia. Bestgen leads the Mountain West for aces per set, and has eight in her past nine sets played. While CSU swept the match, neither of the first two frames would come easy. Boise State led the opener by as many as five – 9-4 – and held a 12-8 advantage before a Snider kill got the Rams going. With Culbert serving, CSU took five points in a row – all on CSU kills – giving the Rams their first lead of the set, 13-12. The two teams were tied from 13-13 to 15-15, but a Reynolds kill at 16-15 put CSU on top for good. The kill was the first during a 5-0 CSU run. Overall, the Rams closed the set on a 17-6 run. The Broncos also led the second set, including late at 20-18. Again, though, the Rams were able to rally, end endin and again, it came behind the serving of Culbert. A 5-0 run put CSU on top, 23-20, its largest lead of the set, before Boise State would come back to tie the score at 23-23. The Rams held set point following a Snider kill, but Boise State fought it off and held its own set points at 26-25 and 28-27. A Broncos attack error tied the score at 28-28, and Culbert gave the Rams the lead with her fifth kill of the set. Another long attack by the Broncos ended it, giving CSU a 30-28 Set-2 victory, the highest-scoring set since Sept. 17, 2010 vs. Long Beach State

"We've been in that close situation so many times that it's second nature to us," Culbert said.

CSU never trailed in the third set, jumping out to a 4-0 lead on back-to-back aces from Foss and limiting the Broncos to .033 hitting.

"That was a really competitive test for my team," Hilbert said. "To battle through that second set and win, that was really good. This team has been winning close sets, and I'm proud of them. I'm proud of them as people and who they are. They're competitors, and it's really nice to see."

The Rams will play their annual Pink Out match Saturday at noon vs. Utah State.

"We were really tired after the first third of the year, and we're just starting to get our legs back," Hilbert said. "We're starting to see these guys play really nice and physical, and it's really good.

No. 6 CSU earns 17th-straight win with sweep of Utah State Rams celebrate their history by bringing back more than 40 former players, staff members

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – On a day the Rams celebrated those who have paved the way – bringing back more than 40 former players and staff members for Alumni Weekend – the sixth-ranked Colorado State volleyball team continued its winning tradition, sweeping Utah State (25-18, 25-12, 25-20) at Moby Arena. The win is CSU's 17th-straight, improving its season record to 22-1, 10-0 MW. The Rams are the first team in the NCAA to reach 22 wins. The team has also won 23 sets in a row dating back to Oct. 2. Junior opposite hitter Adrianna Culbert led the offense, totaling a 10 kills on .625 hitting (10-0-16), but it was the defense which stole the show. Junior libero Jaime Colaizzi recorded 16 digs in the three-set win, as CSU held Utah State to .009 hitting. It was Colaizzi's 10th-straight match in double figures for digs.

"Jaime is amazing in the back row," Culbert said of her teammate. "I feel like because we're getting so good defensively, it gives us the confidence that even if they do have really hard swings or if we're one on one on the block we still can get balls up and run our offense, which is good."

Off the bench, redshirt freshman Jaliyah Bolden had a breakout performance, posting five kills and a match-most five blocks. Bolden came in late in Set 1 and earned starts in the second and third frames. Entering the match, her career highs for both kills and blocks was two.

"Jaliyah did a good job," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "She executed everything right. She actually, in practice, has been playing better than that. It doesn't surprise me that she played well. When we get her into full steam she's going to be a pretty effective player for us.

Compared to last month's meeting in Logan, Utah, when the Aggies tallied 19.5 blocks, they recorded just 5.0 on Saturday, as CSU out-blocked the visitors. The Rams' defense held Utah State to .009 hitting, as Utah State committed 24 kills and 23 swinging errors. While the Rams never trailed in the opening set, Utah State hung close, and even tied the score at 16-16 on a CSU attack error. The Rams would separate from there, siding out with a Deedra Foss kill. The senior then went back to serve and posted back-to-back aces, giving the Rams a 19-16 lead and forcing a Utah State timeout. Foss' run would continue after the break as senior outside hitter Marlee Reynolds tallied back-to-back kills (she finished with a match-most 11 kills), and following a second Aggies timeout, the Rams got two more points to bring the score to 23-16. CSU limited Utah to -.054 hitting in the second set and took a 4-3 advantage in the third set and led for the remainder of the match

"We were, from a standpoint of scoring, hanging in there with Utah State, staying close enough, winning these sets and then the game. That's really good stuff. We did our job in terms of neutralizing them. Offensively, we didn't have a great match and I'm glad it happened in a situation like this where we still won

The former Rams who came back for Alumni Weekend were recognized on the court after the second set, and have been taking part in various functions throughout the weekend.

