The University at a Glance




As one of the nation's leading research universities, Colorado State provides an excellent, accessible education, conducts research that transforms our world, and leads outreach programs that support economic vitality and improve the quality of life for people worldwide.

As Colorado's land-grant university, Colorado State was founded in 1870 to fulfill the vision of President Abraham Lincoln and others – to create access and opportunity for people in Colorado and around the world who can benefit from hands-on, engaged learning.

With more than 150 programs of study and 78 undergraduate degree programs in eight colleges – and a faculty-to-student ratio of 16.5:1 – students have access to a wealth of educational possibilities. Colorado State leads the world in disciplines such as human and animal health, clean energy and the environment, global and sustainable business, engineering, and climate research. Along with outstanding programs in the liberal and performing arts, humanities and social sciences, Colorado State offers some of the top professional programs in the country in construction management, occupational therapy, psychology, communications, and agriculture—and is home to the top-ranked public business school in the state.

Challenging academic programs and world-changing research are hallmarks of Colorado State, and it is our special commitment to service, outreach, and transforming our world through innovation that sets this university apart. Even more important, CSU's character is reflected in the quality of our students and graduates, who embody the university's mission of service and go on to make a significant impact on our world when they graduate.

Colorado State University takes very seriously its role in educating student-athletes. Excellence is expected on the field and in the classroom.

The most recent NCAA academic statistics reveal that Colorado State leads the Mountain West Conference in graduation rate for student-athletes at 66 percent – well ahead of the conference's overall student-athlete graduation rate of 57 percent. In football, Colorado State is second in the MWC, graduating 68 percent of its student-athletes – again, well ahead of the conference average of 49 percent.

Colorado State, however, is not resting on its reputation for graduating its student-athletes. The state-of-the-art Anderson Academic Center, which will greatly enhance




the academic facilities available for student-athletes, opened in August 2009.

While the athletic department takes its role in the educational process very seriously, Colorado State's mission to provide a world-class education is at the core of academic success. U.S. News and World Report ranked Colorado State in its top tier in its annual "America's Best Colleges" report. The university offers 79 majors and 27 minors, and many of its programs are ranked among the best in the country.

Colorado State continues to push forward in its mission to provide the best possible education. Construction recently was completed on the state-of-the-art University Center for the Arts and Computer Science buildings, along with the indoor practice facility, academic and training center, and the Rockwell Hall expansion at the College of Business.

- CSU's Veterinary Medicine program ranks second in the country and is the national leader in federal research dollars.
- *BusinessWeek* ranked CSU's undergraduate College of Business program 67th (up from 73rd in 2008). The program ranks 30th among all public schools and 14th among all colleges and universities in the West and Southwest. The marketing and business law programs were ranked in the nation's Top 10 by the magazine.
- In December 2008, CSU conferred its 150,000th bachelor's degree and 200,000th overall degree.
- According to NCAA statistics, CSU's graduation rate for student-athletes is higher than the graduation rate for the overall student body.




One of Colorado's most vibrant cities, Fort Collins is the best place in the country to live, work and play. Located on the northern Front Range of the majestic Rocky Mountains, the city is within an hour's drive of Denver, the nation's 25th-largest metro area.

This city of 137,200 residents basks in 300 days of sunshine per year — more than San Diego and Florida — and includes the historic Old Town district with its restaurants, shops, and entertainment, all within walking distance of Colorado State University's campus.

Since its founding as a military fort in 1864, Fort Collins has anchored northern Colorado's rich heritage of academic, business and recreational pursuits. Hiking, mountain biking, kayaking, river rafting and rock climbing are just a few popular outdoor pursuits for students and residents.

The city maintains more than 600 acres of parks, 5,000 acres of natural areas, 20 miles of off-street trails for hiking and biking, and three golf courses. The Lincoln Center and the University Center for the Arts, anchored in Fort Collins, are northern Colorado's cultural arts centers.








The Denver Metro Area, with a population of 2.4 million, is less than an hour's drive from Fort Collins. A major-league metropolis, named by the *Sporting News* the best sports city in the United States, Denver is home to three teams that have competed for their respective world championships in the past 12 years — the Super Bowl XXXII and XXXIII champion Denver Broncos, the 1996 and 2001 Stanley Cup champion Colorado Avalanche, and the 2007 National League champion Colorado Rockies, who lost the World Series that season to the Boston Red Sox. The Denver Nuggets, meanwhile, have made the playoffs in XX consecutive seasons, including a trip to the 2009 Western Conference finals against the eventual champion Los Angeles Lakers.

Sports fans in Colorado are among the most passionate in the nation, and for good reason — their teams are winners.

Denver has all the features of any big city, including great shopping and nightlife on the 16th Street Mall (Denver Pavilions, below left), a one-of-a-kind concert venue in Red Rocks Amphitheatre (below, second from right), an adrenaline-inducing amusement park in Elitch Gardens, and the world's 10th-busiest airport, Denver International. Nicknamed the Mile High City because it is one mile above sea level, downtown Denver is home to the Colorado state capitol building, the 13th step of which is exactly one mile in elevation.



New Academic & Training Center



Cost: \$7 million
Size: 16,000 square feet,
Location: Southeast of the McGraw Athletic Center

Features:

- Training portion includes a state-of-the-art weight room, strength and conditioning offices, a nutrition center and restrooms.
- Academic center features five private tutorial rooms and large study areas
- Includes a computer lab with 30 workstations, more workspace and offices for CSU's academic staff.

In 1998, Colorado State enhanced its weight room and built an academic center as part of the McGraw Athletic Center project, but these facilities no longer meet the needs of its expanded student-athlete base, nor do they allow the Rams to compete for top-quality recruits.

Because of the heavy time constraints placed on CSU student-athletes through practice, travel, strength and conditioning, and community service, a quality learning environment is essential for the university's student-athletes to achieve the high standards of academic success expected of them.


The Academic and Training Center is the latest centerpiece for CSU's athletic program and support its mission to recruit, educate, develop, and graduate Rams student-athletes within an environment that prusues excellence, values integrity and ethical conduct, promotes respect for all individuals, teaches sportsmanship, entertains our constituents and emphasizes championship performance.

New Indoor Practice Facility

Every CSU program benefits from the Rams' new facilities. The Indoor Practice Facility will be used by all of the Rams' sports teams, whether they are in season or involved in offseason conditioning.



Cost: \$13 million
Size: 66,267 square feet, including 48,125 dedicated to the football portion and 8,827 to the basketball and volleyball areas
Height: 65 feet at its tallest point
Location: East of Moby Pool and north of the Student Recreation Center

Features:

- Gymnasium easily encloses a regulation basketball court and two half courts.
- Volleyball configuration can accommodate two full-length courts.
- Contains a 70-yard synthetic-turf football field (including one end zone).
- Features a four-lane, 70-meter track and a unique shoe-changing room adjacent to the football field.
- Has flexibility to allow the softball team to set up batting cages on the football field.
- Will provide shelter for any student-athlete in each of the Rams' 16 varsity sports.
- Includes training room, equipment storage, lobby and trophy display case, and rest-rooms.
- Uses an innovative air circulation system.



