Colorado State University takes very seriously its role in educating student-athletes. Excellence is expected on the field and in the classroom.

The most recent NCAA academic statistics reveal that Colorado State leads the Mountain West Conference in graduation rate for student-athletes at 66 percent - well ahead of the conference's overall student-athlete graduation rate of 57 percent. In football, Colorado State is second in the MW, graduating 68 percent of its student-athletes - again, well ahead of the conference average of 49 percent. Additionally, CSU student-athletes graduate at a higher percentage than the general student body.
Colorado State, however, is not resting on its reputation for

graduating its student-athletes. The state-of-the-art Anderson Academic Center, which has greatly enhanced the academic facilities available for student-athletes, opened in August 2009.

While the athletic department takes its role in the educational process very seriously, Colorado State's mission to provide a worldclass education is at the
 core of academic success. U.S. News and World Report ranked Colorado State in its top tier in its annual "America's Best Colleges" report. The university offers 72 majors and 27 minors, and many of its programs are ranked among the best in the country.

Bold New Era. Those three words have come to define the vision, direction and accomplishments of John C. "Jack" Graham's tenure as Director of Athletics at Colorado State University, since his hire on Dec. 1, 2011.

A successful business leader and former Rams quarterback, Graham was chosen by CSU President Tony Frank to lead the institution's athletic programs, and more importantly to apply the vision and drive necessary to produce excellence in every aspect.
"In Jack Graham, we have the perfect combination of dedicated Ram fan, stand-out athlete and experienced business leader with the skills and business acumen to energize and advance our overall athletics program," Frank said upon announcing the hire. "I am excited about the enthusiasm he will generate among our students, coaches, alumni, donors and fans. He brings high standards, high expectations and a passion for winning that is infectious."
Graham immediately went to work reshaping the department, beginning with the hire of Jim McElwain as head football coach on Dec. 13, 2011, from his offensive coordinator position at Alabama, which was on its way to a second national championship victory in a three-year span.
That move provided the first glimpse of what the Bold New Era would mean for Colorado State, and was followed by the high-profile hire of former national coach of the year Larry Eustachy in men's basketball, and the hire of Ryun Williams to lead the women's basketball program.
"We have the same expectations for excellence in our sports program that we have for all areas of the universi-


[^0]ty," Frank added. "With Jack's leadership, I see no reason why CSU athletics cannot and should not compete at the highest level. To get there, we have to dream big, work hard and settle for nothing less than excellence."

Immediately upon his appointment, Graham also announced he would drive a process to secure approval to build an on-campus football stadium at Colorado State to replace 44 -year-old Hughes Stadium, located several miles from the school's Fort Collins campus.

Graham succeeded in leading an ambitious process that by early October 2012 secured the unanimous recommendation of Colorado State's Board of Governors to Dr. Frank to allow the athletics department to begin the fundraising process for the stadium. It was another major achievement in just Graham's 10th month on the job.

More illustrations of Colorado State's Bold New Era came in the form of two significant business deals brokered by Graham and his senior leadership team in November 2012. The first was an announcement that Colorado State's athletic programs were entering into a partnership with Under Armour to provide apparel and footwear beginning in July 2013. The second came four days later when Graham announced a five-year partnership with 105.5 ESPN Radio to be the radio home for the Rams' football and men's and women's basketball games and coaches' shows.

In January 2013, the decision was made by Graham to add the sport of women's soccer for the 2013 season. The addition drew widespread praise for recognizing the popularity of the sport not just in Colorado, but nationwide, and veteran coach Bill Hempen was named the program's first head coach.

Graham also has set forth a clearly-defined set of standards for Colorado State's student-athletes, to go along with his commitment to providing the absolute best student-athlete support. His motto for all Rams is to "Do it All." The three key expectations are to succeed academically and graduate, be people of great character, and to win. Achievement in anything less than all three areas doesn't meet the expectations for a Colorado State student-athlete.

CSU's athletics department supports approximately 400 student-athletes competing in 16 varsity sports.
"Athletics play a critical role at CSU," Graham said at the time of his hire. "Our teams can and should be leaders in defining our university's traditions, and they can be catalysts that unite our students and community. I am honored to return to CSU and believe our success in athletics can and will send a signal about the overall quality of CSU's leadership, our standards and our talent. We are committed to winning while maintaining the highest level of integrity and student success."

Graham played quarterback for the Rams from 1973-74 and graduated from Colorado State in 1975 with a bachelor's degree in U.S. history. He was drafted by the Miami Dolphins. Graham went on to a successful 30-year career in the international insurance and reinsurance markets, where he was known as an innovator and effective leader.

In 1998, Graham founded ICAT Managers, a leader in catastrophic risk insurance products. He sold ICAT, including its Lloyd's of London business, in 2010 and remains on the company's board of directors. Graham also sits on the advisory board of the National Center for Atmospheric Research.

## TOM HILBERT

Head Coach | 17th Year at CSU | Oklahoma, '84
The Colorado State women's volleyball program has become synonymous with consistent winning under the guidance and tutelage of Head Coach Tom Hilbert, who in 2013 begins his 17th season with the Rams and his 25 th overall as a collegiate head coach.

With eight Mountain West Coach of the Year awards to his credit in the league's 14year existence, it is clear why Hilbert's program has risen to the top of the MW and has become a stalwart on the national stage as a perennial top- 25 team.

Under Hilbert, who was inducted into the CSU Athletics Hall of Fame as the Hall of Honor recipient in 2006, the Rams have developed into one of the top programs in the nation, qualifying for the NCAA tournament all 16 seasons. Overall, CSU has played in 18 straight tournaments, which ranks seventh nationally among active streaks entering the 2013 season. The stretch also includes five Sweet 16 appearances and 13 first-round wins.

Hilbert ranks 10th among active Division I head coaches (15th all-time) in winning percentage (.767), and 19th in total wins (577). Of those ranked in the top 20, Hilbert has coached the fewest total matches. Through 2012, he owns a career record of 577-176. Just seven active coaches have recorded more than 500 victories while holding a winning percentage above .750 , with Hilbert being one of them.

On Nov. 4, 2010, he became the winningest coach in any sport in CSU history, earning a victory over UNLV, his 353rd in Fort Collins. The win surpassed former men's basketball coach Jim Williams' mark of 352 victories. A year prior, Hilbert eclipsed the 500 -win mark for his career. At the time, he was one of just two active coaches with more than 500 victories and fewer than 22 years of head coaching experience. Also in 2009, the veteran coach earned his 300th career win at CSU, moving ahead of his predecessor, Rich Feller, who won 299 matches from 1983-96.

The Rams will seek their fifth consecutive MW championship in 2013, earning trophies in 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012. Just three other teams nationally have currently won their respective conference title in at least four consecutive seasons. In all, Hilbert has orchestrated 10 regular-season MW titles in 14 years, also adding five conference tournament titles in nine opportunities. The 15 total titles is more than all other MW teams - past and present - combined. CSU is 179-32 in MW action under Hilbert, never finishing lower than third. What's more, in 1998, CSU's final season in the WAC, the Rams won the Mountain Division. Of those who have played four seasons at CSU under Hilbert, every single one has won at least two conference titles, with all but three winning three or more.