"It's just awesome knowing all the stories," Culbert said. "Listening to them reminisce about the time that they were here and how special they found Moby to be. Just to know that you're going through it right now, and that you're a part of something special that so many people come back to because they loved being a part of it is amazing

Added Hilbert: "This is a place where players have great experiences. You could look at teams that have multiple national championships and they don't have great experiences, because there's more to the experience than how far you advance in an NCAA tournament. That has to do with support, comradery, culture of the team, the fan support... those things are huge, and I think we do a lot of things right. I think it attracts people to come back because they want to come back and feel it again."

CSU comes from behind for 5-set win at San Diego State No. 7 Rams win 18th-straight match

SAN DIEGO, Calif. – After sweeping its previous seven matches, No. 7 Colorado State got a major test Thursday night, falling behind 2-1 at San Diego State. The Rams showed their resilience, though, coming from behind to defeat the Aztecs in five sets (25-15, 23-25, 20-25, 25-17, 15-5). The win was CSU's (23-1, 11-0 MW) 18th in a row and 27th-straight on the road.

"This win will make us better." Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "It tested us, and when vou're tested like that it makes vou a better team

After winning the opening frame by a score of 25-15, San Diego State (10-11, 5-5 MW) tied the match at 1-1 following a 25-23 Set-2 victory. The Aztecs rolled in Set 3, putting the Rams' backs against the wall.

"San Diego State played very well and kept errors to a minimum during those two sets," Hilbert said. "We struggled blocking through the middle of the match. They take some pretty good swings and have some kids who can hit.

CSU led for a good portion of the fourth set, but every time CSU would take a lead, San Diego State would chip away to keep it interesting. That changed when sophomore Acacia Andrews had a big kill to give CSU an 18-16 lead, sparking an 8-1 run to close the set and tie the match at 2-2. That set up the decisive fifth set

"When we won the fourth set I don't think there was a person on our bench who didn't think we were going to win."

Leading 5-4 early, CSU took complete control of the set, going on an 8-0 run behind the serving of Jaime Colaizzi and the attacking of Jasmine Hanna to put the set out of reach, 13-4. After the Aztecs earned a single point, senior Kelsey Snider had a kill and block – along with senior setter Deedra Foss – to close the match. CSU hit .667 in the frame (8-0-12), with four kills and a block coming from Hanna.

"It was a good experience for Jasmine," Hilbert said. "She started out OK, struggled a lot in the middle but played out of her mind in the fifth set. She kept composed, which was great to see."

CSU is now 2-0 in five-set matches this season. The other came at No. 18 Arizona State, when the Rams jumped out to a 9-0 lead before also winning 15-5. Snider had a match-most 14 kills on the night (on .448 hitting) – with 11 coming in the final three sets - while Adrianna Culbert, Hanna and Marlee Reynolds each had 12.

"Dri was incredible the entire night, and she does everything," Hilbert said. "She's all over the place, she's making defensive plays, she started blocking . . . She's a really, really good player.'

In addition to Culbert's 12 kills, she had 15 digs. Foss also had a double-double with a season-high-tying 55 assists and 12 digs. Colaizzi had several impressive defensive plays, finishing the night with 20 digs. At the net, CSU had a season-most 13.5 blocks. In addition to her career-high-tying nine kills on .350 efficiency, Andrews had a team-most seven blocks. Foss and Reynolds had five apiece, while Spider had four and Culbert totaled three. The Rams out-hit the Aztecs, .286 to .147, attacking extremely well in the opening and closing sets before dipping in the middle. It was the opposite for San Diego State, which hit above .300 in sets 2 and 3 but below .100 in the other three, including -.125 in the fifth set (3-5-16).

"Our team can struggle and come back and play well, and that's the mark of a good competitor." Hilbert said

No. 7 Rams drop 1st Mountain West match Hanna records 23 kills in loss at 2nd-place UNLV

LAS VEGAS, Nev. - After dropping its first match of the season - to No. 4 Wisconsin - Colorado State strung together 18-consecutive wins. The Rams will look to begin another winning streak after a 3-1 setback to second-place UNLV Saturday night at the Cox Pavilion (25-20, 18-25, 23-25, 17-25). The loss brings No. 7 CSU's record to 23-2, 11-1 MW. The Rams still own a 2.5-match lead in the Mountain West standings. CSU's 18-consecutive victories was the fifth-longest winning streak in program history. Saturday was CSU's first road loss since Oct. 25, 2012, a span of 27 road wins in a row, which led the nation.