Moby Arena



Colorado State University boasts a rich and proud basketball tradition that dates back more than 100 years.

Part of that proud history includes one of the most distinctive and effective homecourt playing facilities in the nation. The team's home arena, Moby Arena, is a cozy and intimate playing facility nestled in the heart of the university's central campus area.

It's also an arena that through the years has spawned Moby Madness, the support of fans witnessing Rams basketball.

The arena features the pride and tradition of the Rams program that dates back a century and a newness associated with renovation projects completed in 1999, 2001 and 2009.


When the initial renovation was completed in 1999, the entire facility had undergone a major facelift, including all-new seating, meeting rooms, and a new locker room and player lounge area - which were again updated for the 2009-10 season.

In 2001, another renovation took place in Moby Arena when an entirely new playing surface was installed. More than 23,000 square feet of hardwood was installed on the floor of the arena.

In addition, the 2010-11 season marks the first for CSU's new \$1 million state-of-the-art videoboard system.

The combination of attractive playing facility, CSU's rich basketball history, and local university support combine to form Moby Madness.




Facilities Upgrades

The men's basketball locker room at Colorado State received major upgrades in 2009, including an expanded dressing area, floor-to-ceiling lockers, and an upgraded player lounge and meeting area complete with all the amenities, including a high-definition television.

In addition, the Rams now have access to state-of-the-art academic and weight-training facilities at the Academic & Training Center, and a brand new basketball practice gym at the Indoor Practice Facility. In total, more than \$20 million in upgrades have been made to CSU basketball facilities in the last year.




Season Pass: Colorado State Men's Basketball

Head Coach Tim Miles



TIM MILES | UNIVERSITY OF MARY (1989) FOURTH SEASON AT CSU (32-63), 16TH SEASON OVERALL (244-195)

When Tim Miles came to Colorado State University to coach men's basketball, he arrived on campus with a winning attitude and a smile. Both are essential to the program Miles is building with the Rams. His personality draws fans and student-athletes alike to him. His attitude is apparent in the feats that sprinkle through his resume.

Despite a pair of injury-plagued seasons to begin his tenure at Colorado State, Miles, his staff, and the team beat the odds time and time again, taking the first steps to re-establishing Colorado State men's basketball as a power in the Mountain West Conference, and on a national stage.

In 2007-08, Miles' first with the program, he led a roster that featured just one returning starter to early season success, including a tournament championship at the BP Top of World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska. And, after battling through a tough conference slate, the Rams ended the season on a high note with a victory over rival Wyoming in the opening round of the Mountain West Conference tournament.

His second season at Moby proved to be just as fruitful as the Rams continued to make strides. Miles led the Rams to early season victories over Montana and Northern Colorado, both of which had beaten the Rams the previous year, and CSU took national power Minnesota, led by Tubby Smith, to the brink of defeat before falling 72-71 at Moby Arena. In addition, the Rams boosted their win column with four conference wins against UNLV, Air Force (twice) and TCU.

The diligence and hard work shown by Miles, his staff, and the student-athletes he has recruited to Colorado State, continued to pay dividends in 2009-10. The Rams came into Miles' third season looking to take the next step, and did not disappoint, finishing tied for fifth in the MWC standings and making their first postseason appearance since 2003 with a berth in the 2010 College Basketball Invitational (CBI). CSU closed the season with 16 wins, marking the most by a Rams squad since future NBA first-round draft pick Jason Smith led the team to 17 wins in the 2007 season. For his efforts, Miles was selected as the 2010 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year by CollegeInsider.com.

Miles' persistence and hard work has not gone unnoticed by Colorado State and Athletic Director Paul Kowalczyk. In 2008, Miles was rewarded with a contract extension, and is now signed through the 2012-13 season.

"This university is committed to Tim and his staff," Kowalczyk said. "His leadership during tough times convinces us that we have the coach to lead our program to the upper echelon of the Mountain West."

Off the court, Miles believes strongly in academics, family and CSU.

"My job is to come in and establish a winning mentality in our basketball program," Miles said. "That means we're going to win outside hanging out with the students, we're going to win in the classroom when it comes to grades and we're going to win on the basketball floor."

While establishing a tradition of winning in college basketball, Miles' philosophy extends far beyond the basketball court. He and his staff are committed to academics and the success of their student-athletes in the classroom.

"It is essential that our players realize the value of their education at CSU," Miles said. "Academics are our top priority. We also want to represent this program, this university, and this community in a first-class manner at all times."

With 15 years of experience as a head coach at four institutions, he has compiled a career record of 244-195 that includes three conference championships and three national tournament appearances.

At North Dakota State, Miles earned 16 wins in each of his last five seasons, knocked off No. 8 Marquette and No. 15 Wisconsin both on the road, and finished as one of only two independent programs with a winning record in 2006-07.

He also previously served as the head coach at Southwest Minnesota State University from 1997-2001 and Mayville State University from 1995-97. Miles began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant at Northern State, where he served from 1989-95.

A native of Doland, S.D., Miles earned his bachelor's degree in Elementary Education and Health/Physical Education from the University of Mary in 1989. He went on to earn his master's degree in Health and Physical Science from Northern State in 1990.

Miles, and his wife, Kari, reside in Fort Collins with their Daughter Ava, and son Gabriel.

Niko Medved returns to the Rams for his fourth season as an assistant coach.

During his time at Colorado State, Medved has filled a key role for the Rams, serving as CSU's recruiting coordinator and director of player development.

A knowledgeable bench coach with plenty of experience, Medved handles scouting responsibilities and works primarily with the guards throughout the season.

During the 2009-10 season, freshman guard Dorian Green led all players with 11.8 points, third most all-time among CSU freshmen. Medved also helped develop the play of senior Adam Nigon, who has transformed from a walk-on during the 2007-08 season to a key contributor, starting all 32 games as a junior, averaging 8.7 points and tying for the team lead with 59 three-pointers.

Prior to joining Miles' staff in Fort Collins, Medved spent one season at the University of Minnesota. He was involved in all aspects of the program, including recruiting, scouting, player development and fundraising.

Preceding his year in Minnesota, he spent seven seasons as an assistant at Furman University. Medved served as the interim head coach in the spring of 2006. During his tenure, the Paladins had the highest scoring freshman class in the country.


Medved started his career at the University of Minnesota in 1992 when he was a student manager and spent one year as a student-assistant. He also worked four years as an instructor at the prestigious Nike All-America camp.

Medved completed his B.S. in kinesiology in 1997 and his master's in sport management in 1999. While attending graduate school, he spent two seasons as the associate head coach at Division III Macalester College, leading the school to its first ever playoff berth in 2001, in addition to a win over Division I Yale.

A native of St. Paul, Minn., he attended Roseville Area High School and was a two-sport standout in both basketball and golf.