He has also turned CSU's home court, Moby Arena, into one of the most hostile in the nation, compiling a $226-28(.890)$ all-time home record. The Rams are $25-11$ at Moby against ranked opponents, most recently defeating No. 12 Pepperdine (2012) and No. 5 Nebraska (2011). Hilbert has 40 overall wins against ranked teams, including No. 1 UCLA in 2000.

With big wins come big crowds. The CSU faithful continuously rank in the top 15 nationally for annual attendance figures, even breaking into the top 10 on several occasions. In 2011, a MW record 6,750 fans witnessed the Rams come from behind to defeat No. 5 Nebraska. Just two schools had larger single-match crowds in 2011.

Between Sept. 18, 1998 and Nov. 18, 2000, CSU rattled off 44 consecutive home wins, a Moby Arena record. More recently, CSU has strung together streaks of 21 (2007-08) and 16 (201112). The Rams haven't lost a home match against a current member of the MW since Nov. 4, 2005, a span of 45 straight contests entering the 2013 season.

CSU has been ranked in the AVCA top- 25 poll more frequently than all but 14 Division I teams, with many of those rankings coming under Hilibert. In fact, Hilbert led CSU to its high-est-ever ranking, No. 3 in October 2000. On two occasions $(2000,2001)$, CSU has finished the year ranked in the top 10, and between Sept. 1, 1999 and Sept. 23, 2002, CSU was ranked 51 consecutive weeks.

Away from the court, Hilbert's teams have set the tone academically. During his tenure, two players have earned Academic All-America honors - Angela Knopf in 2000 and 2001 and Dana Cranston in 2012. Additionally, the Rams have earned 76 academic all-conference nods under Hilbert's guidance, including 34 over the past four seasons.

Before coming to CSU, Hilbert accumulated a 174-72 (.707) record at Idaho - which remains the most wins by a coach in Idaho history. He helped the Vandals to the Eastern Division title in 1996 (their first season in the Big West), and in the Big Sky, his teams won either the regular season or the tournament championship each year from 1992-95. In each of those seasons, Hilbert's Vandals played in the NCAA tournament — posting first-round wins in 1993 and 1994 - and Hilbert was named the Big Sky Coach of the Year.

In his first season in Moscow, Idaho went 15-14, a drastic improvement from the Vandals' combined 16-41 mark from the two prior seasons. Just five years later, in 1994, Idaho recorded a program-record 31 victories (31-3).

Hilbert coached the Big Sky's first All-American in Mindy Rice. He also guided Idaho to its first national ranking, the first-ever national ranking by a Big Sky team. In addition to Rice, Hilbert tutored nine AVCA All-Region selections, four Big Sky MVPs and 20 all-conference recipients.

Prior to Idaho, Hilbert spent five seasons as an assistant at his alma mater, Oklahoma, from 1984-88. The Sooners went 115-56 (.673) in Hilbert's five seasons in Norman, including two trips to the NCAA tournament and an appearance in the Elite Eight (1988).

Away from the college game, Hilbert has coached several international trips through Bring It Promotions, including winning the Global Challenge in 2009 in Croatia and coaching a USA Select Team in Argentina in 2005.

A native of Norman, Okla., Hilbert earned his bachelor's degree in business administration and marketing in 1984, and his master's in business administration in 1989, both from OU. In 1993, he received a second master's degree, in sports and recreation management from Idaho.

Hilbert has resided in Fort Collins for 16 years with his daughter, Myles, who will turn 13 in September.

## HILBERT'S COACHING PHILOSOPHY

What is your coaching philosophy?
My philosophy in volleyball is you need to play low error and as athletic as possible. If you keep your errors down and you maximize your athleticism in all your hitting positions, you're going to beat a lot of teams, and that's what our goal is. I also have a philosophy that every player needs to try and make improvements and grow in all areas every day. Whether it's citizenship, academics or volleyball, that's an important part of what we do.

What is your favorite thing about coaching at CSU?
The support of the program. If you're a coach of volleyball at CSU, you know you're appreciated, you know the community is into what you're doing, and to me that's the greatest reward; that's what makes the quality of my job so high. There are a lot of places that have great programs and good financial support, but CSU is a good program with good financial support, and has fantastic community support. You really feel appreciated.

## What's the biggest selling point when talking to a

 recruit about Colorado State?The support that we get here. We're family-first, and we get a lot of support. You feel wanted, and you feel part of something special because of the support here.

## What types of people do you aim to develop your players into?

We want to develop them as citizens and community members. We want these players to learn to be good ambassadors of the university and the program; that is important to me. I want them also to learn to bond with each other, and make great friends with this core support group. That will enhance their experience, as well.

## What types of opportunities do players have after competing in Fort Collins?

We've had a lot of people play overseas, and have had three U.S. National team members and three Canadian National team members, in addition to countless professional contracts all over the world. What we want to do is prepare our athletes to live their dreams. If their dream is to be a college volleyball player here, we certainly want to give them that experience. Then, after that, if they want to continue to play and expand their game, we want to try and help them do that. We hope that they flourish even past CSU. A lot of players get better from ages $21-25$, which is really neat to see.

## What is it like to play in Moby Arena?

There's no doubt, it's one of the best venues for volleyball in the United States, hands down. It's a big arena, but it's small and intimate enough that at a volleyball match you feel like there's a lot of people there - and a lot of times at our matches there are. It's the perfect size; it's aesthetically a beautiful place. I really do think it's one of the best places in the country, and it's one of the reasons I love it here so much.

## What do you look for in a recruit?

The first thing we ask is, 'Is he kid physical enough to be at or among the best in the Mountain West?' Once they pass that test, we start to look for character elements, like are they a good student? A good teammate? Are they going to be someone who's willing to come in and be part of this family and grow every day? If they have all of those characteristics, we want them.