"I'm proud of this team, and I still feel like this team is good," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "I think we have to get back and rest and regroup. It's a great streak, but you have to play one match at a time. Now we have to go play the next one '

Freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna had a phenomenal performance, totaling 23 kills on .340 hitting, surpassing her previous best of 16 vs. BYU. The kill total was the most since Adrianna Culbert had 23 last season at Denver, and marked just the sixth time in the past five seasons that a player has reached 20 kills.

CSU was limited to a season-low .144 hitting, however, and was bothered by UNLV's block all night. The Rebels (20-6, 8-3 MW), who entered the match ranked No. 2 nationally for blocking, totaled 15.0 in the match.

"They blocked and defended as well as anyone has all year," Hilbert said. "It disrupted us a little bit. I think we looked fatigued as the match went on. I felt like Vegas played very well and countered what we did. They deserved to win."

The Rams started off strong, winning the opening set, 25-20. Following a 15-15 tie, CSU scored seven of the next eight points to take control of the set. The Rams hit .353 in the opening frame, but that changed quickly.

UNLV held CSU to .000 hitting (11-11-41) in the second frame, blocking the Rams eight times and leading from start to finish. CSU trailed by a season-high-tying nine points, but never gave up. The Rams used a 4-0 run - including three-straight kills from Hanna - to get to within three, 16-13, before UNLV took over with six of the next seven points. CSU also trailed in the third frame, including by four at 14-10, but the Rams chipped away and were tied by 15-15. A play later – on a UNLV attack error – CSU had its first lead since the first set, and two players later, Hanna tallied her 17th kill (setting a new career high) and giving CSU an 18-15 lead – capping an 8-1 run. UNLV responded with three kills to tie the score at 18-18, and the two teams were even for the next three points before the Rebels scored three times in a row to take a 23-21 lead. Senior Marlee Revnolds fought off one set point before the Rams. fell, 25-23

CSU and UNLV would again be locked in a tight battle in Set 4. The Rams led by one at 8-7, but a potential point for the Rams was called a replay, and UNLV took advantage, scoring the next three points. Hanna's final kill of the night brought the Rams to within two, 15-13, but UNLV closed on a 10-4 run to win the set and match.

Joining Hanna in double figures for kills was junior Adrianna Culbert and Reynolds, who each totaled 10. Senior setter Deedra Foss had 48 assists, nine digs and three blocks, while junior libero Jaime Colaizzi had 20-plus digs for the second match in a row, finishing with 21. Sophomore defensive specialist Cassidy Denny had a season-most 14 digs.

No. 10 Rams fend off Bulldogs CSU gets back to winning ways behind Culbert's 12 kills

FRESNO, Calif. – Every winning streak begins with one victory, and No. 10 Colorado State secured that Thursday night, bouncing back from last week's loss to improve to 24-2, 12-1 MW with a sweep over Fresno State (25-21, 25-16, 25-20) at the Save Mart Center.

"There are a lot of things we didn't do well tonight," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "I'd like to see us play better, but we won despite not playing particularly well, which is good going into the weekend."

CSU out-hit Fresno State (6-21, 1-12 MW), .319 to .082, and tallied a season-high-tying 13.0 blocks for a three-set match. However, Fresno State kept each set close, leading in each frame. The match featured 23 ties and seven lead changes.

Junior Adrianna Culbert led all players with 12 kills, doing so without recording an error (12-0-17). Freshman Alex-andra Poletto – playing in her first match since Oct. 4 due to an injured ankle – came into the match midway through the opening set and tallied a career high and match-most seven blocks.

"She did a great job blocking," Hilbert said. "We need to get her more balls, but it was good to have her back on the floor.'

CSU trailed the first set 14-12 before using a 6-1 run to take an 18-15 lead and force a Bulldogs timeout. Fresno State would tie the set at 20-20, however, and following a big block by Poletto and fellow freshman Jasmine Hanna, tied the score again at 21-21. Culbert was able to help side out with her seventh kill of the set, beginning a 4-0 run to end the frame.

The second set was also close, but CSU was again able to find some separation midway through. Leading 14-13, senior Marlee Reynolds posted a definitive kill to begin a string of nine of 10 points, including three blocks. Three plays later, CSU finished the set on a Bulldogs attack error to enter the locker room leading 2-0.

Despite the close sets, CSU out-hit Fresno State .404 to .098 over the first two frames, and out-blocked the Bulldogs, 10.0 to 3.0.