Medved makes his home in Fort Collins and is engaged to Erica Nesselroad. The two plan to get married this August.

Miles on Medved: "Niko is a do-it-all guy. He can coach, he can recruit, he handles the players well and he's great in workouts. He's really a fine young coach."



CRAIG SMITH | COLORADO STATE (2006) FOURTH SEASON AT COLORADO STATE

Craig Smith returns to the Rams staff for his fourth season overall, and his third as an assistant coach after making the transition from director of operations during the 2008-09 season.

Smith handles scouting of opponents, and works primarily with power forwards and centers. He also is responsible for recruiting, and leads player development for the Rams.

Prior to Smith's arrival at Colorado State, he spent three seasons as head men's basketball coach at Mayville State University, where he compiled a record of 72-29 while advancing to three straight NAIA II national tournaments, including a trip to the NAIA II national championship game in 2007.

In his first season as a head coach in 2004-05, Smith resurrected a program that had won just a single game the year prior to his arrival, and immediately earned a berth in the NAIA II national tournament, a 16-game improvement. Smith followed that up in 2005-06 with a 28-6 mark, setting a record for most wins in school history while winning MSU's first ever Dakota Athletic Conference regular-season and tournament championships. MSU advanced all the way to the national quarterfinals before losing to the eventual national champions. In 2006-07 MSU finished with a 27-9 record under Smith's leadership, winning MSU's second consecutive DAC regular-season and tournament championships and earning a spot in the NAIA II national championship game. Mayville's run to the national championship game marked the first time any men's basketball team from North Dakota had ever played for a national title.

Smith was named the NAIA II National Coach of the Year in 2007. He was also named Dakota Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007. Smith's MSU teams were characterized by their hard work and first-class attitude on and off the court. Mayville State's 2006-07 team was honored and recognized nationally with the Dr. James Naismith-Emil Liston Sportsmanship Award.

A native of Stephen, Minn., Smith began his collegiate coaching career at Mayville State University during the 1996-97 season. An assistant to then-Mayville State Head Coach Tim Miles, MSU went 18-11, won the regular season NDCAC title and the conference postseason tournament before advancing to the NAIA II national tournament.

Smith then worked as a graduate assistant at Northern State University during the 1997-98 season, followed by time at Minot State University as an assistant coach for three years, and then as an assistant coach and director of basketball operations under Miles at North Dakota State University.

Smith is a 1996 graduate of the University of North Dakota with a bachelor's degree in secondary education. He earned his master's degree from Northern State in teaching and learning. Smith and his wife, Darcy, have three boys—Landon (9), Brady (7) and Carson (5) and a daughter—Lauren, who turns one in January.

Miles on Smith: "Craig is an outstanding coach. I've hired him three times, and there's a reason for that. I believe in the way he conducts himself, he's an excellent recruiter and schematically, he's really a good tactician when it comes to basketball."

He also served as founder and head coach of the Las Vegas Prospects AAU team for five years. During his tenure the team was ranked among the top five AAU teams on the west coast. Slocum has worked at various collegiate basketball development camps across America, as well as the West Coast All-Star Camp and the Adidas Superstar Camp.

Slocum is single and makes his home in Fort Collins.

Miles on Slocum: "DeMarlo Slocum is an excellent young coach. His energy level is through the roof. Guys gravitate toward him, and he's an excellent recruiter. The Mountain West has claimed the 2009-10 Bowl Challenge Cup for the third time in six years after sending five football teams into postseason action and finishing with a 4-1 mark. For the third time in five seasons the Mountain West sent a team to a BCS Bowl game.

TCU finished the 2010 season with a 54-14 record, advancing to the College World Series semi-finals. In 2009, the MWC sent three teams - TCU, San Diego State and Utah - to the NCAA Baseball Championship for the first time in league history, as well as had the #1 pick in the Major League Baseball draft - Stephen Strasburg.

- In 2010, five men's basketball teams participated in postseason play, with a league-best four competing in the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2010, five women's teams made it to the postseason as well, with San Diego State shocking Texas and West Virginia to advance to the Sweet 16.

Colorado State, New Mexico and TCU were selected to the 2009 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championships, marking the eighth year the MWC has had at least three teams in the tournament. CSU won the league title for the third time in four years and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Volleyball Tournament.

Director of Athletics Paul Kowalczyk



PAUL KOWALCZYK

Director of Athletics | Fifth Year at CSU | Kent State; '80, '86

Director of Athletics Paul Kowalczyk has placed Colorado State's program on an ambitious path toward national prominence with his insightful and visionary leadership.

Kowalczyk is in his fifth year leading CSU's program, demonstrating an unmistakable commitment to the university after signing in 2010 a five-year contract extension, through 2015. From the moment he arrived on campus in 2006, he has shown a leadership style that is steady and consistent with ambitious goals clearly established. Under his watchful eye, a foundation has been built to cultivate long-term success throughout the program. With the foundation firmly in place, Colorado State's program stands on the threshold of taking a bold step forward nationally to reach "stretch goals" established by the Board of Governors when Kowalczyk arrived.

Perhaps nothing better illustrates the progress toward prominence that CSU's program has made during Kowalczyk's tenure than the changing skyline surrounding Moby Arena and the McGraw Athletic Center, both of which serve as centerpieces of the athletics department.

During the summer of 2009, CSU opened two state-of-the-art athletics facilities that are visually prominent to any avid Rams fan upon arriving on campus.

A training facility includes an indoor football practice field plus basketball and volleyball practice courts, adjacent to Moby Arena. Also, a new academic and strength and conditioning center is next to the McGraw Athletic Center.

Over the last year-plus, Kowalczyk also has stewarded significant upgrades to Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium, including a \$2.5 million landscaping initiative following the 2010 season that will make the venue's grounds at the base of the Rocky Mountain foothills even more attractive. Additionally in the last two years, Kowalczyk oversaw improvements to several CSU team locker rooms, and this fall, has spearheaded a \$1 million project that will furnish Moby Arena with new state-of-the-art video boards.

The two new facilities, along with upgrades to CSU's stadium, arena and McGraw Athletic Center offices, make CSU's resources among the finest in the nation. Those additions and improvements also have made CSU competitive nationally while enhancing the institution's image across a broad spectrum. The facilities represent one of Kowalczyk's primary goals when he was appointed to his position at CSU. Almost immediately upon his arrival, he worked closely with campus leaders to develop the facilities initiative.

"These buildings show that Colorado State is unmistakably serious about achieving its stretch goals," Kowalczyk said. "Combined with the recent renovations at our football stadium, this puts us where we need to be in terms of offering quality, state-of-the-art facilities for our coaches and student-athletes, those who are here now and those who are thinking about coming here."

The facilities, along with recent contracts he negotiated with Russell Athletic (apparel and uniforms), Under Armour (footwear), and a deal with the University of Colorado to keep the Rocky Mountain Showdown at Invesco Field for the long-term future, also reflect Kowalczyk's commitment to excellence throughout the program.