## BROOK COULTER

Associate Head Coach | 2nd Year at CSU | California, '01
Brook Coulter joined the Colorado State women's volleyball coaching staff on Jan. 26, 2012, as associate head coach. Due to her diverse background, she works with all aspects of the volleyball program, especially the outside hitters and first-contact defense. Additionally, she's the team's recruiting coordinator.
By coaching at CSU, Coulter was able to return to her hometown. A 1996 graduate of Rocky Mountain High School in Fort Collins, Colo., Coulter spent her childhood watching CSU volleyball. She attended matches at Moby Arena, and beginning at the age of 14 , even kept a threering binder full of newspaper clippings about the program.
Coulter spent one season (2011) as an assistant coach at Georgia, training the outside hitters and liberos, as well as coordinating camps, planning freshman transition and working with academics.
Prior to her time in Athens, Coulter was an assistant coach at Denver for four seasons (2007-10). There, she worked with the team's outside hitters and defensive specialists, in addition to many off-the-court aspects of the program. The Pioneers went 77-54 during her tenure, including a program-best 25-7 mark in 2008.
Her coaching career began at Nevada in 2002, where she organized summer camps and maintained a recruiting database. However, she then put coaching on hold to continue her playing career.
She played professionally in Europe from 2002-07, competing for teams in Austria, Spain, Germany and Slovenia. She was also employed by Bring It Promotions, where she directed and organized international tours throughout Slovenia and Eastern Europe.
In college, Coulter was a four-year starter and three-year captain at California. The outside hitter was named to the All-Pac-10 freshman team in 1996 and was a two-time member of the Pac-10 honorable mention squad. Today, she still ranks first all-time in Cal's record book in career service aces (162) and aces in a match (nine). She finished her career ranked sixth in digs ( 1,121 ) and seventh in kills ( 966 ), and in 1998 , her 56 aces ranked fourth nationally. As a senior in 1999, she was coached by long-time CSU Head Coach Rich Feller. Coulter was a two-sport athlete, also competing with the women's basketball team for one season.
Away from the college level, she was an assistant coach for a USA Volleyball Junior A2 team in 2011, and this past summer was the head coach for the USA Future Select National Training Program, working with the top athletes under 13 years of age. In 2009, she was the head coach for USA Volleyball's high performance A3 camp, and the year prior, in 2008, was an assistant on the bronze medal-winning USA Volleyball Open Adult Championship team. She also founded the Green Valley Ranch 12-and-under Starlings Club program. In June 2009, the Starlings captured the bronze medal at the Starlings National Championship in San Diego, Calif. As a student-athlete at Cal, she coached the Golden Bear Volleyball Club.
Coulter completed her bachelor of arts in integrative biology in May 2001 from California and was a physical therapy aide at the Nevada Physical Therapy-Orthopedic and Sports Rehabilitation Clinic upon graduation. Her parents still live in Fort Collins.


## MATTHEW BOTSFORD

Assistant Coach | 2nd Year at CSU | Tri-State, '98



Colorado State volleyball Head Coach Tom Hilbert hired Matthew Botsford on April 26, 2012. Now in his second season with the program, he works primarily with CSU's blockers and middle attackers, in addition to being the scouting coordinator.

Botsford, who has 14 years of collegiate assistant coaching experience under his belt, not to mention several stints internationally, both as a coach and player, joined the CSU staff in 2012 after one season as the head coach for the Swedish club team, Lindesberg Volley.

In his first season with Lindesberg, Botsford led the team to its first-ever appearance in the finals of Sweden's top league. There, Lindesberg knocked off the defending champions in the semifinals, before sweeping the championship match to win the Swedish Elite Series. With the title, Lindesberg qualified for the CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup. Botsford coached players from all over the world, including athletes from Poland, America, Ukraine and Sweden.

Botsford has spent more than a decade as an assistant at the Division I level, coaching at several universities, including Notre Dame and Miami.

From 2008-10, Botsford coached three Fighting lrish All-Americans - Jamel Nicholas, Christina Kaelin and Serinity Phillipst - and dealt with the development of the outside hitters and middle blockers, and the coordination of off-campus recruiting and scouting. During his stint, he also helped sign a pair of top- 25 recruiting classes. Notre Dame won the Big East regular-season title in 2009 and advanced to the NCAA tournament.

In four years (2004-07) as an assistant for Miami, Botsford tutored a trio of All-Americans in Val Tipiana, Frannie Savage and Karla Johnson. He also helped recruit Arielle Cook, Miami's first-ever Fab 50 recruit. In 2004, the Hurricanes finished second in the ACC standings.

Prior to 2004, he was an assistant for three seasons (2001-03) at IUPUI, helping lead a number of players to success on the court, including two-time Mid-Continent Conference Player of the Year Rebekah Pallikan. Botsford was also the interim head coach at his alma mater, Tri-State University, for the both the men's and women's teams in 1998, followed by a one-year stint with Indianapolis (1999).

Aside from the college game, Botsford has spent time as a coach with NORCO and Circle City Volleyball Club, and at Prairie Heights High School (Ind.). He also served on the coaching staff of the USA Volleyball Girls Select A1 Team for the 2007 USA Volleyball High Performance Championships in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. He returned to help lead the program in 2008 and 2009, as well.

Botsford played collegiately at Tri-State University (now Trine) from 1995-98, and led the Thunder to its first NAIA/MIVA championship. He was a four-time all-conference and academic all-conference selection, and finished his collegiate career as the school's all-time leader in kills, blocks and digs. In 2006, he was inducted into the Tri-State University Athletics hall of fame.

His playing career continued overseas, as he spent time from 1998-03 on the Midwest Professional Volleyball Association (MPVA) beach volleyball tour. In 2000, he was named the Extreme Volleyball Professionals Rookie of the Year, and a year later was named to the MPVA "Dream Team", which consisted of the top six players on the tour. Botsford won a bronze medal at the 2002 USA Volleyball Open Championships in Dallas, Texas, and was selected to the all-tournament team while competing for the Surf City Volleyball Club. In 2003, he played for the Vingaker Volleyball Club in Sweden, and was one of the team's most prolific players, leading the squad in blocks and hitting percentage throughout the playoffs. He guided Vingaker to the finals of the Swedish Elite Series and a berth in the European CEV Cup for the first time in the team's 30 -year history.

He graduated from Tri-State in 1998 with a degree in social studies education. He received his master's degree in business administration from the Indianapolis in 2004.


## BRI OLMSTEAD

Director of Operations | 6th Year at CSU | Colorado State, 'O6


Former Rams standout Bri Olmstead is in her sixth full-time season with the Colorado State coaching staff, and second as the program's director of operations. She is responsible for all off-thecourt duties, including scheduling, travel logisticis and organizing all of CSU's summer camps.

Olmstead, then known by Bri Frech, first joined the Rams as a player in 2003 after spending her freshman and sophomore years at Salt Lake City Community College. During the 2003 and 2004 seasons, OImstead was a consistent starter for the Rams, earning All-Mountain West and MW Championships honors while leading the Rams to NCAA bids in both years and a combined $56-9$ record. As a junior, CSU advanced to the Sweet 16, and during Olmstead's senior season, the Rams were ranked as high as No. 9 nationally. Olmstead was a rare six-rotation middle blocker because of her exceptional serving and passing ability.

In 2005, Olmstead served as a student-assistant for the Rams while completing her degree. She then played professionally in France for MVS La Rochette during the 2006 season. Her club finished second in the French league that year.

Olmstead returned to Fort Collins in 2007 to pursue a career in coaching. She was the team's video and statistics coordinator during the 2007 season, before joining the sidelines as an assistant coach from 2008-11. As an assistant, her emphasis was on first-contact defense and scouting.

## 2013 Outlook




All-Mountain West setter Deedra Foss returns to pace the Rams in 2013. After two seasons in the Green \& Gold, she ranks ninth in CSU history for career assists, and is expected to move into the top six this season.


Senior Samantha Peters can be a difference-maker for the Rams if she remains healthy. She hit better than .400 this spring, but was sidelined most of last season with a recurring back injury.