CSU and Fresno State alternated points to begin the final set before scoring three in a row to take an 11-8 lead. While CSU led by as many as four, Fresno State cut its deficit to 20-19 with a block. CSU used its only timeout of the match, and finished the match on a 5-1 run.

"I didn't think we created a lot of offense from defense," Hilbert said. "We had a lot of blocks, but we didn't block great. We were good at the end of sets, though, which is what made the difference.

In addition to Culbert's 12 kills, Hanna had 10 while Reynolds had nine in addition to a season-high-tying five blocks. Senior setter Deedra Foss had 38 assists and four blocks in the three-set win.

The Rams, who are tied for the nation's lead with 24 victories, will have the rest of the week off before returning home to play Air Force Thursday and New Mexico Saturday. The Rams own a 2.5-match lead in the Mountain West standings.

No. 9 CSU earns 43rd-straight win over Air Force Colaizzi records 1,000th career dig

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - Playing on its home court for the first time in nearly three weeks, the ninth-ranked Colorado State volleyball team cruised to a 3-0 victory over Air Force Thursday night at Moby Arena. The win is CSU's 43rd in a row over the Falcons, and 21st-straight sweep in the series.

"I thought we blocked the ball pretty well, and when we were in system, we were getting good attacks," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "We still have things to get better at, but it's a win over a team which I think is getting better as the conference season does on.

The Rams (25-2, 13-1 MW) were paced on offense by seniors Marlee Reynolds and Kelsey Snider - they each tallied 10 kills - while Jaime Colaizzi had 14 dias on defense, including the 1,000th of her career. She becomes the 11th Ram in program history to tally 1,000 career digs. The junior currently sits in 10th place and is on pace to finish her

Trailing 12-10 in the opening set, CSU scored four-straight points – including a block and kill from junior Adrianna Culbert - to jump back in front. The remainder of the set, however, would be tight. The two teams alternated nine points in a row before the Falcons (12-17, 6-9 MW) scored twice to take a 21-19 lead. CSU called timeout and responded with a Reynolds kill and a block from Culbert and Acacia Andrews to tie the score. The Rams burned their second timeout after back-to-back Air Force points, and once again it worked, as CSU knotted the score at 23-23. A point later, sophomore Cassidy Denny tallied an ace to bring the score to set point. The two teams alternated kills before the Rams thought they had the set won when it looked as if Raquel Rosas' attack clipped the antenna. After a lengthy discussion amongst the officials, the Falcons were given the point to tie the score at 25-25. Visibly fired up, CSU buckled down and recorded back-to-back points on Falcons errors to win the set, 27-25.

"We were good at the end of that set." Hilbert said. "We were down 23-21 and ended up winning. We did the things we needed to do.

The second and third sets went much smoother for the Rams. Trailing 4-1 early, CSU went on an 8-0 run to take a 10-5 lead. The run came behind the serving of junior defensive specialist Kaitlind Bestgen, who tallied back-to-back aces – two of her four on the night. While the Falcons got within one – 10-9 – CSU again found separation before winning, 25-18. Air Force hit -.027 in the final frame, and CSU again was able to widen the gap behind Bestgen's serving. Trailing 3-2, the Rams took the next four points - including two aces - and led by as many as nine in the set

"That's really good serving; it's pressure serving," Hilbert said. "Air Force really isn't that bad as a passing team, but we got after them

CSU scored on 16 of Bestgen's 22 serves (73 percent), with 41 percent of the Rams' points off serves coming with Bestgen behind the line. The Rams finished with eight aces on the night. In addition to Bestgen's four, Deedra Foss had three while Denny had the key one late in Set 1. Foss finished the match with 34 assists and three blocks. As a team, CSU totaled 9.0 stuffs, including five from Snider. Her biggest play of the night came on a kill in Set 3, After blocking Air Force's attack on four-consecutive swings, the Falcons finally hit to the other end of the court, setting up a kill from Snider to give the Rams a 16-10 lead.

Poletto propels No. 9 CSU to win over New Mexico Freshman records 11 kills, 6 blocks in 4-set victory

FORT COLLINS Colo - Head Coach Tom Hilbert and the ninth-ranked Colorado State volleyhall team produced a complete match Saturday afternoon, beating third-place New Mexico, 3-1, at Moby Arena (25-20, 18-25, 25-18, 25-19)

Freshman middle blocker Alexandra Poletto lit the spark for the Rams (26-2, 14-1 MW), recording 11 kills on .421 hitting, in addition to a team-most six blocks in her second-career start. In two collegiate starts, the Toronto, Ontario, native, is averaging 3.29 kills and 1.29 blocks per set at a .601 clip. The 11 kills and six blocks Saturday were one shy of tying her career high for both categories.