“Average is simply not good enough,” he said. “We must continually find ways to improve every aspect of our program while meeting the needs of our student-athletes and providing resources for our coaches -- not just to compete, but to win, and do it while serving the university, the community and the region.”

Soon after Kowalczyk's arrival in Fort Collins, he worked closely with the Board of Governors of the Colorado State University System and the university leadership to set in place a set of “stretch goals.” “The support of the board and campus administration, which was there every step of the way, was critical,” Kowalczyk said. “We have leadership on this campus that not only recognizes the importance of investing in athletics, but also what a successful athletics department can do for the university.”

Colorado State's stretch goals include:

- Achieve a No. 1 ranking in the Director's Cup, a ranking system that reflects overall program success;
- Annual Bowl Championship Series inclusion;
- NCAA men's and women's basketball tournament participation.

While the entire program under Kowalczyk's guidance has moved forward with the completion of the facilities, he readily admits there are more challenges that lie ahead.

“We will never stand still. We will continue to move forward. As a program, we will strive for excellence in every area, just as we challenge our student-athletes in competition and in the classroom.

“Our efforts will always include continually and diligently working to expand our ticket and Ram Club donor base as a means to generate additional revenue and scholarship fund support.”

Colorado State's expected emergence nationally has provided followers of the program optimism and excitement.

Kowalczyk brought a wealth of experience and knowledge to Fort Collins when he was named the school's 16th Director of Athletics on April 11, 2006, after having served for six successful years in the same capacity at Southern Illinois University.

In the spring of 2008, he was named to the prestigious NCAA Division I Leadership Council, an advisory body to the Division I Board of Directors. The council identifies issues important to the future of Division I and offers its expertise in defining appropriate action items. Reappointed in June 2010, his current term expires in 2014.

Kowalczyk also remains involved in NCAA, NACDA and MWC activities.


During his tenure at SIU, he led the Salukis' emergence into a successful, nationally renowned athletics program, including 15 conference championships in seven sport programs.

Before his tenures at CSU and SIU, he was senior administrator at Northwestern University during a time in which the Wildcats program enjoyed national success. He also served as assistant athletics director for business operations at Kansas State, business manager for athletics at Portland State, and assistant to the associate athletics director at Kent State.

Kowalczyk holds a master's degree in sports administration and a bachelor's of business administration in accounting from Kent State University.

A native of Warren Ohio, Kowalczyk was inducted into the Warren High School Distinguished Hall of Fame. The award recognizes and honors individuals for their achievements and performance. In 2004, he received the National Football Foundation's Gen. Robert R. Neyland Outstanding A.D. Award, and in 2006 was named the Athletic Director of the Year for the Division I-AA Central Division. Kowalczyk in 2010 concluded a four-year term on the NACDA Executive Council, representing District 7.

He is married to Peg Lynch Kowalczyk.

Adam Nigon emerged as one of the Rams' top shooting threats in 2009-10, tying Dorian Green with 58 three pointers and shooting nearly 39 percent from beyond the arc.

Coming off its best season in the Tim Miles Era, there is a sense of optimism and excitement surrounding the Colorado State men's basketball program entering the 2010-11 season.

The Rams have increased their win total each season under Miles, most recently finishing with their best record in four seasons, most conference wins in 10 years and first postseason berth since 2003. The success in 2009-10, in addition to returning 84 percent of their offense from last season, gives the Rams plenty of reason to express optimism.

The four seniors on this year's squad scored more than half of last season's points, and feature the most experienced lineup ever under Miles.

Andy Ogide and Travis Franklin both averaged double-digit scoring totals last season, with both shooting better than 50 percent from the floor. Ogide also led the Rams with 6.5 rebounds a game last season and was named to the Mountain West Conference's second-team all-conference list. Joining the two forwards are Andre McFarland -- who enters the season ranked

ninth all-time with a career three-point percentage of 41.9, and is expected to reach the top 10 all-time in games played -- and Adam Nigon -- who led the Rams last season in steals and three-point field goals made. He currently ranks 12th all-time at CSU with 89 steals, and is on pace to crack the top 5 in games played.

Just as strong as the senior class, however, is the group of sophomores. Dorian Green started all 32 games as a freshman and led the team in minutes played (35.0 per game) and points (11.8). His scoring average ranked 13th in the Mountain West Conference last season and third all-time among CSU freshmen. Also having strong freshman seasons were Pierce Hornung -- who averaged 4.2 rebounds per game, including 17 against San Francisco on Nov. 29, the most by a Ram in more than two years -- and Greg Smith -- who averaged 7.1 points and 3.8 rebounds a contest.

After missing a year due to an injury and transfer rules, respectively, sophomores Jesse Carr and Wes Eikmeier will be in a Rams uniform this season. In 2008-09, Carr scored 8.8 points a game, led the team with 63 assists and

shot 34.4 percent from beyond the arc. He was granted a medical hardship waiver after appearing in just four games in 2009-10. Eikmeier averaged 2.9 points a game as a freshman for Iowa State.

Joining the Rams this season will be a freshman class made up of center Chad Calcaterra, guard Maurice Wiltz and guard Dwight Smith, younger brother of Greg Smith. Trevor Williams, who redshirted last season, will be a freshman, and Will Bell will be a junior transfer from Northeastern Junior College.

The Rams will open up with two exhibition games, and then begin their regular season at home on Nov. 13 vs. Arkansas Pine-Bluff. They will then play five of their first eight games at home, including a Dec. 4 meeting against future Mountain West Conference opponent Fresno State.

Colorado State continued its home-court success in 2009-10 by finishing the season 11-4 at Moby Arena, including going 7-0 in non-conference play.

Other notable home dates include Dec. 1 against Drake in the second annual Mountain West-Missouri Valley matchup and Northern Colorado on Dec. 20. The Rams have won seven consecutive games against the Bears at Moby Arena, and have won five home games in a row against teams from the state of Colorado.

Fresh off wins over the Pioneers and Buffaloes last season, the Rams will travel to Denver on Nov. 18 and Colorado on Dec. 8.

The biggest national exposure in a long time will come on Dec. 11 when the Rams travel to Kansas City, Mo., to play national powerhouse Kansas for the first time ever. The Jayhawks have one of the most storied programs in college basketball history with three NCAA titles, eight championship games played and 21 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances.



Travis Franklin poured in 20 or more points in four games as a junior in 2009-10, leading the Rams in that category.

Colorado State will compete in two mid-season tournaments: the Cancun Governor's Cup in Cancun, Mexico, days before Christmas, and the Hilltop Classic in San Francisco, Calif., over New Year's Day. The Rams have made it to the championship of mid-season tourneys in four consecutive years and are 9-2 since 2006.

The conference slate will begin Jan. 4 vs. Wyoming and will feature four teams that made the NCAA tournament last season. It will also include the team's final conference trips to Salt Lake City (Jan. 29) and Provo (Feb. 23). The conference tournament will be held in Las Vegas, Nev., from March 9-12.