One of the top playing venues in the country, the Rams will play 15 matches in front of the Moby faithful in 2013. CSU finished 2012 ranked No. 17 nationally in attendance average, highlighted by 5,641 fans against No. 2 UCLA (seen above). Just three schools had larger single-match figures last year.

Though Tom Hilbert and the Colorado State women's volleyball team are going through one of the most formidable roster transitions in recent memory, the veteran head coach doesn't expect much to change - both from internal expectations and from those externally.

While the Rams were picked to finish second to San Diego State in the annual Mountain West preseason poll - a league they've dominated since its inception, winning 10 regular-season titles in 14 years and more than 85 percent of their all-time matches - Hilbert expects the bull's eye to remain on the Rams' backs.
"Because of our history and tradition, every time we play someone we will still get their 'A' game every time," he said. "They'll probably be salivating even more, knowing they might have a chance to beat us."

The Rams have won four consecutive MW titles, and last year went 21-8 en route to the program's 18th consecutive NCAA tournament appearance, a streak that ranks seventh nationally. However, the team graduated four senior starters which made up the bulk of the offense, defense and leadership. Because of this, some new faces will be forced to step up, led
by junior Deedra Foss and senior Samantha Peters, as well as junior Kelsey Snider and sophomores Jaime Colaizzi and Adrianna Culbert.

Foss has the pedigree, earning MW Newcomer of the Year honors in 2011 before becoming an All-MW member a year ago and an All-MW Preseason Team selection this fall. She already ranks ninth in CSU history for career assists, and over the summer earned a silver medal with the USA Volleyball A2 program, coached by the winningest coach in NCAA women's volleyball history, Andy Banachowski.

The others, on the other hand, are more of an unknown commodity.
"Deedra is great," Hilbert said. "She's been great these past two years, but getting to see her play with the A2 program in Dallas, I realized how much of a leader she can be. Jaime is also very good. I see absolutely no issues with her sliding into the libero spot, and allowing that to be a strength of ours."

## Filling the holes

While Hilbert feels good about the setter and libero positions, there remains plenty of unanswered questions.


Jaime Colaizzi is expected to transition into the libero role without notice. She averaged 1.99 digs per set as a true freshman in 2012, including 14 digs as libero against Northern Colorado.
"We have to find out who's going to play on the right, who's going to play on the left," he said. "There's been a ton of competition in camp, which always makes better players, but in order for us to be successful this season, we need a couple impact players to emerge."

After a strong fall camp, Hilbert says Culbert will start at some place on the court because of her versatility. Marlee Reynolds, Kaila Thomas and freshman Michelle Lawrence have been battling on the left side, with each showing strengths. Also returning for the Rams is sophomore Kaitlind Bestgen and senior Michelle Smith.

CSU will look to a trio of players in Peters, Snider and redshirt freshman Acacia Andrews to play in the middle, filling the void of graduating seniors Brieon Paige and Megan Plourde - both are now playing professionally in Europe - one of the most recognizable middle-blocking combinations in the nation.

Peters made a strong statement during spring camp, stepping up as a team leader and one of the top players on the squad, unofficially hitting better than .400 in three spring tournaments. She was hampered by an ongoing back injury last season, playing in just 13 matches, but Hilbert has confidence that she will make big things out of her senior season. Additionally, Snider, who moved from the outside to the middle for the upcoming season, showed hints of greatness last year ( 15 kills vs. No. 2 UCLA), but was inconsistent, averaging 1.76 kills and 2.05 point per set on the season. Over the summer, she traveled to China to compete in the BIP/USA Global Challenge.

## New faces

Three incoming freshmen will join the Rams' lineup this fall, including Lawrence, a 6-2 outside hitter and product of Walnut Creek, Calif. Jaliyah Bolden (6-1 middle blocker from Rowlett, Texas) and Cassidy Denny (5-8 defensive specialist from Sacramento, Calif.) round out the freshman class, which earned Prep Volleyball honorable mention status in the website's annual recruiting class rankings. Additionally, the Rams added senior transfer Cayla Broadwater,


As a true freshman, Adrianna Culbert started 25 matches and averaged 2.41 digs per set, which ranks third all-time among CSU freshmen. She will be one of CSU's primary attackers this fall.
who played three seasons at Connecticut before coming to CSU to compete in the high jump on CSU's track \& field squad, and now joining the volleyball team

## Top-notch talent

The Rams will again challenge themselves in 2013, facing four teams that played in last year's NCAA tournament. Early in the season, CSU will travel to national powerhouse Pepperdine to take part in a four-team invitational hosted by the Waves, who were receiving votes in the AVCA Division I Coaches Preseason Top 25 Poll, along with Texas A\&M, San Diego State and CSU.

The Rams will play 15 matches at Moby Arena in 2013, widely regarded as one of the toughest venues in the nation, including five non-conference matches. The highlights include CSU's home opener vs. BayIor (Aug. 30), Northern Colorado (Sept. 3), Missouri State (Sept. 11) and SEC power Texas A\&M (Sept. 21), which will also be the team's annual Orange Out.
"It's a good non-conference schedule, and I mean that; there are no gimmes," Hilbert said. "Cal Poly has a new coach, Baylor is improving in a good conference, UNC is always tough, Texas A\&M will be great and Missouri State might be the best team of them all."

With the additions of San José State and Utah State to the Mountain West, CSU will face an extended conference slate, featuring 20 matches with a home-andhome against each team. The conference schedule will begin with a home match against Border War rival Wyoming (Sept. 18), and will conclude against UNLV (Nov. 29; Senior Night).
"I'd like to win non-conference matches, but l'd really like to win the Mountain West," Hilbert said. "The preseason is about making ourselves as good as we can possibly be by the time we play Wyoming on Sept. 18. That's our target."

San Diego State, which shared the MW title with CSU in 2012, earned nine of the 11 first-place votes in the

league's preseason poll (CSU earned the other two). Past that, there's a lot of competition up top, with anyone having a chance to win the conference.
"There is probably more parity in the league than there's ever been," he said. "The winner will lose at least three games, I think. Our fans are used to seeing us win, which is great - we want to continue to win - but I think the matches will all be closer and more exciting, which is why we need our fans more than ever."

The Rams, who consistently play in front of some of the largest crowds in the country, ranked 17th nationally in attendance last year.

## A program of excellence

Since Hilbert arrived in Fort Collins in 1997, he has established Colorado State as a national power. In his time at CSU, he has won 16 conference titles, played in 33 NCAA tournament matches, defeated a No. 1 -ranked team and has become the winningest coach in any sport in school history. Nationally, CSU has been ranked more frequently than all but 14 teams in the country, and its 13 All-America selections ranks 17th.

THIS IS THE MOUNTAIN WEST
From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MW continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 15 th year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West has marked several achievements over its first 14 years of existence, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system, and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in four BCS bowl games, winning three. Additionally, the Mountain West was the first conference to have a member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utah's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is one of two conferences to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the MW was founded in 1999. In 2011-12, the Mountain West was among the first conferences to implement a league-wide state-of-the-art basketball instant replay system.