"It was exciting," Poletto said. "I've been injured for too long, in my opinion, and I was ready to go. For the past few weeks that I've been practicing, I've been trying really hard to get back into it and get my timing back. It was a great experience to finally get the chance to play, and it was fun.'

Also spectacular on both sides of the net was junior Adrianna Culbert, who tallied a season-most 13 kills and 14 digs – her seventh double-double of the season. Senior Marlee Reynolds (11) and freshman Jasmine Hanna (10) had double figures for kills, while junior libero Jaime Colaizzi recorded 13 digs. Senior setter Deedra Foss distributed the offense with 49 assists, two blocks and an ace. Despite just five tie scores and two lead changes throughout the entire match, the contest was competitive from start to finish. Culbert had five kills in the opening frame alone, with her fourth giving CSU an 11-7 lead, forcing a Lobos timeout following the Rams' 3-0 mini run. New Mexico closed to within two, 22-20, but CSU scored the final three points to take the early advantage. The Lobos (18-11, 10-6 MW) evened the score in the second frame, leading from start to finish thanks in part to CSU's 12 giveaway points. The Rams, though, refocused, and had one of their most complete sets of the season in the third, hitting .355 and cruis-ing to a 25-18 victory. Culbert and Poletto each had four kills in the frame, while the freshman also tallied four blocks.

"It was more about calming down and putting that second set behind us," Culbert said. "We have to come out and not expect them to make a bunch of errors or to give us the game. We have to play our own game in order to win.

Trailing 10-7 early in the fourth set, CSU took the lead with a four-point run. Tied moments later at 12-12, CSU took the lead for good with a 6-0 run to put the Rams on top 18-13.

"We need matches like this, because the NCAA tournament is going to be like this," Hilbert said. "As hard as they are to sit through – I'm sitting there and am as nervous as anybody – when your team is playing with intensity, passion, getting after it, making defensive plays, watching, focusing, talking and doing all the things they're supposed to do, you're going to do well in these situations. We bounced back after the second set and played great in the third and then we overcame a deficit in the fourth. All of these are competitive experiences that are good for this team to go through, and I'm very pleased."

On the day, CSU was able to hold New Mexico to .139 hitting, including the Lobos' top two attackers to 18 kills and 12 errors at a .098 clip. Chantale Riddle, the Mountain West Preseason Player of the Year and a 2013 AVCA All-American, was limited to eight kills on .120 hitting and two blocks. She entered the match ranked in the top 50 nationally for kills, blocks and points.

"We did a nice job on Chantale Riddle and Cassie House, who are their premier players," Hilbert said. "It was a good effort, especially from a blocking and defensive standpoint. They did a good job blocking us too, but it didn't matter because we reduced the other error categories, served tougher and did some other things really well.'

Rams win 6th-straight Mountain West title with sweep over San José State Making her first start, Bolden tallies 8 kills, 4 blocks in historic victor

COLLINS, Colo. - History was made on Wednesday, as No. 9 Colorado State won a share of its sixth-consecu-Vountain West championship. The Rams swept San José State at Moby Arena (26-24, 25-14, 25-14) to improve -2, 15-1 MW, and clinch at least a share of the conference title. CSU – which owns the tiebreaker over second-UNLV and earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament - can win the title outright with a Rebels or Rams win over the next week. CSU has two matches remaining on its schedule. The Rams have now won 12 e conference's 16 regular-season championships, in addition to five tournament titles in nine seasons. It is the time that a Rams program has won six-straight regular-season titles. CSU won five in a row from 2000-04.

The Rams would never let the Spartans get close, out-hitting them .308 to -.128, and recording five blocks. CSU was again dominant in the third frame, hitting .500 (13-2-22), including six kills on six swings by junior Adrianna Culbert. After beginning the match with zero kills and four errors on her first six swings, Culbert finished with 10 on .333 hitting, tallying kills on 10 of her final 12 swings. In addition to two service aces, sophomore Cassidy Denny was one of three Rams with seven or more digs (8), while Foss had 35 assists, four kills and three blocks

"We still hit .300, our service pressure was good, and we blocked the ball pretty well after Set 1," Hilbert said. "We do a good job at scouting and seeing what's going on. We knew they were going to try to use us down the line, and they did.

Rams win conference outright with sweep at Nevada Snider records 13 kills on .619 hitting in 3-set victory

BENO Nev – After clinching a share of the Mountain West title on Wednesday, the No. 9 Bams won it outright on Saturday, sweeping Nevada (32-30, 25-21, 25-14) to improve to 28-2, 16-1 MW. It marks the sixth-consecutive season that CSU has won the MW, something never before accomplished.