Fans will get the opportunity to catch the Rams on national TV, with all conference games being televised on The Mtn. or its affiliates, and the Colorado game on Fox Sports Net and game against Kansas on ESPN2.

After improving each of the last three seasons, and having the most experienced roster in the Miles Era, the 2010-11 season seems like the best opportunity for the Rams to have another breakout season.





Wherever Head Coach Tim Miles has coached, he has been able to successfully turn around the program. At Northern State University, he led a team that had never been to the Division II national tournament to five appearances in six seasons, including two championship games. At Mayville State, his first head coaching job, he turned around a program that went 4-44 in the two seasons prior, to two conference championships and two national tournaments in two seasons.

When Miles coached at Southwest Minnesota State, he transformed the second-most losing program in NCAA Division II basketball to a program that had four consecutive winning seasons, one conference championship and one appearance in the Division II Elite Eight, and was nationally ranked. And At North Dakota State, his final stop before arriving in Fort Collins, Miles led the Bison in the transition from Division II to Division I, beating two nationally ranked teams and having two 20-win seasons.

Three years ago, Miles inherited a team at Colorado State that was in shambles. The program hadn't had a winning conference record in eight seasons, and only

two players returned when Miles took over. However, just two years after the Rams went winless in conference play during Miles' first season, the coach is fresh off the program's best conference finish in a decade and first postseason berth in seven years.

With the Mountain West Conference being as strong as it has ever been -- in 2010 it had the most teams ever represented at the NCAA tournament, four teams ranked or receiving votes throughout the year and one team ranked in the Top 10 at one point -- the Rams finished with their highest place since 2000-01, placing fifth with eight conference wins. The four teams that finished above Colorado State were all represented at the NCAA tournament, while the Rams got a taste of postseason action in the College Basketball Invitational.

Overall, the Rams finished the season 16-16, totaling their wins from the prior two seasons combined. The success can be attributed greatly to the hostile environment of Moby Arena, where the Rams went 11-4, including winning their first eight of the season.

Among those home wins were key victories against San Francisco, Denver and Colorado, three teams they lost to in 2008-09, but beat by an average of 12 points this past year.

However, the Rams also saw success on the road, something that hasn't been seen in recent history.

In November, Colorado State began the season by competing in the Basketball Travelers Tip-Off tournament in Eugene, Ore., going 2-1 before bowing out in the championship game to host Oregon. The Rams have now advanced to the championship game of mid-season tournaments in four consecutive seasons, and have gone 9-2 during that span.

The Rams also won three road conference games (Wyoming, Air Force and Utah), the most since equaling that number during the 1999-2000 season.

The success, both on the road and at home, led to the program's best record since 2006-07, when the Rams finished 17-13. Even more impressive is the

fact that the team was able to have success despite losing three of its top offensive players from the 2008-09 season in Marcus Walker and Willis Gardner due to graduation, and sophomore Jesse Carr to injury.

Several key juniors took leadership of the team, and a strong freshman class gave the Rams the extra boost they needed to excel.

The junior class averaged 36.2 points a contest last year, and was led by a trio of Travis Franklin (10.5 points per game, 51.8 percent shooting, 16 double-digit scoring games), Adam Nigon (8.7 points per game, team-high-tying 59 three-pointers, team-best 43 steals) and Andy Ogide (second-team all-conference and all-district selection, 11.7 points per game, team-best 6.5 rebounds per game, 21 games with double-digit scoring, four double-doubles).

Newcomer Dorian Green, however, led all players with 11.8 points per game. He started all 32 games for the Rams, a CSU freshman record, and finished third in scoring average among CSU freshmen all-time. Green scored in double figures 16 times, led the team in minutes played (35.0 per game), tied for the team lead with 59 made three-pointers, ranked fifth in the MWC with a 38.8 three-point percentage and was ninth in CSU annals with a free-throw percentage of 83.2.

Pierce Hornung and Greg Smith served as Green's side-kicks, also contributing in their first year of collegiate basketball. Hornung appeared in all 32 games and held the third-best rebounding average on the team (4.2). He blocked a team-high-tying 12 shots and became the first Ram in more than two years to record 15 or more rebounds in a game with 17 against San Francisco on Nov. 29. Smith, who originally was expected to redshirt, averaged 7.1 points per game and was one of four players to record 100 or more rebounds with 107.

With all of the milestones obtained, in addition to the influx of young talent returning in a Rams uniform in 2010-11, Miles knows that Colorado State is another program with enough talent and potential to turn around into success.



Colorado State Rich In Tradition

Rams basketball history can be traced from A to Z: Donald Abbot to Robert Zimdahl. From Boyd Grant, the only player in school history to later serve as the Rams' head coach, to Lonnie Wright, an all-star guard for the Rams in the 1960s who competed for a spot on the Olympic Team.

Wright was the first athlete in history to compete in professional football (Denver Broncos, AFL) and professional basketball (Denver Rockets, ABA) simultaneously.

Then there is the legend of Bill Green, the school's first basketball All-American, who concluded his playing career in 1963 and was a first-round draft choice by the Boston Celtics. Green, who despised air travel, passed on a pro career to instead chase his educational dreams. He earned

a master's degree, then a doctorate and was a decorated teacher and administrator.

Until his death in 1994, Green was regarded as one of the nation's foremost educators in his position at a middle school in The Bronx, N.Y.

In The Beginning...

Any and all discussions involving Rams basketball history begin with legendary coach Jim Williams.

For 26 seasons, Williams roamed the sidelines at Colorado State. Depending on the need and the case, Williams coddled, coerced, shoved, pushed, forced and massaged the school's basketball program into one of the finest in the nation.

Williams was an innovator, a basketball devotee, when he arrived in Fort Collins in time for the 1954-55 season. Williams followed Bill Strannigan, who left for Iowa State after having guided Colorado State to its first-ever NCAA berth in 1954.

Williams had finished a hitch in the military when he moved to Ephraim, Utah, as a football and basketball coach. He stayed there until coming over the Rockies to take control of Colorado State's program.

One of the players who joined him in Fort Collins was a slender, talented scoring guard named Boyd Grant. After helping the Rams succeed as

a player, Grant stayed on as an assistant to Williams for several years.

Grant returned as head coach in 1988 to lead the Rams to a third-place NIT finish and back-to-back conference championships and NCAA appearances.

In 26 seasons, Williams put the program on college basketball's map. The Rams won 352 games and played in the NCAA tournament four times and the NIT twice. Williams' teams played 635 games under his watch - almost 30 percent of the school's total entering the 2009-10 season.

In 1969, he guided Colorado State to the final eight of the NCAA tournament. Following a first-round victory over Dayton, the Rams defeated in-state rival Colorado, 64-56, in the regional semifinals in Manhattan, Kan. Two days later, the team narrowly missed a chance to make the school's first-ever Final Four trip, losing to Drake, 84-77.

During his career, Williams guided Colorado State to four NCAA and two NIT appearances, including the glorious '69

season. He won more games, 352, than any college basketball coach at any level in state history.