The Mountain West is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders five MW institutions (Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State, New Mexico and Utah State). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet - the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert cities of Las Vegas and Reno, home to UNLV and Nevada, respectively, while Fresno State, San Diego State and San Jose State add a West coast influence with their locations in Central, Southern and Northern California. The inclusion of the Hawaifi football program extends the Mountain West footprint to the beautiful islands in the Pacific Ocean.

## HISTORY

The Mountain West was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions - Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming - decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference. The split from a former 16 -team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long-standing athletic rivalries. Three of the MW's eight original members have been conference rivals since the 1960s (New Mexico, Wyoming and Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longtime members as well. UNLV and TCU entered the fold in 1996 and the Rebels continued as one of the original eight institutions that formed the MW in 1999. TCU re-joined the group with its first year of competition in the Mountain West in 2005-06. With conference realignment sweeping the nation in recent years, the MW has been proactive in addressing membership changes. Boise State University joined the Mountain West in 2011-12, followed by Fresno State and the University of Nevada on July 1, 2012. Also on July 1, 2012, the University of Hawaiti became a football-only member of the Conference. On July 1, 2013, the Mountain West further expanded when San Jose State University and Utah State University joined the Conference, bringing to 11 the number of full-time member institutions and 12 football-playing members.

## ACHIEVEMENT

The MW has produced 793 All-America selections among its 18 sponsored sports (men's swimming was discontinued as a Conference sport following the 2010-11 season) in the last 14 years, including a league-record 83 All-America honorees in 2010-11. A total of 131 MW student-athletes have also earned Academic All-America accolades in that span. The Mountain West has sent at least 25 teams to NCAA postseason events in each of the past 14 years, capturing three team national championships in women's cross country and producing 33 individual national champions in the sports of men's golf, men's cross country, and men's and women's indoor track \& field and outdoor track \& field.


Mountain West members have participated in 56 bowl games under the league umbrella, including four appearances in BCS games. The MW has earned 68 postseason bids in men's basketball, including 38 NCAA Tournament appearances and two NIT Final Four berths. MW women's basketball has tallied 60 postseason slots, including 32 NCAA bids, five Sweet 16 appearances and one Elite Eight berth since 2000. Wyoming won the MW's first WNIT championship in 2007 with a win over Wisconsin. In women's volleyball, the MW has had 36 NCAA bids with eight Sweet 16 berths and one Elite Eight appearance. Women's soccer has earned 27 NCAA bids since 1999, with two Sweet 16 berths and one Elite Eight appearance. MW men's golf has had at least four representatives in 13 of the last 14 NCAA Golf Regionals, while women's goif has had at least three teams participate in NCAA Regionals 11 of the last 14 years.

## 2012 Review

Already the winningest coach in any sport in CSU history, Head Coach Tom Hilbert earned his 400 th win at CSU in a victory at Northern Colorado. Afterward, a surprise party was waiting to greet him, including athletic director Jack Graham (above left).


Senior Dana Cranston was named the Mountain West Player of the Year, and just two weeks later, became the 11th Ram to earn AVCA All-America status. She was recognized at a banquet at the NCAA Final Four in Louisville, Ky.

The 2012 season was yet another memorable year for the Colorado State volleyball program, as the Rams won a fourth consecutive Mountain West championship and kept several streaks alive, including 18 consecutive NCAA tournament berths and 20win seasons.

The Rams began the year sweeping their first three matches at home, but struggled on the road, dropping their first five contests away from Moby Arena, including an 0-3 trip to Wichita, Kan., all against teams ranked or receiving votes in the season's first two weeks.

## A fourth straight Mountain West title

CSU would rebound, though, upsetting No. 12 Pepperdine (Sept. 7) at home, and picking up its first road win on national TV at UNLV (Oct. 14). With an experienced and senior-laden team, the Ra
$s$ were the heavy favorites to win the conference, but it took a lot of work. Midway through the season,

CSU found itself in the mix with three other teams, but not in the driver's seat.

The Rams, though, put together an eight-match winning streak to close the regular season, clinching a share of the MW title on the final night of the season, Senior Night, a 3-1 win over New Mexico.

The Rams have now won four consecutive conference championships, and CSU's four seniors from 2012 finished their careers with four rings, four of seven CSU student-athletes to ever accomplish that feat. In the league's 14 -year history, CSU has taken home 10 regular-season crowns, in addition to five tournament championships in nine years.

## All-Americans and other hardware

Four players were named to the All-MW squad in 2012, including seniors Dana Cranston, Brieon Paige and Megan Plourde and sophomore Deedra Foss.

Cranston was named the league's Player of the


The Rams had plenty to celebrate in 2012, going 15-1 at Moby Arena. The lone loss was a five-set thriller against No. 2 UCLA, which was played in front of 5,641 fans (fourth in program history)


Four-time AVCA All-West Region selection Megan Plourde became the second Ram to ever record 1,000 career kills and 600 blocks.


Setter Deedra Foss led the Mountain West with 11.11 assists per set in conference matches and was named a 2012 All-MW selection. After two seasons at CSU, she ranks ninth in career assists.

UCLA, CSU had won 16 in a row, fifth-most in program history.

## Hilbert's memorable win

Head Coach Tom Hilbert, the winningest coach in any sport at CSU, made history on Nov. 13, winning his 400th career match as a Ram.

In 16 seasons, Hilbert holds a 403-103 record at CSU. All-time, he has earned 576 wins, with his winning percentage ranking 15th in NCAA volleyball history.

## Continuing a proud tradition

With the MW title, the Rams were the league's automatic qualifier for the NCAA tournament. It marked the 18th consecutive season that CSU has played in the postseason, a streak which ranks seventh nationally.

CSU was paired up against No. 22 Purdue in Tallahassee, Fla., and despite a loss-the Rams' first open-ing-round loss since 2006-several younger players earned valuable experience, as CSU shifts its focus to continuing its proud tradition of excellence.

## Tournament Streaking

Postseason play year in and year out is an expectation at CSU. In fact, one would have to look back to 1994 to find the last time the Rams were not in the NCAA tournament. In all, CSU has been to 24 of the 32 all-time tournaments, including 18 in a row.

Just 12 Division I teams have earned more tournament berths
 than CSU, and the Rams' stretch of 18 consecutive appearances is the seventh-longest active streak in the country.

Not only does CSU get to the tournament on an annual basis, but the team wins when it gets there. The Rams have been to the regional semifinals (Sweet 16) on nine occasions - most recently in 2009 - and won their opening-round match five consecutive seasons from 2007-11.

Over the years, Moby Arena has been a host site for NCAA tournament matches 11 times, including the 2008 Regional Finals. The Rams have had tremendous success on their home court, going 13-2 in tournament matches at Moby Arena.

Michelle Knox recorded 19 kills on . 484 hitting against Washington in the 2002 NCAA tournament.


Casey Bauer led the Rams to their fourth regional semifinal in five seasons in 2003, tallying 15 kills in two matches, including seven on .500 hitting at No. 25 Maryland.


Dre Downs turned in one of the best matches in school history with 29 kills, six blocks and a .538 hitting percentage in a first-round victory over rival Colorado during the 2005 NCAA tournament.