"It's great, and I'm happy for them," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "But they're still focused on next week and doing well in the NCAAs.

Playing in their final regular-season road match, CSU's three seniors each had spectacular performances. Kelsey Snider - who missed Wednesday's match due to a head injury - returned to the lineup and totaled a match-most 13 kills on .619 hitting. She did not make an error (13-0-21), also adding a team-high-tying four blocks

"She played very, very well," Hilbert said of Snider. "She was not hitting any errors, and she was physically better than the players we were playing against. Combine those two and she hit .600.

Joining Snider in double figures was fellow senior Marlee Reynolds (10 kills on .304 hitting) and freshman Jasmine Hanna. Senior setter Deedra Foss had 45 assists, four blocks and a service ace.

After jumping out to a 5-1 lead in Set 1 and leading late 23-20, Nevada (7-20, 4-13 MW) scored four-consecutive points to reach set point. It was the Wolf Pack's first lead since 1-0, and while the Rams fended off set point with a Hanna kill, Nevada would hold two more. Each time, though, CSU recorded a kill to tie the score before holding its first set point opportunity at 27-26

This time, though, Nevada kept the set going. The Wolf Pack fought off four CSU set points before a hitting error gave the Rams a 31-30 lead and a Reynolds kill sealed the set.

"The first set was unlike anything that we've played this year," Hilbert said. "I was upset during it because we were not taking advantage of point-scoring opportunities, but we would turn around and side out well. We had 26 kills and hit .380, and only won by two points. We had way too many giveaway points on the other side of the ball. When we cleaned it up, we played a lot better.

CSU's 32 points scored were the most in a set since the 25-point scoring era began in 2008. Reynolds had eight kills in the set, while Foss totaled 24 assists.

"Marlee was outstanding," Hilbert said. "She was playing a different type of game today, hitting a lot of out-of-system balls. She really did a nice job.

From there, CSU took over, never trailing in sets 2 or 3. Following a 12-12 tie in the second frame, CSU used a 5-0 run to separate. Tied 3-3 in the third, CSU used a 4-0 run, which extended to 10-2, giving the Rams a 13-5 advantage

The win was CSU's 22nd of the season in straight sets. CSU has now won five-straight matches, and the Rams' .933 winning percentage is the third-best in the NCAA this season.

Rams send seniors off with Border War victory Seniors improve to 68-6 all-time at Moby Arena


FORT COLLINS, Colo. – After clinching the Mountain West title last Saturday at Nevada, the No. 9 Colorado State vol-leyball team (29-2, 17-1 MW) finally got to celebrate its championship, closing the regular season with a four-set win over Border War rival Wyoming (25-19, 25-15, 21-25, 25-20) Wednesday evening at Moby Arena. As part of Senior Night, the Rams honored their three seniors – setter Deedra Foss, outside hitter Marlee Reynolds and middle blocker Kelsey Snider – prior to the match, and after the match, sent them off by celebrating a sixth-straight MW title in front of 4.273 force abore program the Reynol (20th perspective). MOA to unspect her the a teach of 4,273 fans. As conference champions, the Rams earned their 20th-consecutive NCAA tournament berth, a streak that currently ranks seventh nationally.

"This was a great match in my opinion," Head Coach Tom Hilbert said. "It's really great when 4,300 people come out on the night before Thanksgiving. It tells you that the people in this community appreciate this team and respect them, and I like that.'