Williams' career at Colorado State wasn't simply about wins and losses. It was about building a program, as he served as athletic director when the school began construction of Hughes Stadium and Moby Arena.

Names like Chuck Newcomb, Stan Albert, Mike Childress, Gary Rhoades, Rudy Carey, Eddie Hughes, Tim Hall, Rick Fisher, Cliff Shegogg, and the Kerr twins, Lloyd and Floyd, all bring to mind the many who etched their names among the prominent figures in Rams history.

Let it be noted that Williams stood toe-to-toe with UCLA's blossoming basketball program and its coach, John Wooden. Colorado State attracted national attention with the challenging schedules Williams put before his team, including annual dates with UCLA.

Grant Makes A Return...

For 35 years, Boyd Grant's heart had been in Fort Collins.

Grant followed his heart back to Fort Collins in 1988 to rejuvenate the Rams' basketball fortunes.

He wasted little time in restoring the pride, tradition, and excellence that had existed during his previous time with the program.

Grant in 1988 guided the Rams to 23 wins and a third-place finish in the NIT. It was the first time in two decades that Colorado State had been involved in postseason competition.

The Rams simply didn't finish the season with 23 victories. Grant and the Rams brought the madness back to Moby.

Once invited to the NIT, the Rams played three home games before overflow crowds in Moby Arena and then traveled to New York City and Madison Square Garden for the semifinals. Following a last-second loss to Ohio State in the semifinals, the Rams defeated Boston College, finishing with a 22-13 record.

In 1989, Grant and the Rams, behind the play of all-star forward Pat Durham and shooting ace Joel Tribelhorn, won a school-record 11 consecutive games and, in the process, Colorado State's first-ever WAC title.

A week later, the journey continued when the Rams routed Florida of the SEC, 68-48, in the first round of the NCAA tournament before losing to Syracuse, a squad featuring five future NBA players in the starting lineup. The Rams

finished with a 23-10 record, setting a record for most wins in a season in school history.

Grant and the Rams weren't finished. Their encore included another WAC title in 1990 and a trip to the NCAA tournament. Alabama defeated the Rams in the first round, but not before Colorado State had enjoyed a third consecutive 20-win season with a 21-9 final record.\

Grant won 81 games in four seasons, averaging more than 20 victories per season in returning Colorado State's program to elite status.

He was followed along the sidelines by Stew Morrill, who

in seven seasons won 20 games twice and guided Colorado State to a pair of NIT appearances. Morrill and his staff helped continue the resurgence of Colorado State's program that began with Grant's return to Moby Arena.

Back to the Future...

Dale Layer took over the Colorado State program in 2001, intent on nurturing growth and respecting the history that has embodied the program for a century.

Layer was no stranger to Colorado State's program, having spent two seasons as an assistant during a time the Rams won 37 games - 24 in Moby Arena - and achieved an NIT final eight berth.

In 1999, Colorado State shocked the basketball world by winning 19 games with a team returning only two seniors and one starter. The Rams advanced to the final eight of the NIT behind the play of senior leaders Milt Palacio and Andre McKanstry. Palacio turned in his Colorado State jersey for a career in the NBA.

The Rams, in the postseason for the second year in a row and fourth time in a decade, dispatched Mississippi State, 69-56, to advance to the second round.

Colorado State faced in-state rival Colorado before a capacity crowd in Moby Arena. Shaking off a double-digit first-half deficit, the Rams moved to the final eight of the tournament with a convincing 86-76 victory in one of the most emotional games in school history. The rivals, separated by only 50 miles, met in the postseason for the first time since the 1969 classic in the NCAA tournament.

A year later, the Rams won 18 games led by the stalwart play of Ceedric Goodwyn. He was the only player in the Mountain West Conference to score in double figures ev-

ery game, and like Palacio, was destined for a professional career. Twice during the season the Rams defeated nationally ranked teams, including UCLA and Utah, and at one point had a streak of 11 consecutive victories over Front Range rivals.

In 2003 the Rams claimed their first conference title in 13 years. Brian Greene hit a running jumper against UNLV with only seconds remaining to take a one-point lead over the Rebels and earn a trip to the NCAA tournament.

In 2006 Jason Smith was named as Colorado State's first ever all-Mountain West Conference first-team selection.

The Rams won 17 games and Smith earned all-Mountain West first-team honors for the second consecutive season in 2006-07. Smith was chosen by the Miami Heat with the 20th overall pick in the 2007 NBA Draft.

NCAA Tournament History

DRAKE 84, COLORADO STATE 77

Manhattan, Kan. - On March 15, 1969, Colorado State competed against Drake in the NCAA Midwest Regional Finals, but lost by a score of 84-77. The first half of this regional finals game was neck and neck. The teams went into their locker rooms at halftime, with Drake holding a narrow 38-37 lead. The second half was much like the first. The teams were neck and neck but once Drake pulled out to a 72-69 lead, with four and a half minutes left, they never looked back. Drake went on to win the game 84-77. Four of Colorado State's players scored in double figures led by Floyd Kerr, who scored 21 points. William Peden was the second leading scorer with 19 points. The other leading scorers were Lloyd Kerr with 12 points, and Michael Davis had a double-double with 13 points and 16 rebounds.

COLORADO STATE 68, FLORIDA 46

Dallas, Texas - In the first round of the NCAA tournament, on March 17, 1989, Colorado State defeated the Florida Gators 68-46. Once Colorado State scored the first basket in the game, they kept the game under control. At halftime, Colorado State was ahead 31-22. CSU kept building its lead throughout the second half of the game, and with two and a half minutes remaining in the game, CSU was ahead by 18 points. Colorado State went on to win the game by a score of 68-46. Colorado State's leading scorers were Joel Tribelhorn with 20 and Pat Durham with 16. With a win in the first round, CSU continued on to the second round of the NCAA Playoffs.

SYRACUSE 65, COLORADO STATE 50


Dallas, Texas - On March 19, 1989, in the second round of the NCAA tournament, Colorado State fell to Syracuse 65-50. In the first half of the game, Colorado State tried to keep the game close as they went into the locker room, but trailed by a score of 38-28 at halftime. In the second half of the game, the closest CSU could get to Syracuse was 10 points. The Orangemen continued to increase the gap and won by a final score of 65-50. Andy Anderson scored 15 points, and was the only Colorado State player to score in double figures.

ALABAMA 71, COLORADO STATE 54

Long Beach, Calif. - On March 16, 1990, Colorado State was defeated by Alabama, by a score of 71-54 in the first round of the NCAA tournament. In the first half of the game, the lead changed three times. At one point, CSU led by seven points. But Alabama surged back, outscoring CSU 18-3 in the last 10 minutes of the half. Alabama led Colorado State 33-22 at halftime, and in the second half, Alabama took off and never looked back. At one point Alabama led CSU by 20 points and won the game by a score of 71-54. In the loss, two Rams scored in double figures. Mike Mitchell led the team with 24 points and Mark Meredith contributed 15 points.