In the 1999 NCAA tournament, Catie Vagneur averaged 5.0 kills per set to lead CSU to the regional semifinal for the first time under Tom Hilbert.

## Champions on the Court

Since the Mountain West Conference's inception in 1999, the Rams have been stalwarts in the league, winning 10 of the 14 regular-season titles. Additionally, CSU has earned five Mountain West Championships crowns in nine seasons (the tournament ran from 1999-06 and again in 2011).

The 15 total championships is more than all other Mountain West schools combined - past and present.

CSU finished at the top of the regular-season standings again in 2012, earning its fourth consecutive title. CSU's four seniors in 2012 finished their careers with four rings after winning the regular-season each year, in addition to the only MW Championships they competed in. Just three other players have won four regular-season titles in four years.

In 2013, CSU will vye for its fifth consecutive championship, a feat that has been accomplished once before (2000-04). In 14 years with the MW, CSU has won or shared the regular-season or tournament championship all but two seasons.

The program also boasts titles from both the Western Athletic Conference (1988 Mountain Division) and the High Country Athletic Conference (1984, '85), totaling 18 overall conference championships, more than any other sport at CSU.

## 2012 Mountain West Regular Season (co) 21-8 Overall, 13-3 MW

Losing their Mountain West opener for just the second time ever, the Rams rebounded from a rocky 3-2 start to conference play. Overall, CSU won 10 of its final 11 MW matches, including seven in a row down to close out the year. CSU knocked off New Mexico on the final night of the regular season to be crowned conference champions for the fourth consecutive season. Senior Dana Cranston was named the MW Player of the Year, and three others joined her on the All-MW Team, including fellow seniors Brieon Paige and Megan Plourde. Those three, along with Izzy Gaulia, capped their collegiate careers winning four regular-season conference championships in four seasons.



## 2011 Mountain West >> Regular Season >> Tournament <br> 24-6 Overall, 12-2 MW

Returning just one senior, CSU exceeded expectations, leading the Mountain West wire to wire and winning its third straight reg-ular-season title. Leading the way was senior Katelyn Steffan, the MW Player of the Year. Entering the MW Championships as the top seed, CSU accomplished two feats that had only been done once before. The Rams became the second No. 1 seed to win the Championships, also becoming the second team to sweep all three matches. Steffan was named the MW Championships MVP. Dana Cranston, Brieon Paige and Megan Plourde each earned postseason honors by the conference, while Deedra Foss was named the MW Newcomer of the Year and Head Coach Tom Hilbert earned his eighth MW Coach of the Year award.


## 2010 Mountain West >> Regular Season 26-5 Overall, 14-2 MW

Despite the target on the Rams' backs, CSU led the league wire to wire for the second consecutive season en route to its second straight Mountain West title. Danielle Minch was named the league's Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. She was one of four seniors on the roster, three of which were fouryear starters. Sophomore Megan Plourde and junior Evan Sanders were also honored by the conference, being named to the All-MW Team.


## 2009 Mountain West >> Regular Season 25-6 Overall, 15-1 MW

After opening the season 4-3, the CSU volleyball Team hit its stride in early September, winning 19 of 21 matches to close out the regular season. The Team rolled to a 15-1 mark in Mountain West action, claiming the program's seventh MW regular-season championship. Junior Danielle Minch was named MW Player of the Year, while senior Katelin Batten was tabbed the MW's top libero. Senior Tessa Nelson, sophomore Evan Sanders and freshman Megan Plourde each garnered all-MW honors. Head Coach Tom Hilbert was named MW Coach of the Year.


## 2007 Mountain West >> Regular Season 23-8 Overall, 13-3 MW

The 2007 season saw the Rams earn their sixth MW regular-season championship since 2000. Junior middle blocker Mekana Barnes was named the MW Player of the Year while junior setter Ashley Fornstorm earned all-conference honors as the Setter of the Year. Tonya Mokelki and Jaime Strauss also earned all-conference honors. The Rams went a perfect 14-0 at home including a perfect in MW play.


## 2006 Mountain West Tournament <br> 20-10 Overall, 11-5 MW

The Rams captured their fourth tournament title in eight years as they upset No. 9 Utah in the championship match. In dramatic fashion, the Rams topped the Utes in five games. CSU trailed 20-11 in Game 3 and faced one match point before winning the third game 34-32 and then rolling to the title. Sophomore outside hitter Jaime Strauss was named the MVP of the tournament.


## 2004 Mountain West >> Regular Season (co) >> Tournament 21-9 Overall, 13-1 MW

In 2004, Colorado State won at least a share of the Mountain West regular-season title for a fifth straight season. CSU won its first five conference matches before falling to No. 18 Utah in four games in Moby. The Rams then rallied to win their final eight league matches, including a threegame sweep over the No. 17 Utes in Salt Lake in front of a national television audience (CSTV). Colorado State went on to become the first host school in league history to win the Mountain West tournament, winning its second straight automatic berth to the NCAA Championship.


2003 Mountain West >> Regular Season >> Tournament
30-5 Overall, 14-0 MW
Colorado State became the first Team in Mountain West history to go through the regular season undefeated, and then became the first Team to ever win both the regular-season and tournament crowns in the same year, winning three matches at San Diego State. Nine of the 14 regular-season matches were three-game sweeps for the Rams, including six straight.

## 2002 Mountain West >> Regular Season 22-10 Overall, 12-2 MW

2002 was considered by many to be a rebuilding year, but CSU again proved to be the dominant Team in the league, posting a 12-2 record for its third consecutive title. The Rams won their first four matches, then fell in five games to BYU in Moby. Winning their next three matches in four games each, the Rams headed to San Diego State, where they were swept for the first time in 27 league matches -- a feat that had only happened three times in the existence of the Mountain West. CSU rebounded, however, to win its final four matches and again bring home the title.


## 2001 Mountain West Regular Season 29-4 Overall, 13-1 MW

Probably the most dominant Team in Mountain West history, the 2001 Rams posted a 13-1 record and won their first 11 matches -all in three -game sweeps -- before falling in five games at Utah. They then went on to win the final three matches, again in three-game sweeps. That year, the Rams won 37 straight games, second longest in school history to the 40 straight by the 2000 squad.


## 2000 Mountain West >> Regular Season 32-5 Overall, 13-1 MW

The 2000 Team started a streak of five straight regular-season titles, posting a 13-1 record with the only blemish being a three-game setback at BYU. The Rams started the conference season with eight three-game sweeps before losing to the Cougars. The Rams then defeated New Mexico in four, swept Air Force, defeated San Diego State in five and swept UNLV to win the title. In the tournament, BYU defeated the Rams in the championship match in Moby, snapping a record 44-match home winning streak.


## 1999 Mountain West >> Tournament <br> 30-3 Overall, 12-2 MW

The Rams began their dominance in the newly created Mountain West. After a 12-2 mark in the inaugural season of MW play, the Rams dominated the postseason tournament to lock up an NCAA tournament berth. Five players earned all-conference recognition, led by tournament MVP Catie Vagneur.


