Part 1: Research Questions

Please think of a topic that you might research and demonstrate how you would go about conducting an online search for materials on that subject.

Do you regularly use the following web-based services for your research? Why?

- Wikipedia
- CSU libraries' Find Journals tool
- Institutional (electronic) repositories
- Any other web resources you would add?

When was the last time you contacted a CSU librarian? What was your question? How did you contact them? What did you learn?

Do you use Wikipedia? Do you cite it in your papers? If you teach, do you allow students to cite it?

Once you find a resource that you might use in your work, how do you keep track of it?

What percentage of your research involves books vs. journal articles?

Do you belong to any professional organization? If so, which ones? Why/why not?

If so, do their websites provide helpful information? Explain.

Do you print out most of the PDF articles you find, or do you read them on the computer screen?

Do you normally mark on or highlight your text?

How much of your research is conducted from home vs. on campus? Where are you most comfortable working?

Do you subscribe to research-related RSS feeds? TOC alerts?

If you could create the perfect tool to help in your research, what would it look like? What would it do?