DUKE 67, COLORADO STATE 57

Salt Lake City, Utah - On March 20, 2003, Colorado State earned the right to play Duke in the first round of the NCAA tournament but fell by a score of 67-57. The Blue Devils jumped out to an early lead but CSU came back to tie the score 20-20 before an 11-2 Duke run put them up by nine. The Rams trailed by just two with 3:01 to play but the postseason experience of the Blue Devils showed through as they answered CSU's six-point run with an eight-point run of their own to close the game on top by ten. Brian Greene led CSU with a 14-point, 10-rebound night while coming up with three steals in the game.

SANTA CLARA 73, COLORADO STATE 50

Corvallis, Ore. - In the first round of the NCAA tournament, on March 12, 1954, Colorado State lost to Santa Clara 73-50. At halftime, Santa Clara led Colorado State 44-27 and, although scoring was close in the second half, Santa Clara's first half lead proved to be insurmountable. Two of Colorado State's players scored in double figures with Dennis Stuehm leading Colorado State with 18 points and Ronald Caylor adding 11.

IDAHO STATE 62, COLORADO STATE 57

Corvallis, Ore. - 1954

OKLAHOMA CITY 70, COLORADO STATE 67

Lubbock, Texas - On March 9, 1963, in the first round of the NCAA tournament, Colorado State dropped a first round game to Oklahoma City University by a score of 70-67. During the first half of the game, Colorado State went on a 19-5 run to lead 42-31 at halftime and kept the lead through most of the second half, but lost the lead with 42 seconds left in the game. CSU could not regain the lead and lost 70-67. Four of Colorado State's players scored in double figures, led by Bill Green who had a double-double with 19 points, 12 rebounds. CSU's other top scorers included Terry Matthews with 17 points, Dave Sigafos with 12 points, and Gary Anderson with 10 points. Brian Etheridge led Colorado State with 15 rebounds.

OKLAHOMA CITY 78, COLORADO STATE 70

Lubbock, Texas - In the first round of the NCAA tournament, on March 8, 1965, Colorado State was defeated by Oklahoma City University by a score of 78-70. Colorado State kept it close throughout the first half, but trailed 36-32 at halftime. Colorado State was down the entire second half of the game. With 51 seconds left in the game CSU tied the game up 68-68, but couldn't make a shot before Oklahoma City scored the winning basket with one second left in the game. Colorado State's Sonny Bustion had a double-double with 30 points, 20 rebounds. Two other CSU players scored in double figures: Dick Vidakovich scored 13 points, and William Westoby scored 12.

HOUSTON 82, COLORADO STATE 76

Wichita, Kan. - On March 7, 1966, Colorado State was defeated 82-76 by Houston University in the first round of the NCAA tournament. Colorado State trailed the entire first half, and headed to the locker room down 44-35 at halftime. In the second half, CSU went on a few short runs to keep the game close but with one minute left in regulation, CSU tried to go on a quick run to continue on in the playoffs but fell short and lost by a score of 82-76. Five of CSU's players scored in the double digits. Bobby Rule led the team with 18 points while Lonnie Wright was the second leading scorer with 17 points. Other top scorers were: Dick Vidakovich with 14 points, Richard Fines with 11 points, and Dale Schlueter who had a double-double with 11 points and 19 rebounds.

COLORADO STATE 52, DAYTON 50

Fort Worth, Texas - On March 8, 1969, in the first round of the NCAA tournament, Colorado State beat the University of Dayton 52-50 earning its first-ever NCAA Tournament victory. Colorado State used a 17-9 first half run to lead by a score of 27-23 at halftime. In the second half of the game, the lead switched back and forth between the two teams seven times and with three minutes left in the game, the score was tied 49-49. Colorado State made two free throws and that was all CSU needed to clinch a spot in the second round. Colorado State went on to win the game 52-50. Colorado State's leading scorers were: Lloyd Kerr with 17 points, Clifford Shegogg with 12 points, and Floyd Kerr with 11 points.

COLORADO STATE 64, COLORADO 56

Manhattan, Kan. - In the second round of the NCAA tournament, on March 13, 1969, Colorado State defeated the University of Colorado, by a score of 64-56. The first half of the game was a close one, but Colorado State scored four points in the last 42 seconds of the half to lead 28-27 at halftime. Colorado State allowed Colorado to score the first three points in the second half but tied the game up in the next few seconds and never looked back. Colorado State outscored CU 14 to 10 in the last four minutes of the game and went on to win the game 64-56, landing them a spot in the NCAA Midwest Regional Finals. Colorado State had four major contributors to the win. Clifford Shegogg led the team with 20 points, Floyd Kerr scored 14, Lloyd Kerr scored 12 points, and Michael Davis had a double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds.

Media Credentials

- Media credentials are distributed on a season or single-game basis. Requests should be made at least one week prior to an event.
- Credentials will be left prior to the game at media will call, located at the lower (ground level) southwest entrance of Moby Arena, adjacent to the Academic & Training Center and north of the Ram Field softball complex.

Photographer Credentials

- Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers. Passes must be displayed at all times.
- Photographer's boxes are located at both ends of the playing court, on the south side of each basket standard, opposite the team benches. Still and video photographers are allowed to be positioned in either of these boxes only.
- Photography is not allowed from any of the courtside media or donor seating along either baseline or the south side of the playing court, the team bench area, or official scorer's table.
- No photography equipment (i.e., cameras, strobes) shall be attached to the backboard, goal standards or tables located courtside without specific, prior written permission.
- Still photographers may not utilize flash attachments at any courtside location.
- Tripods may not be placed on or beside the playing floor, or on any table.
- Upper-level still and video photographer positions are located above the south side seating areas and in the press box overhead on the north side. Photographers are unable to use the south side location for any game that is being televised. Individuals seeking to use the north side location must be granted permission by a member of the athletic media relations staff.

Parking

Interview Guidelines

- Interviews, either in person or via telephone, with members of Colorado State's men's basketball coaching staff and student-athletes must be coordinated through assistant media relations director Danny Mattie.
- Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided to the media, by the coaches, student-athletes, or the athletic department. Media are asked not to request an individual's personal contact information, including e-mail and cell number, but rather to contact Danny Mattie.
- Student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews at the conclusion of selected practice sessions. Student-athlete interviews will not conflict with classes, meetings, medical treatment or practice times.

- Interviews are not permitted in the locker room or training room.
- No pregame interviews will be granted on game days.
- Telephone interviews should be requested at least 24 hours in advance and coordinated through Danny Mattie. All interviews will be processed on an availability basis involving the requested interviewee.

Postgame Guidelines

- At the conclusion of every game, Colorado State coach Tim Miles will use the NCAA-suggested 10-minute cooling period to address members of the team.
- At the conclusion of the NCAA-suggested cooling period, Miles will address the media in the Adolf Coors Family Foundation Auditorium, Room 100, in the McGraw Athletic Center.
- Colorado State's locker room is closed to the media at all times. Specific players will be brought to the press conference upon request.
- The media relations office will do its best to accommodate all properly made requests.
- Other than network contractual obligations, no student-athlete or coach can appear on a live postgame television or radio interview without permission obtained prior to the game from Danny Mattie.

