Ravenous Foreign Pests Threaten U.S. National Forests-From the University of Central Florida (2010, December 7) and *ScienceDaily*: "Foreign pests are eating their way through our national forests, destroying majestic scenery and costing taxpayers millions of dollars. If enforcement efforts to prevent their importation aren't stepped up, irreplaceable resources will be lost forever and taxpayers can expect to fork over billions of dollars by 2019, according to a comprehensive study published Decembert 6 in

Colorado Tree Coalition Tidbits

Colorado Tree Coalition Grants Update-The Colorado Tree Coalition (CTC) grant reviews are taking place by reviewers across the state. This year grant project requests were received by the CTC Grants Committee requesting over \$139,852 in project funding. It is expected there will be close to \$103,000 available between the three programs, those being the Mile High Million, Xcel Vegetation Management and the regular CTC grant program. Thanks to all who applied and for all who reviewed grants statewide.

CTC Scholarship Program-The Colorado Tree Coalition (CTC) has a limited amount of funds to assist people with registering to attend conferences and workshops throughout the year. Because of the limited dollars available it is required of all who request assistance to follow these guidelines:

- 1. Scholarship requests will be limited to a maximum of \$300, and can only be applied to cover registration costs of the event.
- 2. To request a scholarship please send an electronic request to Keith Wood, at keith.wood@colostate.edu. At a minimum the request should contain the name and location of the conference and what is hoped to be learned at the event, and how it will be applied in your current position. Keith will then submit the request to the CTC Board or Executive Board for their consideration.
- 3. Requests will also be limited to one person per community/group/organization per workshop or conference. Many workshops and conferences now offer concurrent sessions and there is a value to sending more than one person. However, the CTC will not be able to fund more than one person.
- 4. Those receiving scholarships will be required to supply an article or notes to be used in *Tree Talk* and/or placed on the CTC web site (www.coloradotrees.org) and/or in another electronic newsletter format so others can benefit from the workshop as well.

The board of CTC is committed to education and is seeking additional funds so the scholarship program can be expanded and more people throughout Colorado can benefit from the various educational opportunities available.

2011 Poster Contest-The Colorado Tree Coalition (CTC), Colorado sponsor for the Arbor Day Foundation 5th Grade Poster Contest has some sad news and some exciting news! The Arbor Day Foundation (ADF), after nearly 20 years, has discontinued the National 5th Grade Poster Contest (the first contest was held in 1992). At its height, the contest involved 75,000 fifth grade classrooms and 1.5 million students. The ADF poster contest in Colorado reached over 9,000 students in the past ten years! Now for the exciting news...a new CTC poster contest committee has formed and is developing the theme of "Celebrate Trees in Your Community" to keep a contest going for 5th graders in Colorado for 2011! The entry deadline for school winning posters will be April 5, 2011. Complete rules and details are being developed and will be available soon. So involve your local schools in this new Colorado contest and we look forward to growing this program for years to come!

ProGreen Expo-Don't forget to make it to the ProGreen Expo at the Denver Convention Center from February 8-11. A host of good speakers and topics are lined up and you might even earn some CEU's for that arborist or pesticide certification! CTC will have a booth and information in the Exhibit Hall.