## 1998 WAC

 >> Regular Season (Mountain Division)
## 24-8 Overall, 12-2 WAC

Colorado State won its first conference title in 13 seasons winning the Mountain Division of the WAC in its final year in that conference. The Rams posted a 12-2 record, dropping only decisions at Rice and at UNLV. CSU won its first seven matches before losing in Houston, then tallied four straight three-game sweeps and a fivegame thriller against Wyoming before losing in four to the Rebels. The Rams won their final match to enter the WAC tournament as the No. 1 seed in the Mountain Division.


## 1985 HCAC

In 1985 the Rams posted an 11-1 record in High Country Athletic Conference play to win their second straight title. CSU won its first nine matches before losing at No. 18 BYU, and then swept Wyoming and Utah State for the second conference title in school history.


## 1984 HCAC <br> >> Regular Season <br> 26-9 Overall, 12-0 HCAC

The very first conference volleyball title for Colorado State came in 1984 with an undefeated record in High Country Athletic Conference play. The Rams recorded five of their 12 wins with threegame sweeps and an impressive 4-0 record in five-game matches, including the last two at New Mexico State and New Mexico to remain unbeaten.

## All-America Hardware

With annual success on the court, the country has taken note of the Colorado State volleyball program, and the type of athletes the school develops. In its history, CSU has produced 13 AVCA All-Americans, which ranks 17th in the nation.

In 2012, senior Dana Cranston was named to the All-America third team, marking the second consecutive season that a player has been honored. In 2011, two players - Megan Plourde and Katelyn Steffan - were selected by the AVCA. It marked just the fourth time that two teammates have been selected during the same season.

In addition to the 13 AVCA All-America selections, CSU has produced four Volleyball Magazine All-Americans, in additon to 21 total honorable mentions. What's more, the Rams have earned 41 AVCA All-Region nods, including at least two each season since 2007. Plourde, who wrapped up her career in 2012, became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Region selection. A complete list can be found on Page 115.

Dana Cranston was the team anchor as a senior, propelling CSU to a fourth consecutive Mountain West title and earning AVCA All-America honors. Cranston ranked second in the MW in kills, points and aces, and ranked first among outside hitters in hitting percentage as a senior. The native of Fort St. John, B.C., was a two-time All-MW selection, including being named the MW Player of the Year in 2012. She also became CSU's second-ever Academic All-American and was one of 10 national Senior CLASS Award finalists. While at CSU, the Rams advanced to four NCAA tournaments, and won four consecutive MW conference championships. After college, Cranston competed professionally with the Canadian National Team and in Europe.

## Megan Plourde | Somerset, Wis. | Third Team (2011)

Megan Plourde earned AVCA All-America status in 2011 after being the nation's best blocker, averaging 1.71 blocks per set. The Somerset, Wis., native finished her in CSU history in career ranked first in career block assists and second in total blocks. She ranked third in Mountain West history for total blocks at the conclusion of her career, in addition to being a dynamic and efficient attacker. Plourde became CSU's first-ever four-time All-MW selection and four-time AVCA All-Region recipient. During her career, the Rams won four MW titles, and advanced to the NCAA tournament each season, including the Regional Quarterfinals three times and the Regional Semifinals once. In 2011, she also was a Volleyball Magazine All-American and in September 2012 was named the AVCA National Player of the Week. After college, she competed professionally in several countries in Europe.

CSU won both the Mountain West regular-season and tournament championships in 2011, also earning titles in 2009 and 2010 with Steffan on the court. CSU ranked as high as No. 14 in the nation as a senior, and in her four seasons, the Rams advanced to the NCAA tournament each year, including the Regional Semifinals in 2009. The Dickinson, N.D., native earned the 2011 MW Player of the Year and MW tournament MVP awards after leading the conference in kills and points, which also earned her a spot as an AVCA All-American.

## Mekana Barnes | Highlands Ranch, Colo. | Third Team (2007)

Mekana Barnes will go down in CSU volleyball history as one of the most dynamic athletes to don a Rams uniform. Barnes was a four-year starter, and became one of the hardest hitters and most-feared middle attackers in the Mountain West. In both 2007 and 2008, she ranked among the top five blockers nationally, and in 2007 was the only player in the country to rank in the top 10 in both blocks and kills per set. During Barnes' playing tenure, CSU qualified for the NCAA tournament all four seasons, and ranked as high as No. 12, in 2008. She was named to the All-MW Team three times and was the 2007 MW Player of the Year, the same year she earned an AVCA All-America nod. She was an AVCA All-America honorable mention in 2008, and in September 2007 was named the AVCA National Player of the Week. Barnes played two seasons as a professional athlete in Puerto Rico, and trained with the U.S. National Team.

## Soraya Santos | Vitória, Brazil | Second Team (2001)

Soraya Santos became CSU's first two-year player to earn All-America recognition. After beginning her career at the College of Southern Idaho, Santos transferred to CSU, and as a senior was named a 2001 AVCA All-American. Her lighting-fast arm swing made her one of the best jump servers in school history. She earned All-Mountain West status both years of her career, and set the MW tournament record for aces in a match, with eight vs. Air Force in 2001. Her career .350 hitting percentage ranked second in CSU history at the conclusion of her career. Santos was born in Vitória, Brazil, and won two MW titles and four NCAA tournament matches. This fall, she begins her After her career at CSU, she played professionally in several countries, including Spain, Portugal and France.

## Angela Knopf | Troutdale, Ore. | First Team $(2000,01)$

Angela Knopf was CSU's first two-time first-team AVCA All-America selection, earning the honors in 2000 and 2001. She was the 1998 WAC Freshman of the Year and a three-time All-Mountain West recipient, in addition to becoming a two-time MW Player of the Year. She led the nation in hitting percentage in 2001, a figure that still ranks eighth in NCAA volleyball history. Knopf finished her career as the Rams' alltime leader in hitting percentage, aces and total blocks, and fourth in kills. The native of Troutdale, Ore., played in four NCAA tournaments, winning seven total matches. In 2000, she became CSU's first Academic All-American, again receiving the honor in 2001. She was inducted into the CSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 2006. After college, she trained with the U.S. National Team, and competed on the AVP tour for seven years.

## Courtney Cox | Longmont, Colo. | Second Team (2000)

A dynamic all-around athlete, Courtney Cox concluded her career as the school's top blocking outside hitter. In addition to being named a 2000 AVCA All-American, she was a three-time All-Mountain West and MW tournament selection, and also competed in track \& field as a senior. She helped the Rams to a 115-20 record, three regular-season and two MW tournament championships, and four NCAA tournament appearances, including the Regional Semifinals twice. In 1999, she was selected to the NCAA Tournament All-Region Team. Cox was also named the 2000 NACWAA State Farm Classic MVP, after CSU defeated No. 1 UCLA. At the conclusion of her career, she ranked in the top five for career kills and attacks, and was one of six players with more than 1,500 kills. She was inducted into the CSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 2011.