MWC Teleconference

- The Mountain West Conference men's basketball coaches will participate in a weekly media teleconference Jan.3-March 7, 2011.
- The calls are scheduled every Monday and can be heard live via the MWC Web site or by contacting the MWC communications office for the call-in number.
- This teleconference is for accredited media only.
- A replay of each teleconference will be made available on the MWC Web site.
- Colorado State Head Coach Tim Miles is scheduled to be available to media on the conference call between 10:58-11:06 a.m. each week.

Broadcast Rights and Restrictions

Colorado State, its opponent and the respective conference designate the broadcast rights for all games. CSU follows the guidelines established by the NCAA Championship Events Committee. Radio and television stations and Internet sites that have not purchased rights shall not carry any broadcast report from the arena on a live basis or any live description, footage of any game action while it is still in progress. No pregame and, or postgame live coverage shall be permitted for two hours before and one-half hour after the sporting event without the express permission of the university. Per NCAA guidelines, stations are limited to three minutes of highlights per news show. Television stations also are prohibited from selling, loaning or giving away footage to any individual or agency for use on any non-sports-news program produced or aired by the station. Games that are broadcast by television networks may have additional restrictions. Also, per NCAA regulations, footage and photos of athletes with eligibility remaining may NOT be used to commercially promote any product, service or media outlet and may not be sold, loaned to other individuals, agencies for this purpose. Disrespect of credential privileges will result in withdrawal of all future credentials.

The Mountain West Conference

This is the Mountain West

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West Conference has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MWC continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 12th year, the MWC has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West Conference has marked several achievements over its first 11 years of existence, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches challenge in the college football instant replay system, and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in and win two BCS bowl games. Additionally, the Mountain West was the first conference to have a member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utah's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is one of two conferences to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the MWC was founded in 1999. The Mountain West also ranks second in No. 1 draft picks in the NFL, NBA and MLB over the last six years with three overall.

The Mountain West Conference is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West Conference boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders four MWC schools (Air Force, BYU, Colorado State and Utah). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet – the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert city of Las Vegas (the fastest growing metropolitan area in the West) and the Pacific Ocean locale of San Diego State. The southwestern flavor of New Mexico complements the western heritage and culture of Fort Worth, Texas, home of the MWC's most recent member, TCU.

**History**

The Mountain West Conference was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions — Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming — decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference. The split from the former 16-team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long-standing athletic rivalries. Five of the MWC's eight original members have been conference rivals since the 1960s (BYU, Utah, New Mexico, Wyoming, Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longtime members as well. UNLV and TCU entered the fold in 1996 and the Rebels continued as one of the original eight institutions that formed the MWC in 1999. TCU rejoined the group with its first year of competition in the Mountain West in 2005-06. On June 17, 2010, Commissioner Craig Thompson announced the addition of Boise State University to the Mountain West Conference, effective July 1, 2011.

When the MWC officially began operations on July 1, 1999, the new league had in place a seven-year contract with ESPN, giving the broadcaster exclusive national television rights to MWC football and men's basketball, and three-year agreements to send the league's football champion to the Liberty Bowl and a second team to the Las Vegas Bowl. Commissioner Craig Thompson also arranged a third bowl tie-in each of the first three years (1999 Motor City, 2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans) before securing a four-year deal with the Emerald Bowl in San Francisco in 2002. Entering the 2011 season, the MWC has five contracted bowl affiliations – the MAACO Bowl Las Vegas, San Diego Country Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, AdvoCare V100 Independence Bowl, Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl and New Mexico Bowl.

Exposure

The Mountain West Conference continues to receive unprecedented national television exposure through a combination of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network (formerly CSTV) and VERSUS. In 2009-10, 46 football, 94 men's basketball and 34 women's basketball Conference-controlled contests were broadcast nationally.

On Aug. 26, 2004, CBS College Sports Network (formerly CSTV) and the Mountain West Conference announced a visionary partnership that revolutionized the college sports landscape. The landmark agreement was the first NCAA Division I football and men's basketball conference-wide deal for CSTV and provided the network exclusive rights to all Conference events, including cable and satellite television coverage, national over-the-air and satellite radio, video-on-demand and online broadcast rights.

In the summer of 2006, the centerpiece of this historic relationship was realized with the launch of The Mtn. – MountainWest Sports Network – the first sports network dedicated to serving a single collegiate athletic conference. Nearly 25,000 hours of MWC programming have aired on The Mtn. since the network's launch on Sept. 1, 2006, and over 260 MWC events are shown live annually through a combination of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network and VERSUS. CBS College Sports Network is currently in 38 million homes, and available in 89 million nationwide. VERSUS is in 79 million households across the U.S.

Opportunity

The MWC provides a first-class athletic and academic experience for more than 7,000 student-athletes each year. Over the past 11 years, 34 Mountain West student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships, and since the league's inception in 1999, an additional 22 student-athletes have been named MWC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and awarded league-sponsored postgraduate scholarships. Three student-athletes have earned distinction as Rhodes Scholars (Jessica Mellinger, Wyoming and Delavane Diaz and Brittany Morreale, Air Force).

Conference student-athletes are also given a voice regarding pertinent issues within the MWC and NCAA governance structure through representation on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). The Mountain West Conference SAAC consists of 19 representatives; two student-athletes from each member institution and one faculty athletics representative. The committee reviews and reacts to legislation and to other topics referred by the Conference constituent groups or committees related to the student-athlete experience.

Achievement

The MWC has produced 595 All-America selections among its 19 sponsored sports in the last 11 years, including a league-record 53 All-America honorees in 2004-05. A total of 110 MWC student-athletes have also earned Academic All-America accolades in that span, while 34 MWC student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. The MWC has sent at least 30 teams to NCAA postseason events each of the past 11 years. Mountain West teams have captured three NCAA team championships over the last 11 years, with BYU claiming three national titles in women's cross country. Additionally, the MWC has produced 24 NCAA individual national champions in the sports of men's golf, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field.

MWC members have participated in 41 bowl games in 11 years, led by Utah's 9-0 mark in postseason contests. The MWC has earned 50 postseason bids in men's basketball, including 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and two NIT Final Four berths. MWC women's basketball has tallied 51 postseason bids, including 29 NCAA bids, five Sweet 16 appearances and one Elite Eight berth since 2000. Wyoming won the MWC's first WNIT championship in 2007 with a win over Wisconsin. In women's volleyball, the MWC has had 31 NCAA bids with eight Sweet 16 berths and one Elite Eight appearance. Women's soccer has earned 23 NCAA bids since 1999, with BYU advancing to the Sweet 16 in 2000 and the Elite Eight in 2003. MWC men's golf has had at least four representatives in each of the last 11 NCAA Golf Regionals, while women's tennis has had at least two teams participate in NCAA Regionals each of the last 10 years.