In their final regular-season home match, CSU's three seniors each had spectacular performances to pave the way for the Rams. Reynolds and Snider led the team with 12 and 11 kills, respectively, while Foss demonstrated her for the Rams. Reynolds and Snider led the team with 12 and 11 kills, respectively, while Foss demonstrated her all-around ability with 46 assists to go along with four kills, seven digs and five blocks. CSU's three seniors have been almost unbeatable at home during their careers, posting a 68-6 mark at Moby Arena, and losing just six sets at home this year. Joining Reynolds and Snider in double figures was freshman outside hitter Jasmine Hanna, with 10 kills, and freshman middle blocker Alexandra Poletto, who posted 10 kills on .364 hitting in addition to a career-high eight blocks. In her five career starts, Poletto has hit at a .506 clip while averaging 2.76 kills and 1.35 blocks per set. After CSU jumped out to an early 8-3 lead in Set 1, Wyoming (23-8, 12-6 MW) showed its persistence and clawed its way back into the set. The Cowgirls finally tied the set up at 13-13, and for the next few points, the two sides traded off whith Discher Laward at lower date at laward blocks are activatively back in the set. The turning point in the opening frame took place moments later, as a controversial call awarded Wyoming a point to the the score at 15-15. Hilbert protested the call and was issued a yellow card, but it ended up being a rallying point for the Rams. CSU responded with a 7-1 run immediately following the play to seize control at 22-16 before finishing out the set, 25-19. The Rams hit, 351 as Snider, Poletto, Reynolds and right-side hitter Adriana Culbert each tallied four kills. As the offense carried the way in the first set with 18 kills, the defense answered the call in the second frame, holding Wyoming to .000 hitting. Led by Snider and Poletto, the Rams tallied seven blocks in the second set after recording just one in the first. The Rams ended the second set on an 8-0 run, with Snider totaling four blocks and Hanna posting a kill and three blocks during the run. On the night, CSU out-blocked Wyoming, 13.0 to 6.0, and held the Cowgirls – who rank second in the MW for hitting efficiency – to a .174 clip. The third set proved to be much tougher, though, as the Cowgirls racked up four-straight points to begin the set. CSU regrouped with a 7-1 run to take a 9-7 lead, but the Rams wouldn't hold on to it for long. CSU led by as many as four points in the set before the Cowgirls came storming back late in the frame. Wyoming held CSU to just nine kills and eight errors in the set, and finished on a 7-2 run to win Set 3, 25-21. Junior libero Jaime Colaizzi was a star in the third set though, picking up 11 digs.

The Rams regrouped and returned to their dominant offensive ways in the fourth and final set. CSU picked up 15 kills and committed just one hitting error as six different players registered kills, including four with three. The Rams took the first point of the set on a Colaizzi ace and did not trail. Wyoming tied the score five times, including a late surge to even the set at 20-20, but CSU closed the set out with a 5-0 run behind Colaizzi's serving to clinch the victory.

"We really did play well, but I think Wyoming did also," Hilbert said. "It was a close match; it was a competitive match with two good teams.

The Colorado State women's volleyball program has become synonymous with consistent winning under the guidance and tutelage of Head Coach Tom Hilbert, who is in his 18th season with the Rams and his 26th overall as a collegiate head coach.

With nine Mountain West Coach of the Year awards to his credit in the league's 16-year history, it is clear why Hilbert's program has risen to the top of the league and has become a stalwart on the national stage as a perennial top-25 team.

Under Hilbert, who was inducted into the CSU Athletics Hall of Fame as the Hall of Honor recipient in 2006, the Rams have developed into one of the top programs in the nation, qualifying for the NCAA tournament all 18 seasons. Overall, CSU has played in 20 straight tournaments dating back to 1995, which ranks seventh nationally among active streaks. The stretch also includes five Sweet 16 appearances and 13 first-round victories.

Hilbert ranks 10th among active Division I head coaches (14th all-time) in winning percentage (.779), and 17th in total wins (634). Of those ranked in the top 20 for wins, Hilbert has coached the fewest total matches, owning a career record of 634-180. With the Rams' win vs. Nevada on Nov. 9, 2013, Hilbert became just the 10th coach in NCAA Division I women's volleyball history to record at least 600 victories and a career winning percentage above .770.

On Nov. 4, 2010, he became the winningest coach in any sport in CSU history, earning a victory over UNLV, his 353rd in Fort Collins. The win surpassed former men's basketball coach Jim Williams' mark of 352 victories. A year prior, Hilbert eclipsed the 500-win mark for his career. At the time, he was one of just two active coaches with more than 500 victories and fewer than 22 years of head coaching experience. Also in 2009, the veteran coach earned his 300th career win at CSU, moving ahead of his predecessor, Rich Feller, who won 299 matches from 1983-96.

The Rams won a sixth consecutive Mountain West championship in 2014, also earning regularseason titles in 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013. CSU is the only school in the NCAA to win its conference each of the past six seasons. In all, Hilbert has orchestrated 12 regular-season MW titles in 16 years, also adding five conference tournament championships in nine opportunities. The 17 total titles is more than all other MW teams - past and present - combined. CSU is 215-33 in MW action under Hilbert, never finishing lower than third. What's more, in 1998, CSU's final season in the WAC, the Rams won the Mountain Division. Of those who have played four seasons for the Rams under Hilbert, each has won at least two conference titles, with all but three winning three or more.