## Sherri Danielson | Evergreen, Colo. | Second Team (1984, ‘85)

Sherri Danielson earned CSU's first-ever AVCA All-America honor, becoming a second-team selection in 1984. The standout was also honored as a senior, being named to the 1985 AVCA All-America second Team. Additionally, Danielson was a two-time HCAC Player of the Year and three-time All-HCAC selection. She was a member of the U.S. National Team, and was an alternate on the 1988 Olympic squad. Danielson's No. 12 jersey was retired in 1992 and hangs from the rafters in Moby Arena. She finished her career ranked first in CSU history for kills, attacks, hitting percentage and aces. Danielson led the Rams to a pair of HCAC titles and three NCAA tournament appearances during her career. She was inducted into the CSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1988.

## CSU IN THE POLLS

The Rams have earned respect nationwide as one of the most consistent programs in NCAA history. In fact, CSU has been ranked in 238 of the AVCA's 446 all-time top- 25 polls. Only 14 teams, entering 2013, have been ranked more frequently. What's more, CSU has been ranked in the final AVCA poll 15 of 31 seasons, including four in a row from 2008-11, which also ranks 15th.

CSU's highest-ever ranking was No. 3, in September 2000, shortly after the Rams took down No. 1 UCLA. CSU's best overall finish to a season was No. 6 in 1987. The Rams have been ranked in the top 10 a total of 58 weeks, 19th-most in the NCAA. They have finished the season ranked in the top 10 four times (1984, 1987, 2000 and 2001), and are one of just 23 teams to ever be ranked in the top three.

Not only is CSU one of the nation's leaders on the court, but the Rams also get it done in the classroom. In 2012, Dana Cranston became the program's third-ever Academic All-American. During the 2012-13 school year, the Rams earned a 3.28 combined GPA, and a program-record six student-athletes earned Mountain West Scholar-Athlete status, given to those with a 3.5 cumulative GPA or higher. The figure was the second-most selections among MW volleyball programs. Since 1987, a total of 99 student-athletes have earned all-conference recognition for their academic success, including 34 over the past four seasons.

Members of the office, including volleyball contact Nic Hallisey, director Paul Kirk, assistant directors Danielle Marshall and Danny Mattie, media relations assistant Stuart Buchanan, as well as the team of student-assistants, are available to assist with your coverage. The office is happy to help you however it can. We encourage you to familiarize yourself with the policies relevant to your coverage of the volleybal program, as outlined on this page and the next.

Please feel free to contact Nic Hallisey via phone or email with questions regarding the media policy.

## GENERAL POLICIES

$\bullet$ Al I interviews with any member of the volleyball program, including Head Coach Tom Hilbert, the coaching staff and student-athletes must be coordinated through Nic Hallisey in the athletic media relations office.

- Me mbers of the media are strictly prohibited from approaching any coach, staff member or student-athlete by any means, including text messages, email, phone calls (cell, office or home) or social media, such as Facebook and Twitter, without first approaching the athletic media relations office.
-Re garding unique subject matter, such as human-interest angles, members of the media are welcome to approach the media relations office at least 24 hours in advance with requests to interview any member of the program. Approved requests will be granted.


## INTERVIEW GUIDELINES

-Inte rviews, either in person or via telephone, with members of Colorado State's volleyball coaching staff and student-athletes must be coordinated through media relations assistant Nic Hallisey.
-Me dia are asked not to request an individual's personal contact information, including email and cell number, but rather to contact Nic Hallisey.

- Stude nt-athletes and coaches are available for interviews at the conclusion of daily practice sessions. Student-athlete interviews will not conflict with classes, meetings, medical treatment or practice times.
- Inte rviews are not permitted in the locker room or training room. Interviews will not be granted on match days until following the contest.
- Telephone interviews should be requested at least 24 hours in advance and coordinated through Nic Hallisey. All interviews will be processed on an availability basis involving the requested interviewee.


## MEDIA CREDENTIALS

- Si ngle-match credentials must be requested through Nic Hallisey in writing at least three days in advance of a match. Approved requests will be mailed or can be picked up in the media relations office or at the match. On days of matches, credentials can be obtained just outside the west side of the Moby Arena court. Media members are asked to enter
through the McGraw Athletic Center doors (just east of the Moby Arena parking lot) and follow the ramp on the right down to the court. At the bottom of the ramp, a table will be set up with credentials.


## PARKING

-Me dia parking is available at Moby Arena. Please contact the CSU media relations office to request a Moby Arena parking pass.
-Ac cess to the parking lot will require an "A" permit from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays. A limited number of single-day passes are available through the media relations office. Annual permits can be purchased through the Office of Parking Management website: www.colostate.edu/depts/ parking.

## PRACTICE GUIDELINES

-Al I Colorado State volleyball practices are open to the media and public, unless otherwise noted.
-Duri ng the season, practice will generally run from 12:303 p.m. during the week, except on match and travel days. Please note, practice times are subject to change on short or no notice. At times, practice will end early, so please plan to arrive early. Practice will usually take place in Moby Are-
na, but contact Nic Hallisey for the most updated schedule. -Al I interviews must take place after the conclusion of practice. If this is an issue, contact Nic Hallisey, and the media relations staff will try and accommodate your schedule. Student-athlete interviews will not conflict with classes, meetings, medical treatment or practice times.
-Al I media should remain on the sidelines, standing a safe distance from the boundary to prevent collisions. Members of the general public attending practice are asked to sit in Moby Arena seating.

## GAMEDAY

- Ne ar the end of each home match, the media relations staff will ask those on hand representing the media who they wish to speak with. Approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of a match, Head Coach Tom Hilbert and the selected student-athletes will be brought to the Coors Auditorium, located in the McGraw Athletic Center, and will be available for questions.
- No s tudent-athlete or coach can appear on a live postgame television or radio interview without permission obtained prior to the match from Nic Hallisey.


## GAMEDAY SERVICES

- A pre-match meal is served 90 minutes prior to first serve in the team room. In-game services include live online statistics, box scores following each set and notes, transcribed quotes and statistics following the conclusion of the match. -The media room, which is located just west of the court at the bottom of the ramp connecting Moby Arena and the McGraw Athletic Center, will be open at least two hours prior to the start of a match, and will provide updated notes on both teams, statistics and other information. $\bullet$ Moby Arena offers complimentary wireless Internet access. Check the media room for access information.



## ROAD MATCHES

-W e appreciate your coverage, and if you would like to cover the Rams in person during a road match, please notify Nic Hallisey at least seven days in advance to provide ample time to request a credential from the opposing team.
olf y ou would like to talk to Head Coach Tom Hilbert after the conclusion of a road match via telephone, please notify Nic Hallisey prior to the start of the match. After the match, a member of the media relations staff will call you so you can talk with Coach Hilbert. Student-athletes will try to be made available, as well, if requested.

## REPORTING OF INJURIES

- At a Il times throughout the calendar year, Head Coach Tom Hilbert will serve as the sole source for injury information. All questions related to injuries should be directed to Hilbert, and not to any other member of the program, including athletic trainers, doctors, the injured student-athlete or her teammates.