While at CSU, Hilbert has coached eight players who have earned AVCA All-America selections, including three in the past three years. On four occasions, a Ram has been named a Volleyball Magazine All-American, and 24 times one of Hilbert's players has been named All-America Honorable

Mention by either the AVCA or Volleyball Magazine. Under Hilbert, CSU has also earned 11 MW Plaver-of-the-Year awards in the league's 16-year history, and a total of 73 all-conference selections

In addition to 14 total conference coach-of-the-year awards - most recently in 2013 - Hilbert was named the 2013 AVCA Pacific North Region Coach of the Year, his second regional honor during a three-year period and fifth of his career. He was recognized in December at the NCAA Final Four in Seattle, Wash.

Hilbert has led his teams to 20 or more wins every season since 1992, a span of 23 straight years, including the final five at Idaho and first 18 at CSU.

Expected to be a rebuilding year after graduating four senior starters. the 2013 Bams rewrote the CSU and Mountain West record books, winning 27 consecutive matches, starting the season 27-0 and finishing the season with a .933 winning percentage - a program record. Since the start of the 2013 season, CSU is 57-4, the best mark in the NCAA.

Hilbert has also turned CSU's home court, Moby Arena, into one of the most

effective in the nation, compiling a 254-30 (.894) all-time home record. The Rams are 25-13 at Moby against ranked opponents, most recently defeating No. 12 Pepperdine (2012) and No. 5 Nebraska (2011). Hilbert has 42 total wins against ranked teams, including upsetting No. 1 UCLA in 2000.

With big wins come big crowds. The CSU faithful continuously rank in the top 15 nationally for annual attendance figures, even breaking into the top 10 on several occasions. The Rams ranked seventh in the NCAA in 2013, and with four crowds larger than 4,000 on the season, set a program record with 3,283 fans per match. Earlier this season, against No. 4 Wisconsin. CSU broke its own school and conference record with 7,018 fans on hand to watch the Rams battle the Badgers, the defending NCAA runner-up. Between Sept. 18, 1998 and Nov. 18, 2000, CSU rattled off 44 consecutive home wins, a Moby Arena record for any sport. More recently, CSU has strung together streaks of 21 (2007-08 and 2012-13), 20 (2000-02) and 16 (2011-12).

CSU has been ranked in the AVCA top-25 poll more frequently than all but 13 Division I teams, with many of those rankings coming under Hilbert. In fact, Hilbert led CSU to its highest-ever ranking - No. 3 for five weeks in 2000. On two occasions (2000, 2001), CSU has finished the year ranked in the top 10, and between Sept. 1, 1999 and Sept. 23, 2002, CSU was ranked 51 consecutive weeks.

Away from the court, Hilbert's teams have set the tone academically. During his tenure, two players have earned Academic All-America honors — Angela Knopf in 2000

and 2001 and Dana Cranston in 2012. Additionally, the Rams have earned 85 academic all-conference nods under Hilbert's guidance, including 43 over the past five seasons. His team's cumulative GPA in 2012-13 was 3.28.

Before coming to CSU, Hilbert accumulated a 174-72 (.707) record at Idaho - which remains the most wins by a coach in Idaho history. He helped the Vandals to the Big West Eastern Division title in 1996, and in the Big Sky, his teams won either the regular season or tournament championship every year from 1992-95. In each of those seasons, Hilbert's Vandals played in the NCAA tournament - posting first-round wins in 1993 and 1994 - and Hilbert was named the Big Sky Coach of the Year.

In his first season in Moscow, the Vandals went 15-14, a drastic improvement from the program's combined 16-41 mark from the two prior seasons. Just five years later, in 1994. Idaho recorded a program-record 31 victories (31-3). Hilbert coached the Big Sky's first All-American in Mindv Rice. He also guided Idaho to its first national ranking — the first-ever ranking by a Big Sky team. In addition to Rice, Hilbert tutored nine AVCA All-Region selections, four Big Sky MVPs and 20 allconference recipients.

Prior to Idaho, Hilbert spent five seasons as an assistant at his alma mater. Oklahoma, from 1984-88. The Sooners went 115-56 (.673) in Hilbert's five seasons in Norman, including two trips to the NCAA tournament and an appearance in the 1988 Elite Eight.

Away from the college game, Hilbert has coached several international trips through Bring It Promotions, including winning the Global Challenge in 2009 in Croatia and coaching a USA Select Team in Argentina in 2005

A native of Norman, Okla., Hilbert earned his bachelor's degree in business administration and marketing in 1984 from Oklahoma. In 1993, he received a master's degree in sports and recreation management from Idaho. Hilbert has resided in Fort Collins since 1997 with his daughter, Myles (14).
